9.	Condition of Vegetation and type of forest in the applied area.	The forest land applied for diversion is situated in close proximity of adjoining Sidhamath RF and has been depicted as "Open Mixed Jungle mainly Sal" on concerned Toposheet. Therefore, the condition of vegetation has been treated at par with the adjoining Sidhamatha Reserved Forest. The adjoining Reserved Forests come under the group 3C/C2e(iii) Moist Peninsular Valley Sal. The prevailing vegetation consists of Sal and its associates. The principal associates of sal include <i>Terminalia alata</i> , <i>Lagerstroemia perviflora</i> , <i>Anogeissus latifolia</i> , <i>Terminalia belerica</i> , <i>Syzygium cumini</i> , <i>Mangifera indica</i> , <i>Schleichera oleosa</i> , <i>Adina cordifolia</i> , <i>Pterocarpus marsupium</i> , <i>Bombax ceiba</i> , <i>Bridelia retusa</i> , <i>Madhuca indica</i> . The middle story is represented by <i>Syzygium cumini</i> , <i>Ougeinia ougenensis</i> , <i>Careya arborea</i> , <i>Treama orientalis</i> , <i>Emblica officinalis</i> , <i>Cassia fistula</i> etc. The shrubs and undergrowth are characterized by <i>Indigofera pulchella</i> , <i>Ardisia solenacea</i> , <i>Flemingia chhapar</i> , <i>Helicteres ixora</i> and <i>Clerodendron viscosum</i> etc. The prevailing climbers include <i>Bauhinia vahlii</i> , <i>Combretum decandrum</i> and <i>Beutia parviflora</i> . The grasses over the forest floor include <i>Chrysopogon aciculatus</i> , <i>Imperata cylindrica</i> , <i>Dicanthium carricosum</i> , <i>Cynodon dactylon</i> etc.
10.	Position of Wildlife	The adjoining Reserved Forest is the dwelling habitat for leopard, bear, barking deer, hyena, porcupine and etc. Occasional visit of wild elephants used to be witnessed in the adjoining R.F. This falls under elephant habitat zone- 2 as mentioned by ORSAC, Bhubaneswar.
11.	Whether the applied area involves any Eco-Sensitive Zone / National Park / Sanctuary.	The applied area does not involve any Eco-Sensitive Zone / National Park / Sanctuary.
12.	No. of trees to be felled and its impact on the eco-system.	There are 753 Nos. of sound trees, 475 Nos. of unsound trees and 708 nos. of poles below 30 cm girth enumerated inside the proposed diversion area of 63.30 ha. The species wise and diameter class wise abstract of enumerated trees is enclosed as Annexure – XIX .
13.	Details of broken up land and reclamation done if any.	The total broken up forest land involved in the mining lease is 277.498 ha. The proposed diversion proposal submitted over 63.30 ha involves 51.418 ha broken up land. Mined out pits over 3.438 ha has been reclaimed and OB dump over 1.8 ha has been stabilised. The submitted diversion proposal over 63.30 ha non-forest land recorded as forest as on 25.10.1980, located in the mining lease, include 2.350 ha reclaimed area (1.80 ha – stabilised OB dump and 0.55 reclaimed mining pits) out of aforesaid reclaimed area. In addition, the User Agency has furnished an undertaking vide Annexure No. XI to undertake concurrent reclamation of Mined out pits through back filling followed by afforestation as per the approved Concurrent Reclamation Plan.

The Collector, Keonjhar has been requested vide letter No. 5437 dated 12.08.2014 and No. 8039 dt.26.11.2014 to take legal action for illegal mining in revenue forest land without FC approval. Action taken report awaited.

Observation as Regards Present Land Use vis-à-vis

Approved Land Use Plan

The following deviation is observed in respect of land use in the mining lease in comparison with the approved land use plan:

1. Stacking of Sub-Grade ores to the tune of 63.628 ha diverted forest land as against the approved area for the said purpose over 19.698 ha.
2. The designated and approved for ore stacking and dressing has been accompanied with a crusher even if that has not been specifically mentioned in the land use plan.
3. Extension of the establish beneficiation plant to the tune of 0.90 ha in diverted village forest.
