Specific recommendations of the DCF for acceptance or otherwise of the proposal with reason.	<p>Recommended for acceptance with the following safeguards:-</p> <p>The user agency should submit a plan of action for preventing any sort of environment degradation by the workers engaged in construction activities. It is often seen that the migrant workers engaged in construction works indulge in hunting of birds and small animals beside cutting trees for fuel. Sometimes the workers also indulge in illegal timber business during weekends and holidays. The user agency should maintain a strict control over their work force. Provision may be made beforehand for alternative fuel for heating and cooking purpose for workforce, engagement of the workers in some activities during weekends and holidays when they are most likely to indulge in hunting/illegal activities etc.</p>
