Site Inspection Report

Proposal No.: FP/RJ/TRANS/142368/2021

Name of the Project: Diversion of 74.2490 ha. Forest land in favour of RDSA
Mining LLP for Opencast Marble Mining in revenue Village-
Danta, Tehsil- Pipalkhunth, District – Pratapgarh, Rajasthan.

The Proposed forest land for diversion of 74.249 ha area falls in forest block Gamargarh Panadiya A to D in village Danta of Tehsil and Range office Pipalkhunth.

Diversion case is proposed for open cast marble mining. The site was visited by undersigned on 09.09.2022 along with DCF, Staff and User agency staff.

The site lies on northern extreme side of forest block. The proposed area is like a plateau and has got good crop of Teak (*Tectona grandis*) on slopes. Mostly it is pole crop other forest species of trees also exist in the area. In first phase 30.51 ha is proposed for mining and other activities and a total of 15099 trees have to be removed. In this 10037 trees are with GBH below 30 cm. In second phase in 6th year successive mining plan will be undertaken after review. The user agency has given reclamation plan also.

As per the enumeration report of trees, a total of 26321 trees of about 41 species exist in the area. Considering the importance of big trees of some important and rare species it is recommended that trees of following species need to be uprooted totally and replanted at suitable site given by forest department under their supervision:

In the above mentioned operation whatever possible survival it will be useful for saving some rare species.

Considering the benefits that will be available to local tribal people, employment generation, and the project may be approved in public interest.
