Detailed opinion and specific recommendation of the State Forest Department for acceptance of otherwise of the proposal with remarks.

- NHAI's proposals for diversion of 63.615 ha. of forest land for construction
 of Four-laning of existing Goa-Karnataka Section of NH-4A in the State of
 Goa Anmod Ghat -Panaji Section received from Public Work Department,
 Govt. of Goa has been examined and recommended for following reasons:
 - i) This is an important public utility project of infrastructure development for the State as well as the Country
 - ii) The project aims for improvement of traffic movement from neighbouring States.
 - iii) Proposed alignment meets the operational requirement of the project with minimum forest land involved as compared to other alternative routes.
- 2. Further, following conditions on the User Agency are proposed for consideration of competent authority, while granting approval:
 - i) to take suitable measures and create sufficient numbers of underpasses & overbridges in the alignment for safe animal passage at locations identified by the Forest Department as per guidelines of Wildlife Institute of India.
 - ii) to take adequate measures for safety of wild animals during construction phase in consultation with CWLW.
 - iii) to place sufficient numbers of signages/ signboards in the area falling within the forest, National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary for cautioning traffic at vulnerable places and corridors for minimising conflict from movement of wild animals.
 - iv) shall carry out all recommendations prescribed in the EIA Report.
 - v) in addition to cost of mandatory CA & NPV obligations, user agency will pay 3% of the total project cost to the State Forest Department for undertaking activities/ measures for mitigation of various impacts of diversion of forest land on forest, ecology and wildlife of the area.
