Sub: Final (Stage-II) approval of Central Government under Forest (Conservation) Act 1980 for proposed diversion of 0.65 ha forest land in favour of National Highways & Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (NHIDCL) for Muck Dumping at S-Turning (Kapur More) under Singtam Territorial Range in East Sikkim district of Sikkim- reg

Sir,

This refers to Sikkim Govt. letter No.1883/FCA/FE&ED/656 dated 13.08.2021, wherein prior approval of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change for diversion of 0.65 ha forest land in favour of NHIDCL for Muck Dumping at S-Turning (Kapur More) under Singtam Territorial Range in East Sikkim district of Sikkim, was sought in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. After due consideration of the proposal of the State Government, the 'in-principle' approval of the Central Government for diversion of the said forest land was accorded vide Ministry's letter of even number dated 29.09.2021 subject to fulfillment of certain conditions. The State Government of Sikkim vides their letter No.1883/FCA/F&ED/198-202 dated 25.05.2022 has furnished compliance report in respect of the relevant conditions stipulated in the in-principle approval for grant of final approval.

In this connection, on the basis of the compliance report under reference, the **final approval** of the Central Government under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is hereby accorded for diversion of 0.65 ha forest land in favour of NHIDCL for Muck Dumping at S-Turning (Kapur More) under Singtam Territorial Range in East Sikkim district of Sikkim, subject to the following conditions and stipulations: -

- (1) Legal status of the forest land diverted shall remain unchanged.
- (2) **Compensatory afforestation:** Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 0.65 ha. degraded forest land (Location – Tinek RF, Singtam (T) Range under East Territorial Forest Division) at the

cost of the User Agency. As far as practicable a mixture of local indigenous species will be planted and monoculture of a species has to be avoided.


- (3) **The KML files of the area to be diverted and the CA area shall be uploaded on the e-Green watch portal before issue of final approval by the State Government of Sikkim.**
- (4) The State Government shall ensure that compliance of Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been completed in accordance with the relevant Rules and Guidelines issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI in this regard.
- (5) The proposed diverted forest land shall be handed over back to the Forest Department by the User Agency after carry out stabilization and reclamation of the site by raising plantation of suitable species at their own cost under the supervision of concerned DFO at the end of use of forest land. A report in this regard should be submitted in IRO Kolkata.
- (6) The User Agency shall ensure that muck does not roll down the slopes. All such areas where muck has rolled down, the slopes shall be rehabilitated at the cost of User Agency and under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department.
- (7) The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officers.
- (8) The layout plan of the proposed diversion of the forest land shall not be changed without prior approval of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.
- (9)
 - a) No labour camp shall be established inside the forest land.
 - b) The User Agency shall provide alternate fuels preferably LPG to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas.
 - c) No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for any activity related to the project work.
 - d) Earth or any other material shall not be brought from and debris resulting during construction shall not be disposed of in the adjoining forest area by the user agency.
 - e) All the natural streams and water bodies in surrounding area shall be protected.
 - f) The user agency shall take necessary mitigative measures to prevent soil erosion in the area.
- (10)
 - a) The diverted forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
 - b) The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of the project life.

c) The diverted forest land shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department, or person without prior approval of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

- (11) The User Agency and the State Government shall ensure compliance to provisions of all the Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order(s) and National Green Tribunal Order(s) pertaining to this project, if any, for the time in force, as applicable to the project.
- (12) Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guideline F. No. 11-42/2017-FC dt 29/01/2018.
- (13) Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests and wildlife.

2. As has been mentioned at Para-2 of the Stage-II approval, this approval for diversion of forest land is subject to the fulfillment of stipulated conditions mentioned in this approval letter. Therefore, in the event of non-compliance of any of the conditions laid out in this approval letter, the Integrated Regional Office of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change may withdraw the said approval for diversion of the forest land and stop the non-forest activity being carried out in the forest land besides initiating the legal action as per provisions of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
