(B) UNESCO Category 2 Centre (C2C) on Natural World Heritage Management and Training for the Asia-Pacific Region

The Committee examined the proposal and recommended for the proposed extension for three years with 'no cost extension' with suggestions to rework the annual financial requirement component wise without increase in cost. Committee also approved of Rs. 3.4993 crore for the year 2019-20.

The Committee recommended that a third party independent evaluation may be done by experts including the members of the Committee.

(C) Endangered Species Recovery Programme

After examining the proposal the Committee recommended for the approval of the ongoing scheme and release of Rs. 7.16 crore for Habitat improvement and conservation breeding of the Great Indian Bustard and release of Rs. 4.009 crore for Recovery of Dugong and their habitats in India as per the approved scheme.

(D) Centre of Excellence for Forest Based Livelihoods in Uttarakhand, Uttarakhand State Council for Science & Technology, Dehradun (UCOST)

The Committee examined the proposal and recommended continuity of this scheme approved by NCAC and increase in the outlay for 2018-19 and 2019-20 as proposed by the project proponent.

6. Additional Agenda Item-3: Establishing FSI Cell in Each State for Strengthening Monitoring and Forest Resource Assessment.

The Committee examined the proposal and it was observed that the proposed cell will be responsible for uploading the shape files and coordinate with the State Forest Departments for uploading of other relevant data of the State for monitoring of the plantations and

Matter has been put up for placing before Governing Body for approval. and prepare reports for monitoring the progress in the work of assessment of forest wealth in the country.

The Committee recommended for approval of the scheme with the increased scope of work as observed in the meeting.

- Maintenance of NPV plantation- Rs.2014.27 lakhs for maintenance of 6920.00 ha plantation raised from NPV funds for new NPV plantation.
 - Plantation of tall plants in linear and block forest etc. (Rs.1000.00 lakh for plantation with provision of barbed wire fencing in linear and block forests),

Agenda No.4: Annual Plan of Operation for the year 2019-20 of Madhya Pradesh State Authority

Vide letter dated 08.02.2019, Department of Forests, Government of Madhya Pradesh, Bhopal has submitted Annual Plan of Operation of State CAMPA/State Authority for the year 2019-20.

2. The Government of Madhya Pradesh vide letter dated 20.02.2019 the following amount of Rs.506.38 crores against the Annual Plan of Opeation for the year 2019-20 has been submitted to the Steering Committee for approval:

: Rs.457.76 crores

: Rs. 48.62 crores



- 3. The Steering Committee has approved an amount of Rs.274.9789 crores against the Annual Plan of Operation for the year 2019-20. The abstract of total approved Annual Plan of Operation is at *p.16/cor*. The minutes of the State Level Steering Committee held on 2nd February, 2019 is at *pp.129-137/cor*.
- 4. Since, the CAF has been enforced and funds with Ad-hoc CAMPA have been transferred to the National Fund, we may put up the proposal before the Executive Committee of National Authority.
- As per Rule 5(2)(e) and Rule 5(3)(b) of CAF Rule, 2018. Pest and Diseases Control in forest Area and promotion conservation, sustainable use and documentation of biological diversity including preservation of habitats, conservation of land and folk varieties and cultivars, domesticated stocks and breeds of animals and microorganisms and chronicling of knowledge relating to biological diversity. But State CAMPA has kept Rs.0.88 crore for biodiversity leadership development programme, biodiversity quiz programme, etc. which is not as per CAF Rule, 2018.

Rule 5(3)(a) provides that fund can be used for establishment, upgradation and maintenance of modern nurseries and other planting stock production facilities for production quality planting materials. But State CAMPA Authority has included Rs. 1.836 crore for hiring of vehicles for research circles which is not admissible in this Rule.

Rule 5(2)(d) provides that fund can be used for protection of plantation and forest. However, State CAMPA has included 1.5 erore for purchase of computer, furniture, camera, etc. for forest nakas which is not permissible in this Rule.

The APO for year 2019-20 of Rs. 506.38 crore is placed before Executive Committee of National Authority for examination and consideration.



Agenda No. 5: Annual Plan of Operation for the year 2019-20 of Odisha State Authority

APO of Odisha 2019-20 with an outlay of Rs. 592.56 crores was approved by the Steering Committee of the State CAMPA on 20.12.2018.

- Implementation of the site-specific schemes of Compensatory Afforestation (CA, 2. Penal Compensatory Afforestation (PCA), Catchment Area Treatment Plan (CATP), Wildlife Conservation Plan, Regional Wildlife Management Plan, etc. approved along with the forest diversion proposal is the first charge on the CAMPA fund.
- A total of Rs. 85.29 Crore has been earmarked for Compensatory Afforestation and 3. other related activities.
- 4. 80% of NPV funds in the Plan are carmarked for "core activities" Which includes Plantations, Bamboo Silvicultural Operations, forest protection, Wildlife Management, Plantations in the Vana Samrakshana Samithi Managed areas, etc. The total funds allocated for this is Rs. 437.54 Crores.

Plantations & Bamboo Subsidiary Silvicultural Operation 5.

- 5.1 Three different types of plantations will be taken up in the APO 2019-20. There are 20000 ha of ANR, 2000 ha block and 2000 ha of Bamboo plantations. Apart from this, maintenance of previous year plantation will be done. In addition, an amount of Rs. 20 Crores has been kept for taking out pre-planting activities for the plantation to be done in 2020-21. The total financial outlay for plantation works stand at Rs. 156.45 Crore.
- Bamboo Subsidiary Silvicultural operations will be carried out over an area of 5.2 1,62,600 ha. The cost proposed for this activity is slated at Rs. 16.26 Crores.

6. Forest Protection

- Protection for mitigating loss of forest resources through protection squads. These 6.1 squads will be deployed in 32 vulnerable sites in 24 divisions. They will be doing the protection job in the vulnerable sites. For this there will be movement through
- In addition, there will be deployment of 195 Forest protection squads in Ranges for 6.2 doing the protection job.
- Control rooms will be operated at Division, Circle and State level to continuously 6.3 monitor the protection activities.
- Management and Control of Forest Fire: 2016 fire protection squads will be deployed 6.4 during the fire season in 37 divisions which is being done in the earlier APOs as well. There will also be creation and maintenance of fire line over 8000 KM. The total financial outlay for forest protection including fire protection is Rs. 6315.89 Lakhs.

7. Wildlife Management:

Different activities that will be taken up in Wildlife Management are anti-depredation, 7.1 forest protection, relocation of villages from protected areas, habitat improvement, 5

SMC works in wildlife habitat, animal rescue centers, management of biological diversity, research, provision of alternative wood saving appliances in protected areas to reduce pressure on forest. In addition, there is site specific wildlife conservation plan and regional wildlife management plan proposed as a part of CA, PCA. The total financial outlay for Wildlife Management Plan is Rs. 120.11 Crores.(P.12/cor).

8. Aama Jangala Yojana: -

- 8.1 Aama Jangala Yojana is one of the pilot schemes of Govt. of Odisha with a total project outlay of Rs. 1170.03 lakh for six years.
- 8.2 Under APO 2019-20,540 VSS would be covered in 23 Forest Divisions. Preparatory works like Survey and Demarcation, Boundary clearance, RCC pillar posting, microplan preparation, etc. will be taken up.
- 8.3 Preliminary operation (0th year) for ANR without gap over 27000 ha, plantation's over 25000 ha, will be taken up in the current year APO period.
- 8.4 2nd year ANR maintenance of 25000 ha and ANR 3rd year maintenance over 105283 ha and Block plantation 3rd year maintenance over 1010 ha will be taken up.
- 8.5 Support activities like capacity building of forest personnel and support personnel will be taken up.
- 8.6 Financial outlay for Aama Jangala Yojana under APO 2019-20 stands at Rs. 81.57 Crore (P.12-13/cor).

9. 20% of Infrastructure Development: -

- 9.1 It has been proposed to construct 30 no. of Range officer Residence@ 12.23 lakhs/one.
- 9.2 There will be 75 no of Forester quarters, 200 no of Forest Guard quarters will be constructed in this Plan period.
- 9.3 Repair of Forest Road over 1000 KM, construction of 137 nos of Culvert and 234 nos. of Causeway will be taken up.
- 8.4 Residual & maintenance of permanent/ mega nursery will be done.
- 9.5 The financial outlay under Infrastructure Development stands at Rs. 38.22 Crore, P.13/cor)

10. Research & Capacity Building: -

10.1 Different activities under Research & Development will be taken up like Production of QPM, Maintenance of Plus Trees (Old), Ex-situ conservation of Mesuaferrea, maintenance of Santalum album plantation with different host species. Maintenance of Hi-Tech Nursery and other nursery, Maintenance of Research stations, Creation of sample plots in RET seedling plantations etc. In the current Plan period, there is a new project on NTFP sustainable management in tribal areas will be taken up. The total financial out lay under Research is Rs. 2.50 crore.

10.2 Capacity building will be done to the forest staff at different levels. Total financial outlay on capacity building stands at Rs. 1.0 Crores (P.13/cor).

11. Strengthening of Training College/ Schools: -

The training capacity at Forest Rangers' College would be increased with the creation of additional hostel facility. The additional capacity would also be developed in Training schools at Champua and G. Udayagiri. The total financial outlay for training college and schools would be Rs. 6.01 Crores, (P.13/cor).

12. Forest IT & Geomatics: -

- 12.1 Operationalization of web-based enterprise GIS solutions will form a part of forest IT & Geomatics.
- 12.2 Provision has been made for payment towards hardware and software procurements and their installation and maintenance, Payment of cost of technical manpower viz. Computer experts and GIS experts.
- 12.3 Procurement, expansion of office IT & office business Hardware and Software.
- 12.4 AMC for application maintained in the data Centre of FITGC.
 - 12.5 Demarcation of forest boundaries using DGPS with the help of technology partner.
- 12.6 The total financial outlay towards Forest IT & Geomatics under APO 2019-20 is Rs. 15.0 Crore, (P.13-14/cor)

13. Monitoring, Evaluation and Accounting: -

- 13.1 Monitoring and Evaluation of CAMPA activities by an independent/3rd party organization to assess the quality as well as effective utilization of funds. The contract has been signed with M/s CITRON Consulting Ltd for doing 3rd party monitoring. In addition, there will be uploading of data in e-green watch, CAMPA trekker for account monitoring will be done with the help of data managers and data analysts employed at different ranges. The financial outlay for monitoring & evaluation is Rs. 5.0 crore.
- 13.2 Govt. of India, MoEF & CC has stipulated preparation of CAMPA accounts of all APOs starting from 2009-10 to 2016-17 in double entry accounting system. For doing this job, tender has been floated and 5 CA Firms have been finalized after a detailed technical scrutiny and Govt of Odisha has approved these 5 Firms and a contract has been signed with them. The work has already been commenced and expected to be completed in next 4-5 months' time. Financial outlay for accounting is kept at Rs. 2.0 crore, (P.13-14/cor)

The APO for year 2019-20 of Rs. 592.56 crores is placed before Executive Committee of National Authority for examination and consideration.

Principal Audit General (Audit), Telangana have taken the audit of CAMPA fund during June 2018 for CAMPA works up to 2017-18. Replies were given to the Principal Audit General, Telangana State, Hyderabad vide EFS&T (For I) DeptLr. No. 4274/For.I (1)/2018, Govt. of Telangana. No further audit objections have been received so far.

For Monitoring and Evaluation of CAMPA works by Third party in Telangana, work was entrusted to M/s. IORA Ecological Solutions limited, New Delhi for evaluation of works carried out under CAMPA from 2009-10 to 2015-16 year wise. Gathering of official data at Head Office, Field visits to the respective Divisions, gathering of field data, analysis of field data, preparation and submission of final evaluation reports year wise from 2009-10 to 2015-16 were completed. The evaluation reports have been approved by the state CAMPA Executive & Steering committee and were submitted to the Ad-hoc CAMPA along with APO 2018-19 vide PCCF Rc.No.5603/2017/CAMPA,Dt.27.06.2018. Telangana Forest Department is taking action on the suggestions made in Third Party Evaluation reports.

The APO for the year 2019-20 is submitted for examination and approval of Executive Committee of National CAMPA.

Agenda No. 7: Annual Plan of Operation for the year 2019-20 of Sikkim.

Annual Plan of Operation for the year 2019-20 of State Authority Sikkim has been received by hand which is approved by State Steering Committee in its meeting held on 04.02.2019. The proposed allocation for 11 CAT Plans is of Rs. 653.99 lakhs.
- 3. Integrated Wildlife Management Plan Three ongoing wildlife management plan and one new wildlife management plan in Maenam Wildlife Sanctuary with an outlay of Rs. 400.35 lakhs has been proposed in the APO.
- 4. **Under NPV** For ANR activities outlay of Rs. 103.40 lakhs have been proposed in five Forest Divisions.

For artificial regenerations maintenance of 6 nurseries for production of seedlings an amount of Rs. 36.41 lakhs have been earmarked.

For silviculture operations in forest area an amount of Rs. 24.90 lakhs has been earmarked.

Under for protection of plants and forests for various activities an amount of Rs. 465.54 lakhs has been earmarked.

For Soil Moisture Conservation and improvement of wildlife habitat and management of men-animal conflicts an amount of Rs. 132.50 lakhs and Rs. 40.00 lakhs have been earmarked.

For forest fire prevention and control operations works an amount of Rs. 40.65 lakhs has been earmarked.

For climate change mitigation measures and adaptation an amount of Rs. 60.00 lakhs has been earmarked.

For awareness on forest / environment an amount of Rs. 100.00 lakhs has been earmarked. As per CAF Rules, 2018 rule 3(i) publicity cum awareness programme and exhibition on the various schemes being implemented by State Authority from State Fund.

- 5. Under 20% of NPV various activities such as survey & demarcation, purchase and maintenance of equipment for communication, survey and mapping, upgradation of inspection patch, repair of range offices, forest guard quarters, wages of watch and ward, third party monitoring, etc. an amount of Rs. 319.36 lakhs has been earmarked. However this includes wages of drivers and supervisors.
- 6. Under interest component (60%) escalation of costs, salaries and allowances of members of staff, etc. has been taken with outlay of Rs. 854.17 lakhs.

Under interest component (40%) for recurring and non-recurring expenditure of State Authority has been kept for with an outlay of Rs. 569.50 lakhs. However the management of office establishment located under north, east, south and west division has been included Rs.195.00 lakhs.



<u>Compensatory Afforestation</u> – Proposal for carrying out CA on allotted non-forest land in lieu of diversion of forest land as well as the maintenance of works carried out during earlier years was approved in APO for Rs. 1493.046 lacs.

Proposal for carrying out CA and maintenance on degraded forest land of Rs. 1894.338 lacs have been proposed.

For road side plantations including maintenance a provision of Rs. 449.26 lacs have been proposed.

Plantation of Medicinal/Dwarf plants under electric transmission lines in 217 ha a provision of Rs. 523.356 lacs has been carmarked.

An amount of Rs.133.80 lacs has been kept for plantation in lieu of diversion of forest land to petrol pumps, maintenance as per directions of Hon'ble NGT order in case of Dholpur and pending liabilities. State CAMPA has sent third party evaluation report to concerned Chief Conservator of Forests to take action for plantation which are having survival percentage below 40.
