

Site Inspection Report – Chief Conservator of Forests

Inspected the site on 01-10-2019 at 5 PM along with Range Officer, Pattikkad Sri.T.S.Mathew and his staff.

The First site is at the mouth of the Tunnel Exit, measuring approximately 350 meters in length along the rock face and has an average width of 8 meters (the exact measurements are shown in the sketch annexed herewith).

To the North of the proposed site is land already diverted for road, to the South - Reserved Forests, East - Reserved Forests and West - already diverted land.

The area is adjacent to the newly formed road and being so, there is no way proposed diversion could have been done elsewhere. Therefore it is a necessity that the proposed site is located where it is presently mentioned.

The second site is 1994 Teak Plantation at Pambatty. The boundaries of the site are to the North - diverted land, to the East and West - private land, to the south – Reserved Forests. Trees are required to be felled from Reserved Forests (a total of 67 trees in Pambatty and 43 trees in Kuthiran area), the detailed list of which is as indicated in the Thrissur Divisional Forest Officer's report.

The requirement of forest land as proposed by user agency is unavoidable and is the barest minimum for the project and therefore recommended.
