13	Specific recommendation of the DCF for acceptance or otherwise of the proposal with reasons.	The road is essential for strategic defence purpose to reach Indo-China border for patrolling and necessary guarding. Road is also required for better management of Dibang Wildlife Sanctuary as vast area of 4149.0 sqkm is inaccessible. This will also help in exploration of the area as most part of the area is still unexplored. The presence of road would also reduce movement of people on foot inside Sanctuary for patrolling the borders. It will reduce biotic pressure on Forest because of availability of resources till last defence camps. Hence, it is recommended.
