Site Inspection Report

Site Inspection on the Proposal for Diversion of Forest Land **4.86 hectares** for road widening was done on the 11th May, 2015 by the undersigned. The Project Proposal is found to be well within 10 Km of the Narpuh Wildlife Sanctuary. The requirement of Forest land as proposed by the user agency in Col. 2 of Part – I involves no forest diversion from the Narpuh Wildlife Sanctuary except from unclassed Forest falling under deemed private forest land (under the control and management of the Jaintia Hills Autonomous District Council). The Project proposal is within the existing Right of Way (i.e. 7 m Existing Black topping between 141.500 Km-145 Km and 7-10 m between 160 KM-167.100 Km) of the existing road of NH-44. Enumeration and valuation of trees species was done as per rules/regulation in force. There is no protected archaeological/heritage site/defence establishment located in the area. Presently no works in violations of the Forest Conservation Act 1980 is taking place. Therefore, the project is recommended for its acceptance subject to observance of applicable rules/regulation and Forest Conservation Act, 1980.
