

SITE INSEPPCTION REPORT OF DFO

Certified that the proposed area for diversion 425.5 Ha of Unclassified State Forest (USF) land has been physically inspected by the undersigned on 10/08/2018. The area was visited in connection with the diversion proposal of land required for lime stone mining for Calcom Cement India Limited, Umrangshu in Dima Hasao District.

The terrain is hilly with slopes varying from gentle to steep, however there is no threat of causing soil erosion.

The vegetation is mainly degraded (88.87%) and vary dense Eco Class 1 forest (11.13%).

The major tree species found are Gamari, Teta Cjhap, Sidha, Bhelu, Jia, Bamboo etc.

The area has no large wild animals. There are however signs of such animals as rabbits, ant eaters, reptiles and few birds. The area does not constitute a part of any National park, Wild life sanctuary, Biosphere reserve, tiger reserve, Elephant reserve or in a part of any Wild life corridor.

There is no Archeological sites, Heritage, Defense Establishment or any other monuments of historical importance located in this area proposed for diversion.

The project does not involve displacement & rehabilitation of people as it is devoid of any human habitation/ dwelling.

During my inspection visit it noted that there is neither any violation of Forest Conservation act 1980 nor any kind of Non Forest activity initiated within the area by the user agency.

The proposed diversion of Forest land of 425.5Ha is required for the captive mining of lime stone and is site specific. The requirement of Forest land is unavoidable and is to the barest minimum to meet the prime raw material of the cement plant already being set up outside the forest land.
