Diversion of 0.0965 ha of Forest land in Sy No. 55 of Kundaragi Sub: village, Bilagi Taluk, Bagalkot District for establishment of Petrol Bunk premises in favour of Shri Gopal M, ITI sector No. 05, Navanagar- Bagalkot, Bilagi Taluk, Bagalkot District.

Online proposal [FORM-A PART-I] dated 11-06-2021 Ref: (resubmitted) of Shri Gopal M, ITI sector No. 05, Navanagar-Bagalkot, Bilagi Taluk, Bagalkot District r/w Acknowledgement uploaded online on 22-06-2021 by User Agency for having delivered the hard copy proposal to jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests and Deputy Commissioner.

- 1. Shri Gopal M, ITI sector No. 05, Navanagar- Bagalkot, Bilagi Taluk, Bagalkot District[USER AGENCY] vide Ref (1) has submitted an online proposal [FORM-A PART-I] through FC web portal seeking approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 fordiversion of 0.0965 ha of Forest land in Sy No. 55 of

Kundaragi village, Bilagi Taluk, Bagalkot District for establishment of petrol bunk premises. After uploading of Acknowledgement on 22-06-2021by User Agency for having delivered the hard copies of the proposal to jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests and Deputy Commissioner, an online communication was made by the Nodal Officer (FCA) vide Ref (2) to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bagalkot Division to process the proposal and to conduct site inspection and submit specific opinion / recommendation.

2. Location details and Component-wise breakup of forest land requirement: The details of the location of forest land and component wise requirement are given below.

- 3. Report of DCF, Bagalkot Division: The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bagalkot Division has inspected the site on 07-07-2021 and vide Ref (3) has submitted his report along with Site Inspection Report in PART-II to Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle, Belagavi. Main features of the proposal based on the reports of the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bagalkot Division r/w report of Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle and that of ICT Centre of Forest Department are summarized below:
 - a. The forest land proposed for diversion is not vulnerable to soil erosion.
 - b. The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Eco-class-IV (Tropical Thorn Forests) with a Canopy Density of up to 0.1% (Open Forest).
 - c. As per Item 4(ii) of PART-II, there are 27 trees in different girth classes. Main tree species include *Holoptelia integrifolia* and *AzadirachtaIndica*
 - d. Main wild animals reported in and around the project area include Wolf, hyena, jackals, Indian fox, porcupine, wildboar, mongoose, civet etc.
 - e. There are no rare / endangered / unique species of flora and fauna reported in and around the forest land proposed for diversion.

- f. The forest land proposed for diversion does not form part of any National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor/ Wildlife Migration Corridor, etc.
- g. The forest land proposed for diversion is not located within Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of any Protected Area notified under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- h. There are no National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor/ Wildlife Migration Corridor, etc., within one kilometre of the forest land proposed for diversion.
- i. There are no Protected/ Archaeological/ Heritage sites or Defence establishments or important monuments in the area.
- j. There is no violation reported under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- k. The requirement of forest land for the project is the bare minimum and unavoidable.
- 4. CCF, Belagavi Circle Report: The Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle has not inspected the site. However, agreeing with the recommendation made by the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bagalkot Division, the Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle has also recommended the proposal while submitting the report in PART-III vide Ref (4).
- 5. Compensatory Afforestation (CA): Present proposal involves diversion of within one hectare of forest land. The latest FC Guidelines are silent on the requirement of equivalent extent of non-forest land for the FC proposals involving diversion of forest land up to one hectare. However, Para 3.2(viii) of the immediately previous FC Guidelines exempted such proposals from requirement of raising CA. Therefore, the present FC proposal may also be exempted from the requirement of raising CA. However, Para 2.6(i) of the latest FC guidelines mentioned above mandates that the cost of plantation (including ten years maintenance) of ten times the number of trees likely to be felled or specified number of trees as may be specified in the order for diversion of forest land (subject to a minimum number of 100 plants) shall be levied from the User Agency towards Compensatory planting. As there are only 27 trees on forest land proposed for diversion the User Agency is required to pay the Compensatory Planting charges in accordance with the PCCF (HoFF) O.M. KFD/HOFF/A5-3(GFL)/34/2019-FC [E-88289] dated 19-04-2021. The User Agency has agreed to pay the Compensatory Planting charges and has submitted an Undertaking in this regard..
- 6. Net Present Value (NPV): The User Agency is required to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of forest land proposed for re-diversion as per Para 3.1 to 3.4 of the latest FC Guidelinescommunicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC

dated 28-03-2019. The User Agency has submitted an Undertakingto pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land proposed for diversion.

7. Status of RoFR compliance: In order to meet the requirement of the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 and Rules 2008 and the FC Guidelines, the User Agency has not obtained/ furnished the (copy of) requisite RoFR Certificate in FORM-II (for Non-Linear projects) issued by the jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. The User Agency has uploaded an undertaking to obtain and submit the Certificate of Compliance under the Recognition of Forest Rights Act, 2006 and Rules 2008. TheUser Agency is being informed once again to obtain the said certificate in prescribed format and submit a copy.

Taking into consideration the above facts and agreeing with recommendation of the field officers, it is requested to move the proposal with the Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change for according 'inprinciple' (Stage—I) approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 0.0965 ha of Forest land in Sy No. 55 of Kundaragi village, BilagiTaluk, Bagalkot District for establishment of Petrol Bunk premises in favour of Shri Gopal M, ITI sector No. 05, Navanagar- Bagalkot, Bilagi Taluk, Bagalkot District for a period of twenty (20) years, subject to submission of RoFR Compliance Certificate in FORM-II (for Non-Linear projects) and the conditions listed in Annexure 'A'.

The hard copy of the proposal along with the relevant documents in 3 sets is submitted herewith for further needful. The present status of the proposal obtained from the web-portal is also appended for necessary action.

ANNEXURE-A

- 1. The legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged and it shall continue to be forest land.
- 2. The User Agency shall pay the applicable Net Present Value (NPV), Compensatory, Plantation cost of extraction of trees, land lease rent and any other levies as per the conditions of approval.
- 3. The User Agency shall demarcate the lease area in the manner specified at the time of approval at its own cost.
- 4. The lessee shall not sub-lease, mortgage & hypothecate the forest area.
- 5. The Lessee shall provide signages in appropriate dimensions and nature along the proposed Petrol Bunk premises within forest limits for sensitization of general public towards the forest, wildlife and environmental issues in consultation with the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests.
- 6. The leased out area should be used for the purpose for which it is granted. In case the land is not used for the stipulated purpose within two years or when it is no longer needed for the stipulated purpose, the area would stand resumed to the Forest Department.
- 7. No change in Land Use Plan on forest land shall be done except with prior approval of Government of India under FC Act 1980.
- 8. The application for renewal of the lease in the prescribed form and manner shall be submitted at least six months prior to the expiry of forest lease. In case no renewal is sought, the Lessee shall hand over the lease.
- 9. No residential or commercial buildings shall be permitted in the forest area proposed for diversion.
- 10. No crushing / breaking of stones or labour camp shall be allowed on forest land and all waste / debris generated shall be scientifically disposed off outside the forest area.
- 11. Any damage to forest area because of implementation of the proposal shall be compensated by the Lessee. The extent of damage shall be assessed by the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 12. The Lessee shall ensure that no avoidable harm is caused to the fauna and flora in and around the proposed area.
- 13. In case, any violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Forest Act, 1963 & Rules, 1969 or other relevant Acts/Rules is reported during the lease period, the lease will be liable for forfeiture under Section 82 of Karnataka Forest Act, 1963. The Chief Conservator of Forests / Deputy Conservator of Forests concerned are authorized to take necessary action in this regard.
- 14. The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to any other clearances necessary under the prevailing statutes.

15. The User Agency shall also abide by other conditions those may be imposed by the Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) before or after the approval.
