13. Specific recommendations of the DCF	This is the bare minimum forest land proposed for the
	project. The amount realized from the user agency in the form of NPV shall be utilized for conservation, protection, and management of forest in this division. The green belt will be created through the amount realized from the user agency as Compensatory Afforestation work and it will help in increasing the green cover. The proposed area involves diversion of 98.05 Ha in Gaya Forest Division, Gaya. This is the bare minimum of forest land required for the project and has no other alternative to bye-pass. Diversion of this forest land area for the project (Non-Forestry activity) may not much affect the local flora of the area. The User Agency has not violated the prescribed provisions of the Act till the date of inspection. In light of the above mentioned facts and keeping the cognizance that Rajgir, Gaya and Bodh Gaya which are prominent tourist places with high footfalls and high density of resident population experience acute drinking water shortage in the months from April to July, I recommend positively for the approval of this proposal. It will also lead to improved water regime in the nearby areas benefiting the adjoining forests, wild animals and beople living in and around the forest areas. Therefore this proposal for diversion of forest land may be approved with necessary conditions and directions.
