Sub: Diversion of 75.635 ha of forest land within the limits of Paradip Port Trust at Paradip coming under jurisdiction of Rajnagar Mangrove Division/ Jagatsingpur District, Odisha for development of Outer Harbour including Western Dock & mechanisation of existing operational berth by M/s Paradip Port Trust

(Proposal No. FP/OR/Others/26300/2017 & Sl. No.OR-010/2018 dated 22.02.2018)

In inviting a reference to the above mentioned subject, this is to inform that Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, New Delhi have accorded Stage-I approval vide their Letter F.No.8-68/2018-FC dated 31.12.2018 for diversion of 75.635 ha of forest within the limits of Paradip Port Trust at Paradip coming under jurisdiction of Rajnagar Mangrove Division/ Jagatsinghpur district, Odisha for development of Outer Harbour including Western Dock & mechanisation of existing operational berth by M/s Paradip Port Trust subject to fulfilment of twenty five (25) nos. of conditions stipulated therein. The User Agency has complied with all conditions imposed by by GoI, MoEF & CC. The point wise compliances as received from the Divisional Forest Officer Mangrove (Wildlife) Division, Rajnagar are furnished below:

Condition No-(i): Legal status of forest land proposed for diversion shall remain unchanged.

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the DFO Mangrove (Wildlife) Division Rajnagar has reported that the user agency has furnished an undertaking that the legal status of the <u>diverted forest land</u> shall remain unchanged. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as **Annexure-I**.



Condition No-(ii): Compensatory Afforestation over the degraded forest land, twice in extent to the area of forest land proposed to be diverted, shall be raised within a period of three years with effect from the date of issue of Stage-II clearance and maintained thereafter in accordance with the approved Plan in consultation with the State Forest Department at the cost of the user agency;

Compliance: In compliance to the above, the DFO Mangrove (Wildlife) Division Rajnagar has reported that an area of 180.0 ha of degraded forest land has been identified in Dairtary DPF in Sukinda Range of Cuttack Forest Division under Sukinda Tahasil of Jajpur District for the purpose of Compensatory Afforestation in lieu of proposal for diversion of 75.635 ha of forest land for development of Outer Harbour, Inner Harbour including Western Dock & mechanization of existing Operational Berth by M/s Paradip Port Trust, Odisha. As per MoEF & CC guideline vide letter No.11-423/2011-FC dated 08.11.2017, 75,635 nos. (75.635 ha X 1000) of seedlings are required to be plated against proposed diversion of 75.635 ha forest land. Accordingly a Compensatory Afforestation scheme prepared by DFO Cuttack Division to take up ANR with gap plantation over 97.0 ha @ 800 plants per ha (97.0 ha X 800 plants per ha = 77,600 plants) with 10 years maintenance along with vegetative fencing and provision of Soil & Moisture Conservation over 180.00 ha @ 25% of CA Cost as per Condition No.2 (iii) of Stage-I approval order has been technically approved by PCCF Odisha for Rs.1,59,41,300/- at the wage rate of Rs.280/- per Manday. Again, due to revision of wage rate the Compensatory Afforestation scheme was prepared at the current wage of Rs.298/- per MD with 10 years maintenance which has been technically approved by PCCF (FD & NO, FC Act) with a financial outlay of Rs.1,67,76,400/-.

In this connection, it is pertinent to mention that the User Agency has deposited the approved amount of Rs.1,67,76,400/- towards the Compensatory Afforestation in two phases.

In the first phase, the User Agency has deposited an of Rs.6,32,89,478/- which includes Rs.1,59,41,300/- towards cost of Compensatory Afforestation in Ad-hoc CAMPA account No.1508219926300482 in Corporation Bank, Lodhi Road, New Delhi vide UTR No.SBINR52019092100058053 dated 21.09.2019. (The copy of the approved letter, demand letter and RTGS challan are enclosed as Annexure-II)

In the second phase, the User Agency has deposited an amount of Rs.8,35,100/- (Cost of CA of Rs. 1,67,76,400/- @ Rs.298/- per MD – Cost of CA of Rs.1,59,41,300/- @ Rs.280/-per MD) towards differential cost of CA in Ad-hoc CAMPA Account No.150821992600299 in Corporation Bank, Lodhi Road, New Delhi vide UTR No.SBIN520083199514 dated 23.03.2020. (The copy of the approval letter RTGS Challan & CA scheme are enclosed as Annexure-III)

Thus, in total the User Agency has deposited an amount of Rs.1,67,76,400/-(Rs.1,59,41,300/- + Rs.8,35,100/-) in the Ad-hoc CAMPA account in phase manner towards the cost of Compensatory Afforestation over 180.0 ha including maintenance for 10 years.

The Compensatory Afforestation shall be raised within a period of three years with effect from the date of issue of Stage-II clearance, at the cost of User Agency.

<u>Condition No-(iii)</u>:25% of CA cost will be deposited extra by the user agency for soil and moisture conservation (SMC) activities on the CA land.,

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the DFO Mangrove (WL) Division, Rajnagar has reported that the cost of Compensatory Afforestation over 180.0 ha amounting to Rs.1,67,76,400/- includes 25% of CA cost towards SMC measures amounting to Rs.24,47,243/- has been deposited by the User Agency in two phases.

In the first phase, the User Agency has deposited cost of CA of Rs.1,59,41,300/- @ Rs.280/- per manday which includes 25% of CA cost towards SMC measures amounting to Rs.23,10,332/- in Ad-hoc CAMPA account No.1508219926300482 in Corporation Bank, Lodhi Road, New Delhi vide UTR No.SBINR52019092100058053 dated 21.09.2019. The copy of the receipt in support of the aforesaid payment is enclosed as Annexure-II.

In the second phase, the User Agency has deposited differential cost of CA of Rs.8,35,100/- which includes differential cost of CA for 25% of CA cost towards SMC measure amounting to Rs.1,36,911/- (Cost of 25% of CA cost of Rs.24,47,243/- @ Rs.298/- per MD – Cost of 25% of CA cost of Rs.23,10,332/- @ Rs.280/- per MD) in Ad-hoc CAMPA Account No.1508219926300299 in Corporation Bank, Lodhi Road, New Delhi vide UTR No.SBIN520083199514 dated 23.03.2020. The copy of the receipt in support of the aforesaid payment is enclosed as Annexure-III.





<u>Condition No-(iv)</u>: State Government shall initiate action for violation as per the provisions of Government of India Guidelines 11-42/2017- FC dated 29.01.2018.

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the Government of Odisha, Forest & Environment Department vide their letter No.10F (Cons) 150/18-16122/F&E dated 22.08.2019 have issued instructions to take following actions against the User Agency. (Copy enclosed as **Annexure-III A**).

- (i) If the land used for Aahar Kendra is under the administrative control of the Forest Department then DFO may be instructed to take necessary action under the provisions of Indian Forest Act, 1927 or State Forest Act. If the land is under administrative control of Revenue Department then the DFO may be instructed to request the Collector for initiating appropriate action under the relevant Revenue Act and Rules.
- (ii) Penalty for violation may be imposed on the UA as per Para-B (ii) of the said guidelines, as the Aahar Kendra may be treated as a Public Utility Project of the Government.

Therefore, as per instructions issued in Point No.(i) of Government of Odisha, Forest & Environment Department, then DFO Mangrove (WL) Division, Rajnagar vide the letter No.5936 dated 24.08.2019 (copy enclosed as Annexure-III B) has intimated Collector & District Magistrate Jagatsinghpur that the User Agency has violated Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Aahar Kendra at Paradip Port Trust. As the land is under administrative control of Revenue Department it is requested Collector Jagatsinghpur to initiate appropriate action under the relevant Revenue Act and Rules against the User Agency i.e., Paradip Port Trust.

Further, as per instructions issued in Point No.(ii) of Government of Odisha, Forest & Environment Department, the DFO Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar vide his letter No.6280 dated 05.09.2019 has raised demand on User Agency to deposit Penal NPV from 14.01.2016 to 31.12.2018 (as Aahar Kendra is a Public Utility Project of the Government, the penalty shall be 20% of the penalty) amounting to Rs.668/- (copy enclosed as Annexure-III C). The User Agency has deposited an amount of Rs.6,32,89,478/- which includes Rs.668/- towards Penal NPV from 14.01.2016 to 31.12.2018 in Ad-hoc CAMPA Account No.1508219926300482 in Corporation Bank, Lodhi Road, New Delhi vide UTR No. SBINR52019092100058053 dated 21.09.2019. The copy of the receipt in support of aforesaid payment are enclosed as Annexure-III D.





<u>Condition No-(v)</u>: The user agency shall undertake plantation of suitable species in the vacant spaces available within the applied area as well as in the Port limit area as per advice of the Divisional Forest Officer, Rajnagr (Mangrove) Division at project cost.

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar has reported that the User Agency has furnished an undertaking to take up plantation of suitable species in the vacant spaces available within the applied area as well as in the Port limit area as per advice of the Divisional Forest Officer, Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar at the project cost. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as **Annexure-IV**.

<u>Condition No-(vi)</u>: The user agency shall undertake posting of durable six feet high RCC pillars along the forest area included in diversion proposal and embedded with pillars two feet inside and 4 feet above the ground with serial number, forward and backward bearings and distance from adjacent pillar posted clearly.

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar has reported that the User Agency has furnished an undertaking for posting of durable six feet high RCC pillars along the forest area included in diversion proposal and embedded with pillars two feet inside and 4 feet above the ground with serial number, forward and backward bearings and distance from adjacent pillar posted clearly. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as Annexure-V.

<u>Condition No-(vii)</u>: The user agency shall undertake that the contractors engaged in the project shall not damage any forest growth and wildlife found in the area.

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar has reported that the User Agency has furnished an undertaking not to damage any forest growth and wildlife found in the area by the contractors engaged in the project. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as **Annexure-VI.**

<u>Condition No-(viii)</u>: The execution of the project shall also be subject CRZ clearance and Environmental Clearance of the competent authority.

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking to execute the project after obtaining CRZ Clearance and Environmental Clearance of the competent authority. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as **Annexure-VII.**





<u>Condition No-(ix)</u>: It should be ensured by the user agency that movement of Olive Ridley turtle does not get affected owing to this project including during its construction phase.

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking to ensure movement of Olive Ridley turtle does not get affected owing to the project including during its instruction phase. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as **Annexure-VIII.**

<u>Condition No-(x)</u>: The land identified for the purpose of CA shall be clearly depicted on s Survey of India Topo Sheet- of 1:50,000 scale;

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the land identified for the purpose of CA has been clearly depicted of Survey of India Toposheet No.F45N12 in 1:50,000 scale which is enclosed as **Annexure-IX**.

Condition No-(xi): The user agency shall transfer the cost of raising and maintaining the Compensatory Afforestation at the current wage rate as directed and advised by State Forest Department in CAMPA account of the State Concern through online portal. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years;

Compliance: In compliance to the above, the DFO Mangrove (Wildlife) Division Rajnagar has reported that an area of 180.0 ha of degraded forest land has been identified in Dairtary DPF in Sukinda Range of Cuttack Forest Division under Sukinda Tahasil of Jajpur District for the purpose of Compensatory Afforestation in lieu of proposal for diversion of 75.635 ha of forest land for development of Outer Harbour, Inner Harbour including Western Dock & mechanization of existing Operational Berth by M/s Paradip Port Trust, Odisha. Thus, in total the User Agency has deposited an amount of Rs.1,67,76,400/-(Rs.1,59,41,300/- + Rs.8,35,100/-) in the Ad-hoc CAMPA account in phase manner towards the cost of Compensatory Afforestation over 180.0 ha including maintenance for 10 years.

The Compensatory Afforestation scheme include appropriate provision of escalation cost (20%) for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.

Condition No-(xii): The user agency shall transfer online, the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land being diverted under this proposal, as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 28.03.2008, 24.04.2008 and 09.05.2008 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 202/1995 and the guidelines issued by this Ministry vide its letter No. 5-3/2007- FC dated 05.02.2009. The requisite funds shall be transferred through online portal into Ad-hoc CAMPA account of the State Concerned.

Compliance: In compliance to the above, the DFO Mangrove (Wildlife) Division Rajnagar has reported that the User Agency has deposited Rs.6,32,89,478/- which includes Rs.4,73,47,510/-towards the cost of NPV over 75.635 ha of forest land @ Rs.6,26,000/-per ha (Eco-Value Class-III, canopy density 0.1) in Ad-hoc CAMPA account No.1508219926300482 in Corporation Bank, Lodhi Road New Delhi vide UTR No.SBINR52019092100058053 dated 21.09.2019. The copy of the receipt in support of aforesaid payment is enclosed as Annexure-X.

Condition No-(xiii): At the time of payment of the Net Present Value (NPV) at the then prevailing rate, the user agency shall furnish an undertaking to pay the additional amount of NPV, if so determined, as per the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

Compliance: In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking to pay the additional amount of NPV, if so determined as per the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is enclosed as Annexure-XI.

<u>Condition No-(xiv)</u>: The user agency should ensure that the compensatory afforestation levies (CA cost, NPV, etc.) are deposited through challan generated online on web portal and deposited in appropriate bank online only. Amount deposited through other mode will not be accepted as compliance of the Stage-I clearance;

<u>Compliance:</u> In compliance to the above, all the funds deposited under this project have been transferred to the account of Ad-hoc CAMPA of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change. The details of all the payments furnished by the DFO Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar are as follows:

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking to provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the forest areas. The undertaking in this regard furnished by the User Agency is enclosed as **Annexure-XIV**.

<u>Condition No-(xviii)</u>: The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government.

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking not to change the layout plan of the proposal without the prior approval of the Central Government which is enclosed as **Annexure-XV**.

<u>Condition No-(xix)</u>: The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal and the forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government.

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking not to use the forest land for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal and the forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government which is enclosed as **Annexure-XVI**.

Condition No-(xx): No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused.

<u>Condition No-(xxii)</u>: The State Government shall complete settlement of rights, in terms of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, if any, on the Forest land to be diverted and submit the documentary evidence as prescribed by this Ministry in its letter No.11-9/1998-FC (pt.) dated 03.08.2009 read with 05.07.2013, in support thereof;

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the User Agency has reported that there is neither any type of individual nor community right over the forest land proposed for diversion and the said forest land is also in the possession of the user agency after being officially transferred for Port work since 1965.

The Collector & District Magistrate, Jagatsinghpur has issued the required certificate under Forest Right Act, 2006 in the prescribed format for the proposed forest area of 75.635 ha of Revenue Forest proposed to be diverted for development of Outer Harbour, Inner Harbour including Western Dock & Mechanization of existing Operational Berth at Paradip Port by M/s Paradip Port Trust, Odisha within the jurisdiction of village Sandhakud under Kujang of Jagatsinghpur District in Mangrove (WL) Division Rajnagar. The copy of the certificate and proceeding of Ward Sabha Resolution dated 25.04.2018 both in Odia version and English version are enclosed as Annexure-XIX.

<u>Condition No-(xxiii)</u>: The User agency shall submit the annual self-compliance report in respect of the above conditions to the State Government, concerned Regional Office and this Ministry by the end of March every year regularly.

<u>Compliance</u>: In compliance to the above, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking to submit the annual self-compliance report in respect of the above conditions to the State Government, concerned Regional Office and this Ministry by the end of March every year regularly which is enclosed as **Annexure-XX**.
