Project Director, National Highway Authority of India, PIU-Thane has submitted proposal for diversion of 14.613 ha. forest land in favour of NHAI for construction of Eight laning of existing four lane Vadape to Thane from Km 539.202 to Km 563.000 section of NH-3 (New NH-848) in the State of Maharashtra to be executed on Hybrid Annuity mode (HAM) in Taluka Bhiwandi, Village Vadape, Dhamangaon, Yewai, Elkunde, Sonale, Pimplas, Pimpalner, Ovali, in the State of Maharashtra. The existing four lane bypass road Vadape to Thane is proposed to be up-graded to eight lane road looking at increased traffic on existing four lane Mumba-Agra National Highway and likely increase of traffic due to proposed six lane Samrudhi Mahamarg of Mumbai-Nagpur to be connected a few Kilometers after Vadape.

- 2.5 The total non forest involved in the project is 110.45 ha.
- 2.6 The site inspection report of the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Thane Forest Division, Thane is enclosed on page no. 157 to 158.
- 2.6 No alternate alignment is possible and the forest land required is the minimum.
- 2.7 The area belongs to Eco-value class-I having density is below 0.2 (Open Forest).
- 2.8 There are 132 trees of various species and trees is involved in implementation of the Project. The Girth wise break up is as under:-

- 2.9 The area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.
- 2.10 Proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.
- 2.11 There is violation of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980. The User Agency has already violation done at the time of 2 lanning of project in the year 1980-1982 & 4 laning of project in the year 1998-2003 by the National Highway Division. The violation report enclosed on page no.199 to 203.
- 2.12 Proposed project is 8.7 km from Sanjay Gandhi National Park and 5.5 Km from Tungareshwar Wildlife Sanctuary. The Tungareshwar Wildlife Sanctuary has been notified on 24/10/2003 and Sanjay Gandhi National Park has been notified on 16/01/1996. The notification is enclosed on file page No. 17 to 28.
- 2.13 The non-forest area covered under the project is not under the provision of Maharashtra Private Forest (Acquisition) Act 1975 by virtue of application of Section 35 of Indian Forest Act 1927 and are not recognized as deemed reserved forest as well as not included in the area identified as "forest" as per dictionary meaning of forest as intimated to the expert committee appointed under interim judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 12/12/1996.



- 2.14 Proposed Compensatory Afforestation over 30.00 ha. degraded Forest land (i) Area 8.81 ha. in Gut No.359, at Village Vaijapur in Taluka Parla (ii) Area 10.87 ha. in Gut No.376, at Village Vaijapur, in Taluka Parla (iii) Area 5.76 ha. in Gut No.358, at Village Vaijapur, in Taluka Parla (iv) Area 4.56 ha. in Gut No. 352 at Village Vaijapur, in Taluka Parla and it is contiguous, suitable for afforestation and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances.
- 2.15 The User Agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Net Present Value
- 2.16 The User Agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Compensatory Afforestation.
- 2.17 The User Agency has submitted an undertaking regarding the compliance under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been applied and is under process and shall be submitted before in-principle approval as per Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt.3/12/2018.
- 2.18 The User Agency has certified that Environmental Clearance is not required in the light of notification of Government of India.
- 2.19 The cross section map is enclosed herewith on file page No.42 to 61.
- 2.20 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Thane Forest Division, Thane and Chief Conservator of Forest (T), Thane have recommended the proposal for diversion of 14.613 ha. of forest land.

**3.00 The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) Maharashtra State, Nagpur has recommended the proposal for sanction on the following conditional grounds. The recommendation letter of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) , Maharashtra State, Nagpur, is enclosed on**

- 3.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 3.2 Forest land will be handed over only after required non-forest land for the project is handed over to the User Agency.

**3.3 Compensatory Afforestation :-**

- a) Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 30.00 ha. degraded Forest land (i) Area 8.81 ha. in Gut No.359, at Village Vaijapur in Taluka Parla (ii) Area 10.87 ha. in Gut No.376, at Village Vaijapur, in Taluka Parla (iii) Area 5.76 ha. in Gut No.358, at Village Vaijapur, in Taluka Parla (iv) Area 4.56 ha. in Gut No. 352 at Village Vaijapur, in Taluka Parla at the cost of the user agency. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided.
- 3.4 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.

**3.5 NPV:-**

- a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 14.613 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No.5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II), dated 18/09/2003




as well as letter No.5-2/2006-FC, dated 03/10/2006 and 5-3/2007-FC, dated 05/02/2009 in this regard.

- b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- 3.6 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 3.7 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<http://parivesh.nic.in/>)
- 3.8 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector.
- 3.9 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 3.10 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 3.11 It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals
  - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
  - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
  - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
  - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 3.12 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 3.13 User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act,1986, if applicable.
- 3.14 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 3.15 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- 3.16 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 3.17 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 3.18 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 3.19 The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less.
- 3.20 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.

- 3.21 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 3.22 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 3.23 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.

  - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
  - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
  - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 2.12 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 2.13 User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act,1986, if applicable.
- 2.14 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 2.15 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- 2.16 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.



- 2.17 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 2.18 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 2.19 The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less.
- 2.20 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
- 2.21 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 2.22 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 2.23 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
