Minutes of Meeting

The 14th meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Authority

<u>Venue:</u> Through Videoconferencing <u>Date:</u> 22nd, 23rd and 30th of July

Time: 3.00PM, 11.30AM and 12.00PM

The list of Participants is annexed and marked as Annexure-A.

The Chief Executive Officer, National Authority welcomed the Chairman (DGF &SS, MoEF&CC), all Executive Committee members and the officers present in the meeting. With the permission of the Chair, CEO National Authority briefly explained the action taken on the decision of 13th Executive Committee and the agenda items of the 14th meeting. Thereafter, the Executive Committee took up the agenda items for detail discussion.

Agenda item No 1. Confirmation of Minutes of the 13th Meeting of the EC of the National Authority:

Decision: The Executive Committee confirmed the minutes of 13th meeting of EC held on 07th June, 2021.

Agenda Item no. 2: Action Taken on the decisions of the 13th Meeting of the EC:

Decision:


- 1. The action taken report on the decision of the 13th meeting of the EC of the National Authority, held on 7th June, 2021 was discussed. Certain guidance was given to the Secretariat of the National Authority to be completed in time bound manner. The EC expressed concern that follow-up was not initiated in most items and orders have been delayed. As the new CEO has joined very recently, the EC requested him to take necessary action and also see why these were delayed. It was further desired by the EC that sanction orders of APOs of remaining states/UTs be immediately scrutinized thoroughly and the sanction orders be issued at the earliest.
- The EC once again emphasised the following basic principles for preparation and approval of State APOs. These have been time and again re-iterated by the Hon'ble Minister MoEF&CC/Chairman of the Governing Body of National CAMPA: -
- (i) The Funds under CAMPA are to be utilised primarily for undertaking regeneration (both artificial and assisted natural regeneration) to compensate the loss of forest and create more forest inter-alia for improvement in quality of forests and the wildlife habitat, that is for

- augmentation of fodder and water for wildlife. As a principle, at least 80 per cent of the Compensatory Afforestation Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA) funds should be utilized for the above purpose of forest regeneration inter-alia for improvement in quality of forest and maximum 20% only be used for essential infrastructure support and capacity building that has direct impact on extension and improvement of forest cover and wildlife habitat.
- (ii) Protection of forests, forest related infrastructure development, wildlife protection, wildlife-human conflict mitigation and other ancillary activities are to be supported through other funds (e. g. State Plan, CSS schemes etc). Therefore, the States/UTs CAMPA Authorities should propose their funding under CAMPA as a matter of exception and only after weighing adequate justification. Once again the 80:20 principle reiterated above shall be followed.
- (iii)Use of CAMPA fund for Van Mahotsav/Publicity, forest protection, public awareness, capacity building etc must be directly linked to forest regeneration and improvement in forest cover/wildlife habitat in area terms. Area (in Ha) should be the monitorable parameter for these activities. Hence, geo-coordinates of treated sites shall be invariably uploaded on e-Green Watch portal in time. Vehicle, if in exceptional cases only for CAMPA related work required, should be hired instead of procurement for frontline staffs only. Forest/Wildlife Protection Force/Mobile Squad shall not be funded under CAMPA, as this is primarily the responsibility of State Govt./UT Adm.
- (iv) The utility of fire watch tower must be thoroughly evaluated in light of FSI's Real Time Fire alert system, and shall be accorded to in highly exceptional cases, for which justification will be provided.
- Regarding activities to be undertaken/implemented by State Authorities for improvement of wildlife habitat/wildlife management, following observations were made:
 - i. For improvement of wildlife habitat, CAMPA fund should be utilized only for raising of fodder and fruit bearing trees, soil & moisture conservation, augmentation measures and invasive weed control. Fencing and constructions of essential protection infrastructure if required, in exceptional circumstances may be done under CAMPA fund by using locally available eco-friendly materials and only after assessing site specific requirement.
 - ii. Use of CAMPA Funds for construction of concrete/Masonry boundary walls, fencing etc inside the forest and the Protected Areas shall be avoided. Fencing, if at all required, should be of bio-fencing, cable fencing, solar fencing etc.
 - iii. All major activities in PA area shall be part of approved Wildlife Management Plan. For activities in Tiger Reserves, the NTCA and



- for activities in other PA areas, the Wildlife Division of MoEF&CC, should be consulted before hand. Any large activity in a Wildlife area, such as wild boar/elephant proof fencing etc. should be first evaluated for site specific need by WII.
- iv. Funds for relocation of villages from Tiger Reserve should be first explored from State Government and NTCA.
- The EC deliberated on following common issues for strict compliance by all States/UTs CAMPA authorities and National Authority: -
 - (i) Monitoring of all new activities under CAMPA should be initiated by State/UTs in a time bound manner. Proper proposal be invited from Premier Institutes like ICFRE, IIFM, IISc, TERI, NEERI etc. Monitoring studies for new work should be commissioned in one (1) month and monitoring reports of all CAMPA works should be furnished within one (1) year to the National Authority.
 - (ii) CEO, National Authority to collect monitoring reports of all works, hitherto completed from all States/UTs within three (3) months. Compilation should be done for both routine monitoring and Third-Party monitoring. Progress Reports for Annual Reports and Audit Reports of State/UT CAMPA, and uploading of polygons in e-green watch portal shall also be prepared by National Authority on a monthly basis.
 - (iii) Random checking of polygons of some states uploaded on e-green watch reveals that, in general, the areas mentioned in the polygons and the actual areas on the ground are not matching and in some cases, plantations are not visible inside polygon either in full or in part. EC desired that CEO, National Authority shall bring this to the attention of respective State PCCF &HoFF through a D.O letter and seek related report along with corrective measures taken.
 - (iv) Some states reported that plantations along river courses had in few cases got swept away due to changing of river course and flooding due to natural calamities. The EC observed that for mitigation of impacts of natural calamities, due care should be taken while selecting sites and such plantations are supported through suitable techniques to protect the plantations. Such proposals for special schemes should be thoroughly evaluated by State/UT EC before submission to National Authority for approval.
 - (v) EC observed that APOs of some State Authorities are received very late in the office of National Authority and the Committee took serious note of this last-minute submission of APOs. This causes undue last-minute rush, difficulties in proper scrutiny of



- of APOs and their approval by NA. Henceforth, APOs received at least 15 working days before the Executive Committee meeting shall be included in the Agenda of EC meeting.
- (vi) Funding for supply of wood saving appliances/ energy saving conventional source of energy to fringe forest villages should be obtained from schemes of the concerned Ministry like MNRE, MP&NG etc. before approaching the National Authority for funding.
- (vii) It has been observed that in many instances, funds which have been sanctioned and approved by National Authority to respective States are not being released in a timely manner, which is causing issues in full expenditure and proper utilization of the approved APO amount. The Executive Committee have taken a serious note of the matter and have asked the National Authority to communicate to State Governments for the early resolution of this issue.
- The EC requested CEO, NA to write to Chief Secretary (Chairperson of Steering Committee of State CAMPA) and PCCF (Chairman of EC of State CAMPA) about decisions as elaborated in para 2, 3 & 4 above for compliance/follow up/guidance.
- The EC authorised CEO National Authority to have detailed discussion for clarification/supplementary information with the PCCF & HoFF and CEO, State CAMPA Authorities on items deferred by it in the last meeting.
- 7. The CEO, National Authority had discussions with the respective State Authorities of Rajasthan, Punjab, Assam, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand (on 27.07.2021); Karnataka, Arunachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh (on 28.07.2021); Tripura, Goa, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Uttar Pradesh (on 30.07.2021). Few States have subsequently furnished their responses/comments on each item and requested for approval of the activities in the APOs citing that many were continuing activities, which were already sanctioned in previous years through CAMPA and discontinuing them mid-way will have adverse impact on conservation and protection. The States have also justified that these activities are permissible under CAF Act, 2016 & CAF Rules, 2018 and requested for the consideration and approval of the EC.
- 8. Some states have been frequently raising the issue of their inability of hiring vehicles in difficult/mountainous terrains that hiring of vehicles is a huge challenge in terms of finding a suitable agency and high cost. It has been submitted that purchase of vehicles offers more cost effectiveness in the long run as opposed to hiring in mountain terrains

which is expensive, uneconomical and often very difficult to get agencies for providing vehicles on hire. The EC will examine such specific cases in detail later on.

Agenda Item No: 3. Approval of Annual Plan of Operation (APO) 2021-22 of Assam State Authority

Decision: Assam State Authority has submitted the Annual Plan of Operation for the financial year 2021-22 to the National Authority having a proposed outlay of Rs.97.68 Crores only for the year 2021-22.

The Executive Committee, NA has approved Rs.88.13Crore and deferred Rs.9.55Crore out of proposed outlay of Rs.97.68 Crores.

With regard to the APO, the following observation was made:

- a) Brahmaputra Rejuvenation Program: The DPR being prepared by ICFRE is due for implementation. Brahmaputra being a major river and due to recurrent floods, token provision of Rs. 20 lakhs is approved "in-principle", so that preliminary activities can be initiated. State may write to release more funds subject to implementation schedule and progress report.
- b) Survey Demarcation and Geo-referencing of forest boundary using DGPS/ETS in Reserve Forest: An amount of 3.60 crores (50%) is approved as first instalment. On submission of progress report, remaining amount shall be considered.
- c) Staff amenities for frontline staff/field personnel including in 24 nos. of Biodiversity parks: State clarified that this activity includes two components: Amenities (40L) and Solar Lights (24L). Only costs of basic amenities i.e 40 Lakhs is approved.
- d) Procurement of satellite phones: State had submitted problems of no/poor connectivity especially in the interior forest and WL areas including border areas. CEO National Authority, CAMPA enquired whether necessary approval from competent authority like MHA etc is obtained. This proposal may be considered if when necessary approvals from competent authority are obtained by state authority.
- e) Procurement of smart phones: State clarified that these are required for GPS survey, tracking, monitoring and uploading of data and will be in compliance to the approved software applications of WL tracking, fire warnings and FSI polygon uploading on e-Green watch amongst others. The proposal may be considered subject to the condition that the expenses are non-recurring in nature. An amount of 0.075 crores is approved as first instalment. The phones

- specification may get vetted from FSI, and the phones shall not be replaced before minimum period specified by the Government
- f) Publicity and Awareness and celebration of Van Mahotsav: Amount is being reduced to 0.25 Crores (50%) with condition specified in para 2(iii).

Agenda Item No.4: Approval of Annual Plan of Operation (APO) 2021-22 of Delhi State Authority

Decision: New Delhi State Authority has submitted the Annual Plan of Operation for the financial year 2021-22 to the National Authority having a proposed outlay of Rs.17.18 crores only for the year 2021-22.

The Executive Committee approved Rs. 15.82 crores out of proposed outlay of Rs. 17.18 Crores.

Agenda Item No. 5: Approval of Annual Plan of Operation (APO) 2021-22 of Karnataka State Authority

Decision: Karnataka State Authority has submitted the Annual Plan of Operation for the financial year 2021-22 to the National Authority having a proposed outlay of Rs.321.09 Crores only for the year 2021-22.

The Executive Committee approved Rs.235.56 crores out of proposed outlay of Rs.37756 crores.

Agenda Item No. 6 (i-xxv): Approval of remaining Activities in the APO for the year 2021-22 of State Authorities


Decision: The Executive Committee discussed APOs of States in detail and approved activities under CAF 2018 rules. The approved activities of APOs and their details States/UT-wise in the 14th EC meeting are annexed at (Annexure B).

Agenda Item No.7 (I): Annual Plan of Operation (APO) 2020-21 obtaining budget sanction for completion of incomplete works (Spill over works) of Chhattisgarh State Authority. State Authority to provide confirmation from State Finance Department that fund will be released in time this year. The spill over APO and additional APO was approved with this condition.

Agenda Item No.7 (II): Spill over APO of year 2020-21

Additional APO for the year 2021-22 of Telangana State Authority: The EC asked State Authority to provide confirmation from State Finance Department that fund will be released in time this year. The spill over and additional APO of Telangana State Authority was approved with this condition.



Agenda Item No. 8: Approval of Funds for the CPC Green (PARIVESH 2.0) from "CAMPA" has been submitted by IA division.

Decision: The Executive Committee went through the details furnished in the Agenda Item. It was submitted by AS (IA Division) and his team that EC clearance in the forest area is interlinked with FC clearances as well as wildlife clearances in Protected Areas/ ESZ with the overall aim to conserve forest, ecology, biodiversity and environment. There is a need to have an integrated platform/mechanism for online access, filing of data, management and monitoring of cases through a single window portal of the proposed Parivesh 2.0. This platform when operational will lead to ease of doing responsible business by facilitating the project proponents/applicants to make one comprehensive application for various clearances through a single window and also expedite processing and monitoring of various stages of the application by concerned officers/ authorities.

- 2. During discussion, it was decided that the following activities related to NA will be included in the proposal for integration with Parivesh 2.0 portal:
 - A. Online Payment mechanism/ gateway by UA for CAF/ Compensatory levies and other such levies as applicable.
 - B. Integrate e-Green Watch portal to provide assistance to NA.
 - C. Provision of IT support including necessary personnel for NA (Details to be provided by NA).
 - D. Integration, uploading and access of following documents and reports by National Authority and State CAMPA Authority.
 - APOs to be submitted by States/ UTs and uploaded at PARIVESH
 - ii. M&E Report with MIS for Decision Support System
 - iii. Annual Report
 - iv. Audit Report

- v. Fund Utilization
- vi. Annual Demand & Expenditure
- 3. Parivesh 2.0 proposal of MoEF&CC aims for creation a single window system for overall management of regulations related to forest, wildlife and environment and is within the ambit of Section 5(b)(iii) of the CAF Act, 2016 as the facility shall also help in management and monitoring of CAMPA works and payment mechanism of compensatory levies. It will also lead to integrated administration of the Forest, Environment and Wildlife sector. The proposal, therefore, recommended as per the provision of section 15 (1) (ii) of CAF Act, 2016 subject to following condition, for approval by the Governing Body of NA: -

July .

- (i) The funds will be released annually to the Project Division, who would make disbursals based on committed milestones and service level benchmarks specified in the relevant contractual documents and achieving defined stages of physical targets/ specific outcomes.
- (ii) The Project Division will explore additional funds from various sources to supplement the financial requirements of the Project and reduce dependence on National Fund of CAMPA.
- (iii) Implementation, compliance and monitoring of progress of the Parivesh 2.0 Project will be the responsibility of the IA Division, which will submit necessary reports/ UCs etc. as per relevant CAF Rules.
- (iv) Activities listed in para 2 above shall be included in the project.
- 4. The Programme (IA) Division will also ensure that Parivesh 2.0 is integrated with not only clearances mechanism under various Acts & Rules of the Ministry, but also their compliance, monitoring, verification and evaluation by the respective User agencies/ Project Proponents by concerned regulatory authorities
- 5. The EC recommended for in principle approval of funding to Parivesh 2.0 at the cost of Rs. 95.59 crores for a period of five (5) years under the provision of section 5(b)(iii) of CAF Act, 2016 with annual requirements as given in following table: -

The amount to be released in quarterly instalments every year as per demand raised by the program division.

6. Further, in order to rationalise the cost, the project division is to constitute technical monitoring committee as an oversight mechanism to assess and examine the stage of development of the system and also whether the demanded software and hardware are actually required.

Agenda Item No. 9: Approval of a Pilot Project on 'Seed Ball Plantation' to be taken up in the states in collaboration with ICFRE

Decision: The Executive Committee deliberated on the details furnished in the agenda item proposed by ICFRE through the NAEB division. The project is to be implemented in 20 states for two years starting from 2021-22 with an objective of deploying low cost innovative technology for complementing massive greening exercise in order to achieve the various National and International green commitments. The Proposed scheme is to be taken up in the states in collaboration with ICFRE.

The EC recommended the proposal for approval at a total cost of Rs. 904 lakhs, by the Governing Body of National Authority.

Agenda Item No. 10: Approval of Project proposal on 'Pan India assessment and monitoring of endangered species covered under the 'Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats' (IDWH) scheme of MoEF&CC Government of India.

Decision: The Executive Committee deliberated the details furnished in the agenda item proposed by Wildlife Institute of India (WII) through the Wildlife Division. The aim of the proposal is to fill this data gap with active involvements of State Forest Departments and other relevant agencies for a period of two years, to develop methodological protocol, assess and monitor the population of the species covered under DWH. Cost will also include the capacity building of concerned frontline staff

The EC recommended the project proposal for approval at a total cost of Rs.19.05 crores by the Governing Body of National Authority.

Agenda Item No. 11: Approval of Strengthening of CAMPA Office

The CEO, National Authority apprised the EC that strengthening and improvement of the Administrative structure of National Authority of CAMPA is urgently required for smooth functioning.

Presently a very skeletal structure is available to carry out all works. This requires creation of posts, appointment of consultant and other officials to man various operations on National Authority. National Authority of CAMPA has become effective with coming into force of CAF Act, 2016 but so far appropriate initiative has not been done to ensure engagement of suitable manpower support for the Authority.

National Authority, CAMPA office is presently functioning with bare minimum infrastructure. The office space available at CGO Complex at Block No 03, 4th floor is very small; cramped accommodation and can't be expanded due to space constraints. There is no proper room for CEO, Jt. CEO, Dy.CEO, AIGFs, Technical Consultant, Finance and Accounting officials and other contractual staffs. There is acute shortage of IT equipment like Desktop and Laptop computers, Xerox machines, printers, scanners etc.

It was submitted by CEO National Authority that despite these huge shortcomings, lack of minimum required manpower, CAMPA office is trying its best to attend very important following matters/ activities on top priority, but efficiency is badly affected: -

1) Meeting of Governing Body of CAMPA

As per the CAF Act, 2016, the governing body of National Authority of CAMPA is required to meet once in six months. Last meeting was last

held in Nov, 2019. The governing body approves all the schemes recommended by Executive Committee.

2) Reconciliation of funds deposited in CAMPA

Reconciliation of funds is done to verify the amount deposited by user agency in lieu of the diversion of forest land. This facilitates calculation of the share of State Authority and National Authority so that the share of State Authority can be transferred to them. There is no account functionary at present to handle this task, resulting in difficulties in timely reconciliation.

3) Confirmation of Amount deposited by User Agency

The amount deposited by user agency in CAMPA is required to be confirmed to facilitate grant of Stage II clearance under FC Act. A large number of such confirmations are pending in CAMPA due to insufficient number of staffs to handle the work.

4) Audit of CAMPA

No audit of CAMPA, both internal and external, has been initiated so far, which needs to be taken up on top priority. The report is to be placed before Governing Body.

5) Payment mechanism

An online payment mechanism with involvement of Reserve Bank of India, CAG and State Authority is proposed to be developed so that the fund deposited by user agency is credited in both State and National Authority in 90:10 ratio. In order to functionalise this, additional staff like financial adviser and adequate equipment are required.

6) Approval of APOs

Follow up with states is required to ensure that States/UTs submit APOs in time. Proper scrutinizing and examination of APOs submitted by States is required. The appraisal of APOs of all States takes lot of time in view of very few officials available with National CAMPA.

7) Approval of schemes

Several scheme recommended by EC needs to be processed on time from CAMPA office.

8) Monitoring of implementation of approved State APOs by the States.

Decision: After detail deliberations on the requirements submitted by CEO, National Authority, the Executive Committee agreed in principle to the

proposal of the National Authority as mentioned in the agenda item regarding strengthening of Office of NA including that of the CEO, Jt. CEO, Dy. CEO, AIGFs, Consultants and Section along with measures to delegate financial powers to NA for meeting demands of increasing workload. The EC decided that the appropriate proposal may be moved to IFD for consideration.

Additional Agenda item NO. 12: With Permission of the Chairman, Executive Committee

i. Dolphin Project Submitted through WL Division:

The proposal submitted by WL Division for range-wide enumeration of River Dolphin populations in India under CAMPA mentioning that the budget is prepared, keeping in mind the resource required for each range state, as well as Wildlife Institute of India and the state budgets may require validation from respective states.

The consolidated budget (in Crores INR) proposed is as follows:

The Executive Committee agreed "in principle" to the proposal of WL Division subject to submission of detailed proposal. WL Division to submit revised proposal.

ii. Land Degradation Project submitted by Desertification Cell for setting up of Centre of Excellence at ICFRE

The proposal was deferred. The EC sought further details from the project proponent. Further, EC observed that the costing for infrastructure and manpower may be explored from other sources and also if any existing facilities of ICFRE are being included/utilised. EC was also of the opinion that the funding, if at all from National CAMPA, should be one-time and non-recurring. The SS&FA desired that option of AFRI as location of the Centre should be explored. The PD was asked to explore funding from other sources and submit a revised proposal for consideration before the next EC.

iii. Reassessment Study for modification of Management Plan Sustainable Mining (MPSM) in Saranda and Chaibasa Forest Division in West Singbhum District of Jharkhand submitted by FC Division.

The proposal was submitted by FC Division stating that in pursuance to decision taken in the meeting dated 04.02.2019 (held between Secretary, EF&CC and officials of the Government of Jharkhand and inter-ministerial meeting dated 26.08.2019 held between Hon'ble Minister, EF&CC, Hon'ble Minister, Mines, Hon'ble Minister, Steel, and Hon'ble CM of Jharkhand), the MoEF&CC has assigned a re-assessment study of MPSM to ICFRE.

As per the proposal, said Study will be led by the ICFRE with WII, ISM Dhanbad and IIT Kharagpur as member organization. The cost of the proposed study is Rs 3.54 crores, as communicated by ICFRE. This matter is being reviewed at various levels in the Ministry wherein, it was desired that ICFRE, at their own cost, may initiate the short term table top exercise using the available information for this re-assessment study while the detailed assessment may be taken up subsequently by the ICFRE. The ICFRE, in turn, has requested for release of an amount of Rs. 30,29,500/- so that it may initiate the table top study as per ToR approved by the Ministry. The Executive Committee deliberated the details furnished in the agenda item proposed by Forest Conservation division MoEF&CC and recommended the project proposal at the total cost of Rs.3.54 crores by Governing Body of National Authority.

The EC further desired that a status report on all the studies & projects undertaken by ICFRE, IIFM, WII and any other premier institutes funded by the National CAMPA should be placed in the next meeting.


