Sub: Diversion of 0.604 ha. of forest area proposed for Downhill Pipe Conveyor (DHPC) for Bhadra Iron Ore Mine ML No. 2365 and Tunga Iron Ore Mine ML No. 2366 in favour of M/s JSW Steel Ltd., in Bellary District of Karnataka.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the State Government's letter No FEE 28 FFM 2018 dated 20.08.2018 on the subject mentioned above seeking prior approval of the Central Government under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and to say that the proposal has been examined by the Forest Advisory Committee constituted by the Central Government under Section-3 of the aforesaid Act.

After careful examination of the proposal of the State Government and on the basis of the recommendations of the Forest Advisory Committee, *In principle approval/Stage-I Clearance* of the Central Government is hereby granted for diversion of 0.604 ha. of forest area proposed for Downhill Pipe Conveyor (DHPC) for Bhadra Iron Ore Mine ML No. 2365 and Tunga Iron Ore Mine ML No. 2366 in favour of M/s JSW Steel Ltd., in Bellary District of Karnataka subject to the following conditions:

- (i) Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged
- (ii) Compensatory afforestation over the non-forest land, equal in extent to the forest land being diverted, shall be raised within a period of three years with effect from the date of issue of Stage-II clearance and maintained thereafter in accordance with the approved Plan in consultation with the State Forest Department at the cost of the user agency;
- (iii) The land identified for the purpose of CA shall be clearly depicted on a Survey of India topo-sheet of 1:50,000 scale.
- (iv) The non-forest land identified for raising compensatory afforestation shall be transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department before issue of the Stage-II clearance.
- (v) The non-forest land transferred so mutated in favour of the State Forest Department shall be notified by the State Government as RF under Section-4 or PF under Section-29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant Section(s) of the local Forest Act, 1927 latest within a period of six months from the date of issue of Stage--II approval.
- (vi) The User Agency shall transfer the cost of raising and maintaining the compensatory afforestation at the current wage rate in consultation with State Forest Department in the account of CAMPA of the concerned State through online portal. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.
- (vii) The User Agency shall transfer online, the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forestland being diverted under this proposal, as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme", Court

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- of India dated 28.03.2008, 24.04.2008 and 09.05.2008 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 202/1995 and the guidelines issued by this Ministry vide its letter No. 5-3/2007-FC dated 05.02.2009. The requisite funds shall be transferred through online portal into Ad-hoc CAMPA account of the State Concerned.
- (viii) The user agency should ensure that the compensatory levies (CA cost, NPV, etc.) are deposited through challan generated online on web portal and deposited in appropriate bank online only. Amount deposited through other mode will not be accepted as compliance of the Stage-I clearance.
- (ix) The User Agency shall submit compliance for FRA before Stage-II approval. Thus, the State Government shall complete settlement of rights, in terms of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, if any, on the forest land to be diverted and submit the documentary evidence as prescribed by this Ministry in its letter No. 11-9/1998-FC (pt.) dated 03.08.2009, 05th February, 2013 and 05th July, 2013, in support thereof;
- (x) The user agency shall conduct a study, at its own cost, involving a Reputed Institute on impact of downhill pipe conveyer on wildlife in the landscape and ambient environment. The State Forest Department will decide the ToR for the study. The study may be conducted for a period of five years or as decided by the State Forest Department.
- (xi) The User Agency shall obtain the Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if required.
- (xii) No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- (xiii) The User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas.
- (xiv) The boundary of the diverted forest land, as applicable, shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number, forward and back bearing, distance from pillar to pillar and GPS Co-ordinates.
- (xv) The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government.
- (xvi) The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal.
- (xvii) The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government.
- (xviii) No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused.
- (xix) The user agency shall explore the possibility of translocation of maximum number of trees identified to be felled and shall ensure that any tree felling shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department;
- (xx) Overburden shall not be dumped outside the width of the road. The muck generated in the earth cutting will be disposed off at the designate dumping sites and in no case the muck/debris shall be allowed to roll down the hill slopes.
- (xxi) The User Agency will undertake comprehensive soil conservation measures at the project cost in consultation with the State Forest Department.
- (xxii) The User Agency shall not collect any toll from the vehicles carrying forest officers on duty;
- (xxiii) The User Agency shall submit the annual self-compliance report in respect of the above conditions to the State Government and to the concerned Regional Officer of the Ministry regularly;
- (xxiv) Any other condition that the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry with the

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- approval of competent authority may stipulate, from time to time, in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife; and
- (xxv) The user agency shall comply all the provisions of the all Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order (s) and National Green Tribunal Order(s) pertaining to this project, if any, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project.

After receipt of compliance report on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above, the proposal shall be considered for final approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Transfer of forest land shall not be affected till final approval is granted by the Central Government in this regard.
