(vi) Density of vegetation.	The applied area for diversion is situated close to Karo Reserve Forest. Eco Value Class has been treated as "Eco Value Class - I". There are 1698 nos. of sound, 998 Nos. of unsound trees and 4399 Nos. of poles below 30 cm girth enumerated in 23 nos of sample plots (each 1 ha) in forest land, located within the mining lease, proposed for mining operation. The species wise and diameter class wise abstract of enumerated trees in respect of the applied forest land in separate sheets is enclosed as Annexure – XX. Based on proximate location – Karo Reserved Forest and the canopy density has been considered at per with the prevailing vegetation depicted as "open mixed jungle mainly sal" on concerned Toposheet and kept at 0.3.

(viii) Brief note on vulnerability of the forest area to erosion	This site falls under the physiographic Joda Barbil plateau extending from Chamakpur to the border of Singhbhum of Jharkhand in the north and the border of Bonai in the west. This region is very largely an extension southwards of Singhbhum rocks. This group of rocks comprising trap, tuffites, shale, quartzite, phyllite, banded haematite jasper and banded haematite quartzite form high hill ranges with narrow deep valleys in between. In this area massive deposits of iron and manganese are associated with B.H.J. and shales respectively. The undulating hilly slope is prone to soil erosion.
