

SITE INSPECTION REPORT OF
DISTRICT FOREST OFFICER, DINDIGUL DIVISION, DINDIGUL

- (i) I inspected the site on 10.05.2019, 11.05.2020 & 30.05.2020
- (ii) This project is for the development of Economic corridors; inter corridors, Feeder routes and coastal roads to improve the efficiency of freight movement in India from Madurai to Natham in Alagarmalai Reserved Forest.
- (iii) This project involves the formation of NH road at Alagarmalai Reserved Forests of 19+000 to 19+650 RH distances, the total length of the road is 650m and total area needed is 1.567 Ha.
- (iv) The proposed area is having plain surface and there are around 440 trees in the proposed area including 77spontaneous trees mostly comprising of *Albizzia amara*. The plantation trees is composed mostly of Eucalyptus species.
- (v) The proposed area is along the boundary of the Reserved Forest, involving five no's of Cairn.
- (vi) This project in Alagarmalai Reserved Forest has minimum effects on environment and more beneficial to the public.

RECOMMENDATION OF THE

Legal status of forest land proposed for Diversion: Alagarmalai RF.

I have inspected on 10.05.2019, 11.05.2020 & 30.05.2020 the proposed site for development of Economic corridors, inter corridors, Feeder routes and costal roads to improve the efficiency of freight movement in India from Madurai to Natham in Alagarmalai Reserved Forest.

- (i) The area proposed by the user Agency is 1.567 Ha land and there is no alternative land for the proposed project except forest land.
- (ii) The User Agency has not started any work proposed in Alagarmalai RF.
- (iii) This project involves the formation of NH road at Alagarmalai Reserved Forests of 19+000 to 19+650 RH distances, the total length of the road is 650m and total area needed is 1.567 Ha.
- (iv) The proposed area is having plain surface and there are 77 small spontaneous trees involved in the proposed area.
- (v) This project in Alagarmalai Reserved Forest has minimum effects on environment and more beneficial to the public.
- (vi) The proposed area for diversion does not have any archeological and heritage related monuments.
- (vii) There is no Tribal Rights affected in this project.
- (viii) Flagship species like tiger and Elephant are not available in this Reserved Forest. Hence there is no threat to major wildlife species.

This project in Alagarmalai Reserved Forests has minimum effects on environment and more beneficial to the public. Hence this project is recommended.
