As per the Site Inspection Report of Conservator of Forests, Northern Assam Circle,

Tezpur the proposed area is no record of rare/endangered species of flora & fauna are

found in the area, but presence of wild animals including elephant cannot be ruled out in

surrounding forest areas. No any protected archaeological/heritage site, defence

establishment or any other important monument located in the proposed site. The proposed

forest area falls within the notified Elephant Reserve. But the proposed area is a hill top

barren area and will not cause much impact if it is diverted and also the proposed area is

around 600mtr. away from the NH. There is a huge demand for minor minerals to carry out

construction of roads (National & State Highway) and various development activities of

the state as well as Government Infrastructure projects.

In view of the above, the forest diversion proposal of 5.11Ha. of forest land for operation

of Bheleuguri Stone Mahal in Doboka Reserved Forest under Nagaon Division in favour of

Md. Kamal Ahmed is hereby recommended subject to the following conditions imposed by

the Chief Wildlife Warden, Assam:

1. To adopt a comprehensive conservation measures to mitigate HEC. These should be

funded from the collected cess of District Mineral Foundation Trust (DMFT).

2. A complete restoration plan should be worked out and executed from the cess of Mines

& Mineral Developments Restoration & Rehabilitation (MMDRR) Fund.

3. Plans may be drawn up by the DFO concerned accordingly within 6 months of operation

of the Mahal to be duly approved by the Chief Wildlife Warden.
