

Site Inspection Report

Sub: Diversion of 177.091 ha. of forest land in Kali Tiger, Dharwad, Haliyal and Belgaum Division for 400 Kv D/C Quad Transmission Line LILO Project in favour of Manager (Projects) Goa-Tammar Transmission Project Ltd New Delhi – reg.

I have inspected the forest land involved in this proposal on 15-02-2020 and 03-03-2020 along with the Asst. Conservator of Forests, Nagaragali and Khanapur and the staff.


The forest lands involved in this proposal were verified with reference to the Forest maps, Village maps, topo sheets and the maps prepared by the user Agency. The entire stretch of proposed line from Kulavalli Village of Golihalli Range where Encalyptus Plantations exist to Goa-Karnataka boarder where the Semi evergreen forests exist. The total length of the transmission line passes through inside the forest is 22.38 km. The line passes through Eucalyptus Plantation and dry deciduous forests in Golihalli Range, dry deciduous forests in Nagaragali Range and moist deciduous and semi evergreen forests in Londa Range.

The total forest area involved for the diversion is 101.747 Ha in Belagavi Division.

There is no any National Park or Wildlife Sanctuary in the proposed land. There are no historical monuments, religious, archeological important structures found in the proposed area. The movement of elephants and other animals are found in these areas.

This forest area comes under **Eco-class-I (Tropical Semi Evergreen Forests and Tropical Moist Deciduous Forests) and Eco-class-III (Tropical Dry Deciduous Forests)** as per letter No: 5-3/2007-FC, Dated: 05-02-2009 of the GOI.
