The Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Nodal Officer, Maharashtra State, Nagpur has submitted proposal for diversion of 132.102 ha. Forest land under Forest (Conservation), 1980 for up-gradation of Gadchiroli-Allapalli-Sironcha road, NH-353 C in the State of Maharashtra.

3. The total non-forest area involved in the project is 18.193 ha. The project alignment commences from Gadchiroli and terminates at Sironcha over a length of 204.5 km. Presently, State Highway Kilometer markings are at the site and the project corridor appears to start at km 172+650 as per kilometer markings (MSH 11) MSH 11 chainage has been compared with the NH-353 C Chainage and the Up- gradation to 2/4 lane with paved shoulder configuration of Gadchioli-Sironcha of NH-353 C in the State of Maharashtra by Ministry of Road Transport& Highway (F.No.10-22/2015-IA-III) starting point, i.e., proposed Chingae of NH-353 C for the present project is km 113+650 at Indira Square Junction in Gadchiroli. The road traverses through Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra via Gadchiroli, Chamorshi, Ashti and Allapalli and reaches end point at Sironcha at Chainage km 318+200. Existing ROW of the Project Road varies from 16.00 m to 22.00 m (in urban area) and in other area it varies from 30 to 60 mtr. on an average. Improved road connectivity is vital for economic growth of a region in particular and Nation in general. They help in transporting men and material effectively to the destination in time. Thus it provides larger market for the product and produce giving remunerative returns to the producers.

## 4. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sironcha has certified that:-

- (i) No suitable alternate non-forest land is available and demand for the forest land is minimum.
- (ii) Provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and guidelines under it have not been violated by the User Agency.
- (iii) The non-forest area covered under the project is not under the provision of Maharashtra Private Forest (Acquisition) Act 1975 by virtue of application of Section 35 of Indian Forest Act 1927 and are not recognized as deemed reserved forest as well as not included in the area identified as "forest" as per dictionary meaning of forest as intimated to the expert committee appointed under interim judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 12/12/1996.
- (iv) The proposed project area belongs to Eco value Class -III having Density 0.8 (Very Dense Forest).

- (v) The proposed project is not included in any National Park or Wild Life Sanctuary or Nature reserve. The Pranhita WLS is at a distance to 0.00 KM & Kolmanka Conservation Reserve is at a distance of 8.200 km from the Forest area proposed for diversion.
- (vi) Proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archaeological or recreational importance.
- (vii) The Sironcha Forest Division sheres boundry with Chhatisgarh and Telengana State. The area in Prone to Teak Smuggling, therefore amount for construction of Forest Check posts and four wheeler vehicle should be provided by the User Agency.

## 5. The User Agency has submitted undertakings:-

- 5.1 To defray the cost of compensatory afforestation.
- 5.2 To defray the cost of Net Present Value of the forest land proposed under diversion.
- 5.3 To submit the necessary compliance under Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Right) Act, 2006
- 6. Addl. PCCF has mentioned that the existing road passes through pranhita Wild-life Sanctuary and Tiger corridor. The proposed upgradation and widening of the road excludes the area of Pranhita Wild-Life Sanctuary and Tiger Corridors. Approximately 22.567 Ha. area falls in Tiger Corridor. The proposed road passes through Pranhita Wild Life Sanctuary Eco-Sensitive Zone. Hence, It is mandatory to obtain a proposal regarding Wildlife Clearance to SBWL and NBWL under Section 38(o) I (g) of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- 7. There is tree cover on some part of degraded forest land, proposed for Compensatory Afforestation. Hence, Wherever the Compensatory Afforestation is not possible, different degraded forest land need to be proposed for remaining CA.
- 8. In the circumstances explained in the aforesaid paragraphs and enclosures, the State Government recommends that the said forest land may be allowed to be diverted on the following conditions:
  - a) Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged.

## b) Compensatory Afforestation:-

i) Compensatory Afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over double degraded forest land, proposed for CA. Wherever the Compensatory Afforestation is not possible because of existing tree cover, different degraded forest land shall be proposed for Compensatory Afforestation. Details of such land will be shared with State and Central Government before final approval.

ii) As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided. CA shall be carried for 10 years. The User Agency shall transfer the cost of raising and maintaining the Compensatory Afforestation at the current wage rate, to the State Forest Department. The Scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.

#### c) NPV:-

- i) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 132.102 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the latest guidelines in this regard.
- ii) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due afte finalization of the same shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- d) If there is a violation of the FCA, 1980, penalty shall be imposed as per guidelines of Government of India, in this regard and action will be taken accordingly.
- e) All The funds received from the User Agency under the project, except the funds released for regeneration / demarcation of safety zone, shall be transferred to ad-hoc CAMPA in the Saving Bank Account pertaining to the State concerned.
- f) The User Agency shall obtain the Environment clearance as per the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, if required
- g) No labour camp shall be established on the forest land;
- h) The User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labours and the Staff Working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas
- i) The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet sigh reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number forward and back bearing and distance from pillar to pillar;
- j) The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government.
- k) The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the Proposal.
- The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government.
- m) No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused.
- n) Any tree felling shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department.

- O) The Nodal Officer shall ensure complete shall ensure complete settlement of rights in terms of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 on the forest land to be diverted and submit the documentary evidence as prescribed by this Ministry in its Guidelines issued in this regard along with the compliance of Stage-I approval;
- p) The User Agency in consultation with the State Government shall create and maintain alternate habitat/home for the avifauna, who's nesting trees are to be cleared in this project. Bird's nest artificially made out of eco-friendly material shall be used in the area, including forest area and human settlements, adjoining the forest area being diverted for the project;
- q) User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- r) Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the

Protected Areas/Forest Areas.

- s) It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals
  - (i) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mtr and Height 3.00 mtr.
  - (ii) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct New underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as Suggested in (i) above.
  - (iii) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (i) above.
  - (iv) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km.
- s) The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- t) The User Agency shall submit six monthly self-compliance reports as on 1<sup>st</sup> January and 1<sup>st</sup> July of every year to the GOI office as well as to the Nodal Officer of the State
- u) The State Government shall monitor self-compliance of conditions of Forest Clearance and shall submit in this regard yearly reported as on 31st December of every year.
- v) Any other condition that the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forest & Wildlife. The User Agency and the State Government shall ensure compliance to provisions of the all Acts, Rules, Regulations and Guidelines, for the time being in force applicable to the projects.

- w) The User Agency shall obtain Wildlife Clearance, working permission shall not be granted till the compliance of same.
- x) User Agency shall pay the cost for Forest Check posts as proposed by the Dy.CF

The matter may kindly be placed before the Government of India for its approval under Section-2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, be obtained and communicated to this Government at earlier.
