Diversion of 3.61 ha of Forest Land in Chilandvadi RF, Muguru SF and Bilikal SF for Providing Drinking Water Supply for Kodihalli and 298 Habitations under DBOT in Kanakapura Taluk of Ramanagara District in favour of the Executive Engineer, Rural Drinking Water and Sanitation Department, Ramanagara. **PROPOSAL No. FP/KA/WATER/39356/2019[FORM-A]**

- 1. The Executive Engineer, Rural Drinking Water and Sanitation Department, Ramanagara [USER AGENCY] vide Ref (1) has (re)submitted an online proposal [FORM-A PART-I] through FC Web Portal seeking approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 fordiversion of 3.61 ha of Forest Land in Chilandvadi RF, Muguru SF and Bilikal SF for Providing Drinking Water Supply for Kodihalli and 298 Habitations under DBOT in Kanakapura Taluk of Ramanagara District. After acceptance of the proposal by Nodal Officer (FCA) for further processing, the User Agency has delivered the hard copies of the proposal to Deputy Conservator of Forests, Cauvery Wildlife Divisionand Deputy Commissioner, ChamarajanagaraDistrict and also Bannerughatta National Park Division, Ramanaraga Divisionand Deputy Commissioner, Ramanagara District has uploaded the Acknowledgment on the web portal on30-06-2020. Accordingly, an online communication was made by Nodal Officer (FCA) vide Ref (2) to the Deputy Conservator(s) of Forests, Cauvery Wildlife, Bannerughatta National Parkand Deputy Conservator of Forests, Ramanara Division for further processing of the proposal under FC Act.
 - 2. Location details and Component-wise breakup of forest land requirement: The details of location and component-wise requirement of the forest land are given below.

- 3. DCF, RamanagaraDivision Report: The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Ramanagara Division, Ramanagara has vide Ref (3) reported that the site has been inspected by him on 26-02-2021 and reported that the said project does not passing through the any forest land of the Ramanagara Division.
- 4. DCF,Bannerughatta National ParkDivision Report: The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bannerughatta National Park Division has inspected the site on 22-02-2021and vide Ref (4) has submitted his report along with recommendation in PART-II to the Conservator of Forests, Benagaluru Circle. Main features of the proposal based upon the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Benagaluru Circle and that of ICT Centre of Forest Department are summarized below.
 - a. The forest land proposed for diversion is a Gentle Slope not prone to soil erosion.
 - b. The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Eco-class III (Tropical Dry Deciduous Forests) with Open Forest (Canopy Density of <0.4).</p>
 - c. As per Item 4(ii) of PART-II, there are no trees in the forest land proposed for diversion.
 - d. Major wild animal present in and around the project area is the Elephant, Indian Gour, Leopard, Jackel, Wild dog, deer, Sambar, Wild boar Etc.
 - e. There are rare / endangered / unique species of flora and fauna reported in and around the forest land proposed for diversion.
 - f. The forest land proposed for diversion forms a part of Bannerughatta National Park which is also an elephant corridor.

- g. The forest land proposed for diversion is located within Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of Bannerughatta National Park. Which is a Protected Area notified under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- h. There are no Protected/ Archaeological/ Heritage Sites/ Defence establishments located in the proposed area.
- i. The forest area proposed for diversion is the bare minimum and unavoidable.
- j. There is no violation reported under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 5. DCF, Cauvery WildlifeDivision Report: The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Cauvery Wildlife Division has inspected the site on 28-07-2020 and 27-10-2020 vide Ref (5) has submitted his report along with recommendation in PART-II to the Conservator of Forests, Chamarajanaraga Circle. Main features of the proposal based upon the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Cauvery Wildlife Division report r/w report of Conservator of Forests, Chamarajanaraga Circle and that of ICT Centre of Forest Department are summarized below.
 - **a.** The forest land proposed for diversion is a Gentle Slope not prone to soil erosion.
 - b. The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Eco-class III (Tropical Dry Deciduous Forests) with Dense Forest (Canopy Density of <0.6).
 - c. As per Item 4(ii) of PART-II, there are 245 trees in the forest land proposed for diversion. Main species include *Albezziaamara*, *Chloroxylonswietenia*, *Zizyphusjujuba*, *Sapindusemarginatus*, *Acacia catechu*, *Azadirachtaindica*, *Hardwickiabinnata*, *Tamarindusindica*, *Grewiatiliaefolia*, *Ficusmysorensis etc.*,
 - d. Major wild animal present in and around the project area is the Elephant, Leopard, Jackal, Wild dog, etc.
 - e. There are rare / endangered / unique species of flora and fauna reported in and around the forest land proposed for diversion.
 - f. The forest land proposed for diversion doesform the part of Cauvery Wildlife Sanctuary.
 - g. The forest land proposed for diversion is located within Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of Cauvery Wildlife Sanctuary which is a Protected Area notified under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
 - h. There are no Protected/ Archaeological/ Heritage Sites/ Defence establishments located in the proposed area.
 - i. The forest area proposed for diversion is the bare minimum and unavoidable.

- j. There is no violation reported under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 6. CCF, Bengaluru Circle Report: The Chief Conservator of Forests, Bengaluru Circle has not inspected the site personally. However, agreeing with the recommendation made by the Deputy Conservator(s) of Forests, Ramanagara Division and Bennurughatta Nationala Park Division, the Chief Conservator of Forests, Bengaluru Circle has also recommended the proposal. Specific comments of the Chief Conservator of Forests, Bengaluru Circle are mentioned in PART-III of the proposal cited Ref (6) above
- 7. CCF, Chamarajanagara Circle Report: The Chief Conservator of Forests, Chamarajanagar Circle has inspected the site on 22-03-2021. Agreeing with the recommendation of the Deputy Conservator of Forests Cauvery Wildlife Division, the Chief Conservator of Forests, Chamarajanagar Circle has also recommended the proposal. Specific comments of the Chief Conservator of Forests, Chamarajanagar Circle are mentioned in PART-III of the proposal cited at Ref (7) above.
- 8. Net Present Value (NPV): The User Agency is required to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of forest land proposed for diversion as per Para 3.1 to 3.4 of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. The User Agency has uploaded/submitted an Undertaking agreeing to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land proposed for diversion.
- 9. Compensatory Afforestation (CA): In accordance with the provisions of Para 2.5(i)(a) of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019, the User Agency is required to provide the non-forest land. equivalent to the area proposed for diversion for Compensatory Afforestation purpose and the Compensatory Afforestation can be raised and maintained at the cost of User Agency. Accordingly, the User agency has identified a gross area of 4.37 hectare of Non-Forest Landin Veerasandra Village Sy No. 13. Uyyamballi Hobli, Kanakapuara Taluk, Ramanagara District for raising CA. The User Agency has uploaded the CA related information (KML file and Maps) online in PART-Iof the proposal. The CA related documents (Topo Map, Geo-referenced Map along with GPS readings of all corners, the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Cauvery Wildlife Division, Kollegal has provided CA Suitability Certificate dated 08-12-2020 and CA Scheme are enclosed herewith. The User Agency has also uploaded /submitted an Undertaking to pay the Compensatory Afforestation charges.
- 10. Status of RoFR compliance: With regard to compliance of the provisions of Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Rights) Act 2006 and Rules 2008, the User Agency has not furnished the requisite Certificate in FORM-II (for Hybrid projects) issued by the jurisdictional

Deputy Commissioner as per the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. However, the User Agency has submitted an Undertaking dated 06-05-2019 to obtain the required Certificate from the Deputy Commissioner and submit it. **The User Agency is being informed again to obtain the said certificate in prescribed format and submit the same.**

In light of the facts stated above, it is requested to move the proposal with the Government of India for according 'in-principle' (Stage–I) approval for diversion of 3.61 ha of Forest Land in Chilandvadi RF, Muguru SF and Bilikal SF for Providing Drinking Water Supply for Kodihalli and 298 Habitations under DBOT in Kanakapura Taluk of Ramanagara District in favour of the Executive Engineer, Rural Drinking Water and Sanitation Department, Ramanagara for a period of 20 years subject to submission of FRA Certificate in FORM-I (for Linear projects) and further subject to the conditions appended in Annexure 'A'.

The hard copy of the proposal along with the relevant documents in 3 sets is submitted herewith for further needful. The present status of the proposal obtained from the FC web portal is also appended for information.

ANNEXURE 'A'

- 1. The legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged and it shall continue to be forest land.
- 2. The User Agency shall pay the applicable Net Present Value (NPV), Compensatory Plantation cost of extraction of trees (if any), land lease rent and any other levies as per the conditions of approval.
- 3. The User Agency shall demarcate the lease area in the manner specified at the time of approval at its own cost.
- 4. The lessee shall not sub-lease, mortgage & hypothecate the forest area.
- 5. The Lessee shall provide signages in appropriate dimensions and nature on both sides of the transmission line within forest limits for sensitisation of general public towards the forest, wildlife and environmental issues in consultation with the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests
- 6. The leased out area should be used for the purpose for which it is granted. In case the land is not used for the stipulated purpose within two years or when it is no longer needed for the stipulated purpose, the area would stand resumed to the Forest Department.
- 7. No change in Land Use Plan on forest land shall be done except with prior approval of Government of India under FC Act 1980.
- 8. The application for renewal of the lease in the prescribed form and manner shall be submitted at least six months prior to the expiry of forest lease. In case no renewal is sought, the Lessee shall hand over the lease.
- 9. No residential or commercial buildings shall be permitted in the forest area proposed for diversion.
- 10. No crushing / breaking of stones or labour camp shall be allowed on forest land and all waste / debris generated shall be scientifically disposed off outside the forest area.
- 11. Any damage to forest area because of implementation of the proposal shall be compensated by the Lessee. The extent of damage shall be assessed by the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 12. The Lessee shall ensure that no avoidable harm is caused to the fauna and flora in and around the proposed area.
- 13. In case, any violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Forest Act, 1963 & Rules, 1969 or other relevant Acts/Rules is reported during the lease period, the lease will be liable for forfeiture under Section 82 of Karnataka Forest Act, 1963. The Chief Conservator of Forests / Deputy Conservator of Forests concerned are authorized to take necessary action in this regard.
- 14. The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to any other clearances necessary under the prevailing statutes.
- 15. The User Agency shall also abide by other conditions those may be imposed by the Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) before or after the approval.
