With regard to the CA land issue, it is to add that the User Agency had originally proposed the entire CA land in Raichur District while seeking Stage-I approval. However, after Stage-I approval, the User Agency has changed the CA location four times, finally to the above mentioned locations. The User Agency vide letter dated 29-08-2019 has submitted the detailed reasons for change in the CA location in the instant proposal. The primary reason has been the procedural delays in land transfers to the Forest Department and a large number

of the scattered land parcels that have been objected by this office on account of the protection and management issue along with the Government of Karnataka Order No. FEE 88 FLL 2016 dated 31-08-2019 which mandates proposing only the private non-forest lands either enclosures within forest land or adjoining to forest areas in man-animal conflict zone in Private Party FC proposals.

The finally proposed CA land locations shown above are in three land blocks situated in two villages. The one in Tumati village, though not adjoining to a notified forest area, is adjacent to the existing CA land block in Stage-II approved proposal No. FP/KA/MIN/25219/2017and thus acceptance of abovementioned 18.42 ha land now will result in enlargement of the CA land block from existing 25.07 ha to 43.49 ha. Further, the CA land in Agasanuru village is in two isolated land parcels (11.34 ha and 4.04 ha), that are not adjoining to any notified forest area or any existing CA land block in a Stage-II approved project. However, these lands are part of endangered Great Indian Bustard habitat. Some of the land parcels in this habitat have been acquired or are being acquired by the User Agency. The User Agency has proposed the smaller land parcel (4.04 ha) adjoining to another small CA land (0.96 ha) proposed in Stage-I approved proposal No. FP/KA/Others/ 27706/2017.

Under the above circumstances, it is requested to move the matter with the Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi to consider according the final (Stage-II) approval for diversion of 32.56 hectare (revised from 33.80 hectare) of forest land in Ramanamalai Block Reserve Forest, Sandur North Range, Ballari District for iron ore mining in erstwhile C-category mine (ML No.2621) of M/s Rama Rao Poal allocated through auction sale to M/s JSW Steel Ltd, Toranagallu, Ballari District under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for a period co-terminus with the mining lease granted under MMDR Act.
