- 1. The Assistant Executive Engineer, PRED Sub Division, Bagalkot Taluk and District[USER AGENCY] vide Ref (1) has resubmitted an online proposal [FORM-A PART-I] through FC web portal seeking approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 0.4867 ha of forest land in

Achanur village, Bagalkot Taluk and District for Improvement of Achanur hill approach road in favour of Assistant Executive Engineer, Panchayath Raj Engineering Division (PRED) Sub Division, Bagalkot Taluk and District. After uploading of Acknowledgement on 28-04-2022by User Agency for having delivered the hard copies of the proposal to jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests and Deputy Commissioner, an online communication was made by the Nodal Officer (FCA) vide Ref (2) to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, BelagaviDivision to process the proposal and to submit specific opinion / recommendation.

2. Location details and Component-wise breakup of forest land requirement: The details of the location of forest land and component wise requirement are given below.

- **3. Report of DCF, Bagalkot Division:** The Deputy Conservator of Forests, BagalkotDivision has inspected the site on 08-05-2022 and vide Ref (3) has submitted his report along with Site Inspection Report in PART-II to Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle, Belagavi. Main features of the proposal based on the reports of the Deputy Conservator of Forests, BagalkotDivision r/w report of Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle and that of ICT Centre of Forest Department are summarized below.
 - a. The forest area proposed for diversion is having significant degree of slope which is vulnerable to erosion. The User Agency has to make Proper drainage system in the proposed area to effectively control soil erosion
 - b. The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Ecoclass-IV (Southern Thorn Forests) with a Canopy Density of up to 0.1 % (Open Forest).
 - c. As per Item 4(ii) of PART-II of the proposal, there are no trees on the forest land proposed for diversion.
 - d. Main wild animals reported in and around the project area include Indian Hare, Mongoose, Wild Boar and Indian Peafowl etc.

- e. There are no rare / endangered / unique species of flora and fauna reported in and around the forest land proposed for diversion.
- f. The forest land proposed for diversion does not form part of any National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor/ Wildlife Migration Corridor, etc.
- g. The forest land proposed for diversion is not located within Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of any Protected Area notified under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- h. There are no National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor/ Wildlife Migration Corridor, etc., within one kilometre of the forest land proposed for diversion.
- i. There are no Protected/ Archaeological/ Heritage sites or Defence establishments or important monuments in the area.
- j. There is no violation reported under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- k. The requirement of forest land for the project is the bare minimum and unavoidable.
- 4. CCF, Belagavi Circle Report: The Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle has agreed with the report of Deputy Conservator of Forests, Bagalkot Division. The Chief Conservator of Forests, Belagavi Circle vide Ref (4) has submitted his report in PART-III and has also recommended the proposal.
- 5. Net Present Value (NPV): The user agency is required to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of forest land proposed for diversion as per para 3.1 to 3.4 of the FC guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-3/2011-FC (Vol-I) dated 06-01-2022 and 23-03-2022. The user agency has submitted an undertaking agreeing to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land proposed for diversion.
- 6. Compensatory Afforestation (CA): Present proposal involves diversion of forest land less than within one hectare. The latest FC Guidelines are silent on the requirement of equivalent extent of non-forest land for the FC proposals involving diversion of forest land up to one hectare. However, Para 3.2(viii) of the immediately previous FC Guidelines exempted such proposals from requirement of raising CA. Therefore, the present FC proposal may also be exempted from the requirement of raising CA. However, Para 2.6(i) of the latest FC guidelines mentioned above mandates that the cost of plantation (including ten years maintenance) of ten times the number of trees likely to be felled or specified number of trees as may be specified in the order for diversion of forest land (subject to a minimum number of 100 plants) shall be levied from the User Agency towards Compensatory planting. Even if there are no trees on the forest land proposed for diversion in the proposal, the User Agency will be required to

pay the applicable charges in accordance with the PCCF (HoFF) O.M. KFD/HOFF/A5-3(GFL)/34/2019-FC [E-88289] 21-08-2023 in case any tree felling is required in forest land at the time of execution of the project.

7. Status of RoFR compliance: In order to meet the requirement of the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 and Rules 2008 and the FC Guidelines, the User Agency has not obtained/ furnished the (copy of) requisite RoFR Certificate in FORM-I (for Linear projects) issued by the jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. Accordingly, the User Agency is being informed once again to obtain the said certificate in prescribed format and submit a copy.

Under the above circumstances and agreeing with recommendation of the field officers, it is requested to consider 'in-principle' (Stage-I) approval under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 0.4867 (revised from 0.4725 ha) ha of forest land in Achanur village, Bagalkot Taluk and District for Improvement of Achanur Hill Approach Road to Narasimhaswamy Temple on the hill top in favour of Assistant Executive Engineer, Panchayath Raj Engineering Division (PRED) Sub Division, Bagalkot Taluk and Districtfor a period of twenty (20) years, subject to submission of RoFR Compliance Certificate in FORM-I (for Linear projects) and the conditions listed in Annexure 'A'.

The hard copy of the proposal along with the relevant documents in 3 sets is submitted herewith for further needful. The present status of the proposal obtained from the web-portal is also appended for necessary action.

ANNEXURE-A

- The legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged and it shall continue to be forest land.
- The User Agency shall pay the applicable Net Present Value (NPV), Compensatory, Plantation cost of extraction of trees, land lease rent and any other levies as per the conditions of approval.
- The User Agency shall demarcate the lease area in the manner specified at the time of approval at its own cost.
- 4. The lessee shall not sub-lease, mortgage and hypothecate the forest area.
- The Lessee shall provide signages in appropriate dimensions and kind near the proposed pipeline & other components within forest limits for sensitization of general public towards the forest, wildlife and environmental issues in consultation with the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests.
- 6. The leased-out area should be used for the purpose for which it is granted. In case the land is not used for the stipulated purpose within two years or when it is no longer needed for the stipulated purpose, the area would stand resumed to the Forest Department.
- No change in Land Use Plan on forest land shall be done except with prior approval of Government of India under FC Act 1980.
- 8. The application for renewal of the lease in the prescribed form and manner shall be submitted at least six months prior to the expiry of forest lease. In case no renewal is sought, the Lessee shall hand over the lease.
- No residential or commercial buildings shall be permitted in the forest area proposed for diversion.
- 10. No crushing / breaking of stones or labour camp shall be allowed on forest land and all waste / debris generated shall be scientifically disposed off outside the forest area.
- 11. Any damage to forest area because of implementation of the proposal shall be compensated by the Lessee. The extent of damage shall be assessed by the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 12. The Lessee shall ensure that no avoidable harm is caused to the fauna and flora in and around the proposed area.
- 13. In case, any violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Forest Act, 1963 & Rules, 1969 or other relevant Acts/Rules is reported during the lease period, the lease will be liable for forfeiture under Section 82 of Karnataka Forest Act, 1963. The Chief Conservator of Forests / Deputy Conservator of Forests concerned are authorized to take necessary action in this regard.
- 14. The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to any other clearances necessary under the prevailing statutes.
- 15. The User Agency shall also abide by other conditions those may be imposed by the Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) before or after the approval.
