- 2.7 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 2.8 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 2.9 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 2.10 It Shall be mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals:-
 - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
 - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
 - (c) Wherever matural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
 - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km

2.11 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.

2.12 User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if applicable.

- 2.13 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government
- 2.14 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land
- 2.15 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
