

**Proposal for diversion of 4.446 ha. Forest land under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 in favour of Executive Engineer, Public Works Division, Allapalli for Improvement/Upgradation and Maintenance of Hedri (SH-381) to Bande Road (VR-91 and ODR-62) in Etapalli Tehsil of District Gadchiroli in the State of Maharashtra.**

**Specific Recommendation of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Maharashtra State (Head of Forest Force) Maharashtra State, Nagpur with regards to acceptance or otherwise of the proposal supported by reasons.**

1.0 Proposal is for diversion of 4.446 ha. forest land under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 in favour of Executive Engineer, Public Works Division, Allapalli for Improvement/Upgradation and Maintenance of Hedri (SH-381) to Bande Road (VR-91 and ODR-62) in Etapalli Tehsil of District Gadchiroli in the State of Maharashtra.

2.0 The details of the forest land proposed for diversion are as under:-

3.00 The proposal has been initiated by the Executive Engineer, Public Works Division, Allapalli for seeking approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The User Agency has certified that the forest land admeasuring 4.446 ha is the minimum demand for the project. The existing road has very poor geometry, congestion leading to traffic jams. Therefore the User Agency has decided to undertake Improvement/Upgradation and Maintenance of Hedri (SH-381) to Bande Road (VR-91 and ODR-62) in Etapalli Tehsil of District Gadchiroli. Because of the project, over all road safety situation will be improved. There will be decrease in road traffic accidents immediately after implementation of the project. Summarily, widening of the project road will have following benefits.

- a) The proposed project is rehabilitation and up-gradation of existing two lane alignment to four lane configuration.
- b) There is no suitable alternatives non-forest land to construct the road as the proposed rehabilitation is along the existing road.
- c) Earthwork cutting and banking is minimum.
- d) Minimum numbers of trees are affected.
- e) Road gradients are suitable for traffic.

- 5.3 Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt.3/12/2018 has issued guidelines regarding compliance of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Right) Act, 2006. As per these guidelines:-

*'Accordingly, it is clarified that within the time period stipulated for compliance of Stage I condition, Deputy Commissioner shall complete the process of compliance of FRA (including forwarding its findings to be concerned CF), hence for the purpose of the MoEF & CC, as per the provisions under the Forest (Conservation) amendment rules, 2016 the compliance under FRA is not required for consideration of in-principle*


**approval. This has to be furnished by the State Government for consideration of the proposal by the Ministry for final approval'.**

Hence, the user agency has given an undertaking regarding the compliance under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been applied and is under process and shall be submitted before in-principle approval.



- 6.0 As per clause 2.6 of the Handbook under the FCA, 1980. The Provision for plantation of specified number of trees by way of CA in certain cases is as under:-
- (i) The cost of plantation (including ten years maintenance) of ten times the number of trees likely to be felled or specified number of trees as may be specified in the order for diversion of forest land (subject to a minimum no. of 100 plants), shall be levied from the user agency towards compensatory afforestation.
- (f) Diversion of forest land upto 5.00 ha. in accordance with the General Approvals granted for activities carried out by Government Department in notified LWE Districts.
- 6.1 In the instant case the number of trees likely to be felled during the implementation of the project is 3200. Therefore, the User Agency shall have to defray the cost for 320 plants including 10 years maintenance.
- 7.0 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bhamragad Forest Division, Alapali and Chief Conservator of Forest (T), Gadchiroli have recommended the proposal for diversion of 4.446 ha. of Forest land.
- 8.00 **In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions: –**
- 8.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 8.2 Forest land will be handed over only after required non-forest land for the project is handed over to the User Agency.
- 8.3 As per clause 2.6 of the Handbook under the FCA, 1980. The Provision for plantation of specified number of trees by way of CA in certain cases is as under:-
- (i) The cost of plantation (including ten years maintenance) of ten times the number of trees likely to be felled or specified number of trees as may be specified in the order for diversion of forest land (subject to a minimum no. of 100 plants), shall be levied from the user agency towards compensatory afforestation.
- (f) Diversion of forest land upto 5.00 ha. in accordance with the General Approvals granted for activities carried out by Government Department in notified LWE Districts.

- 8.4 In the instant case the number of trees likely to be felled during the implementation of the project is 837. Therefore, the User Agency shall have to defray the cost for 8370 plants including 10 years maintenance.
- 8.5 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.
- 8.6 NPV:-
- a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 4.446 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No.5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II), dated 18/09/2003 as well as letter No.5-2/2006-FC, dated 03/10/2006 and 5-3/2007-FC, dated 05/02/2009 in this regard.
  - b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- 8.7 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 8.8 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<http://parivesh.nic.in/>).
- 8.9 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 8.10 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 8.11 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 8.12 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 8.13 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 8.14 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.

- 8.15 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 8.16 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 8.17 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 8.18 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
- 8.19 It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals:
- The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
  - Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
  - Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
  - Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 8.20 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 8.21 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 8.22 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.

8.17 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.

8.18 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.

8.19 It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals:

(a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.

(b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.

- (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
- (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 8.20 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 8.21 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 8.22 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
- 8.23 The compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (<https://parivesh.nic.in/>)

9.00 It is therefore, requested that Government of India may kindly be moved for approving the proposal for diversion of 4.446 ha. Forest land under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 in favour of Executive Engineer, Public Works Division, Allapalli for Improvement/Upgradation and Maintenance of Hedri (SH-381) to Bande Road (VR-91 and ODR-62) in Etapalli Tehsil of District Gadchiroli in the State of Maharashtra under section 2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
