 online proposal [FORM-A PART-I] vide Ref (1) on 30-07-2021 approval under the
 Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 0.341 hectare of forest land in Sy. No 5

Uttarahalli Manavarthe kaval Village, Ullal Hobli, Sy. No 170 Badamanavarthe kaval Village, Kengeri Hobli, Bangalore South Taluk, Bangalore District for Laying of MS Pipes of 2101mm Dia and 1901 mm Dia to Facilitate the Drinking Water Supply to Bangalore Urban Areas (City Trunk Main Along Western Route of CP10). The same was accepted by Nodal Officer (FCA) on 13-08-2021 for further processing. After receiving the Acknowledgement online on 23-08-2021 for having delivered the hard copies of the proposal by the User Agency to the jurisdictional Deputy Conservators of Forests & Deputy Commissioners, the online link was forwarded by this office vide Ref (2) dated: 24-08-2021 to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bangalore Urban Division for field verification and further processing under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

Location details: Location details of the forest land proposed for diversion are given below.

DCF, Bangalore Urban Division Report: The Deputy Conservator of Forests Bangalore Urban Division has inspected the spot on 04-07-2022 and has submitted the Site Inspection Report; the details of the area along with the recommendation in the form of PART-II of the proposal vide Ref (3) to Chief Conservator of Forests, Bangalore Circle. Main features of the proposal based on the DCF Bangalore Urban Report r/w the report of the CCF, Bangalore Circle and that of the ICT Centre of Forest Department are as follows.

- a. The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Eco-Class-III (Tropical dry deciduous Forests) with low Dense Forest (0.25 canopy density).
- b. The proposed area falls within the Minor and State forest.
- c. No trees to be felled on the forest land proposed for diversion.
- d. No wild animals present in and around the project area.[Note: The entry made in Item 8(i) and (v) may be read accordingly.]
- e. There are no other rare / endangered / unique species of flora and fauna reported around the forest area proposed for diversion.
- f. As per the DCF, Bangalore Urban report, the forest land proposed for diversion does not fall within the Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ), Wildlife Sanctuary.

- g. There are no Protected/ Archaeological/ Heritage Sites/defence establishment located in the proposed area.
- h. The forest area proposed for diversion is the bare minimum and unavoidable.
- i. There is no violation reported under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

CCF, Bangalore Circle Report: The Chief Conservator of Forests, Bangalore Circle has vide Ref (4) has submitted Site Inspection Report in PART-III online. Agreeing with the recommendation made by the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bangalore Urban Division, the Chief Conservator of Forests, Bangalore Circle has also recommended the proposal.

Net Present Value (NPV): The User Agency is required to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of forest land proposed for diversion as per Para 3.1 to 3.4 of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. The User Agency has submitted an Undertaking to pay the charges towards Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land proposed for diversion.

Compensatory Afforestation (CA): The forest area proposed for diversion is less than one hectare and is governed by Para 3.2 (viii) (b) of the Government of India FC Guidelines (old version, as the new version is silent in this regard), which provides exemption from raising Compensatory Afforestation (CA). However, the Para 2.6(i) of the latest FC Guidelines mandates planting of ten times the number of trees likely to be felled (subject to a minimum of 100 plants). Even though there are no trees on forest land reported in Item 4(ii) of PART-II of the proposal, the User Agency will have to make payment in accordance with the O.M. issued vide E-office File No. KFD/HOFF/A53(GFL)/34/2019-FC [E-88289] dated 24-05-2022 of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) for any tree felling required for the purpose of execution of the project. The User Agency has submitted an Undertaking dated 22-04-2021 to pay the Compensatory Plantation charges.

Status of RoFR compliance: With regard to compliance of the provisions of Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Rights) Act 2006 and Rules 2008, the User Agency has not furnished the requisite Certificate in FORM-I (for Linear projects) issued by the jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. The User Agency is being informed again to obtain the said certificate in prescribed format and submit a copy. The User Agency has submitted an Undertaking dated 22-04-2021 to submit the FRA certificate.

Under the above circumstances and agreeing with recommendation of the field officers, it is requested to consider according 'in-principle' (Stage-I) approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 0.341 hectare of forest land in Sy. No 5 Uttarahalli Manavarthe kaval Village, Ullal Hobli, Sy. No 170 Badamanavarthe kaval Village, Kengeri Hobli, Bangalore South Taluk, Bangalore District for Laying of MS Pipes of 2101mm Dia and 1901 mm Dia to Facilitate the Drinking Water Supply to Bangalore Urban Areas (City Trunk Main Along Western

Route of CP10) for a period of Thirty (30) years and subject to the production of RoFR certificate in FORM-I as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019 and also subject to conditions appended in Annexure 'A'.

The hard copy of the proposal along with the relevant documents in 3 sets is submitted herewith for further needful action.

ANNEXURE 'A'

- The legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged and it shall continue to be the forest land.
- The User Agency shall pay the applicable Net Present Value (NPV), land lease rent and any other levies as per the conditions of approval.
- The User Agency shall demarcate the lease area in the manner specified at the time of approval at its own cost.
- 4. The lessee shall not sub-lease, mortgage & hypothecate the forest area.
- The leased out area should be used for the purpose for which it is granted. In case, the land is not used for the stipulated purpose within two years or when it is no longer needed for the stipulated purpose, the area would stand resumed to the Forest Department.
- The application for renewal of the lease in the prescribed form and manner shall be submitted at least six months prior to the expiry of forest lease. In case, no renewal is sought, the Lessee shall hand over the lease.
- No residential or commercial buildings shall be permitted in the forest area proposed for diversion.
- No crushing / breaking of stones or labour camp shall be allowed inside forest area and all waste / debris generated shall be scientifically disposed off outside the forest area.
- Any damage to forest area because of implementation of the project shall be compensated by the Lessee. The extent of damage shall be assessed by the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 10. The Lessee shall ensure that no avoidable harm is caused to the fauna and flora in and around the proposed area.
- No change in Land Use Plan shall be done unless prior approval of Government of India under FC Act is obtained.
- 12. In case, any violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Forest Act, 1963 & Rules, 1969 or other relevant Acts/Rules is reported during the lease period, the lease will be liable for forfeiture under Section 82 of Karnataka Forest Act, 1963. The Chief Conservator of Forests and/or Deputy Conservator of Forests concerned are authorized to take necessary action in this regard.
- 13. The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to any other clearances necessary under the prevailing statutes.
- 14. The User Agency shall also abide by other conditions those may be imposed by the Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) before or after the approval.
