

# GOVERNMENT OF AJMER

## DECLARATION

Ajmer, the 25th February 1953

**No. C/17/36/52(HS&R)-Revenue.**—The waste and hilly lands described below being required for the purposes of State Forest are hereby under the orders of the Chief Commissioner, Ajmer, taken up for such purposes and the present declaration is made and published under section 3 of the Ajmer Forest Regulation, 1874 (Regulation VI of 1874).

### 1. Khempura Tract—

This tract is comprised of part of village Khempura, with an area approximately 186 acres.

It is demarcated by 26 *kacha* pillars, total chainage being 3 miles 4 chains.

**North.**—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1, situated on the common boundary of villages Shamgarh and Khempura and runs towards south-east for about 18 chains upto pillar No. 4.

**East.**—From pillar No. 4, the line goes towards south-west through village Khempura for about 43 chains upto pillar No. 6 and then towards south for about 49 chains upto pillar No. 9.

**South.**—From pillar No. 9, the demarcation line goes towards west through village Khempura for about 30 chains upto pillar No. 12, situated at the trijunction point of village Pakhriawas, Khempura and Sona Chaudsia.

**West.**—From pillar No. 12, the line goes towards north-east along common boundary of villages Pakhriawas and Khempura for a distance of about 80 chains upto pillar No. 25, situated at the trijunction point of villages Pakhriawas, Shamgarh and Khempura. From pillar No. 25, the line goes towards north-east along common boundary of villages Shamgarh and Khempura for about 24 chains to meet pillar No. 1, the original starting point.

### 2. Chather Bir Tract (Masuda)—

This tract is comprised of part of village Masuda with an area approximately 1015 acres.

It is demarcated by 54 *kacha* pillars, total chainage being 7 miles 5 chains.

**North.**—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1, situated near the road Masuda to Beawar and runs towards south-east through village Masuda for about 26 chains upto pillar No. 5.

**East.**—From pillar No. 5, the demarcation line goes towards south-west through village Masuda for about 87 chains upto pillar No. 12 and then to south for about 11 chains upto pillar No. 13. From pillar No. 13, the line turns towards east and goes for about 39 chains upto pillar No. 16. From pillar No. 16, it runs towards south in a zig-zag manner for about 42 chains upto pillar No. 22, from where it turns towards south-west and goes for about 71 chains upto pillar No. 29, situated on the common boundary of villages Masuda and Jaswantpura.

**South.**—From pillar No. 29, the line runs towards north-western direction in a zig-zag manner along common boundary of villages Masuda and Jaswantpura for about 44 chains upto pillar No. 35, situated at the trijunction point of villages Rappura, Masuda and Jaswantpura.

**West.**—From pillar No. 35, the demarcation line goes towards north along common boundary of villages Rappura and Masuda in a zig-zag manner for about 80 chains upto pillar No. 42, from where it turns towards west and goes for about 11 chains upto pillar No. 43. From pillar No. 43 the line goes towards north-west for about 10 chains upto pillar No. 44 and then towards north-east through village Masuda for about 61 chains upto pillar No. 49. From pillar No. 49 it then turns and goes towards north-west for about 18 chains upto pillar No. 50, then towards north-east for about 18 chains upto pillar No. 51, from where it turns towards north-west for about 5 chains upto pillar No. 52, situated near Masuda-Beawar Road. From pillar No. 52, the line runs parallel to the Masuda-Beawar Road towards north-eastern direction for about 42 chains to meet pillar No. 1, the original starting point.

### 3. Sona Chaudsia Tract—

This tract is comprised of part of village Sona Chaudsia with an area approximately 30 acres.

It is demarcated by 15 *kacha* pillars, total chainage being 1 mile 11 chains.

**North-East.**—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1, situated at the trijunction point of villages Lulwa Pakhriawas and Sona Chaudsia and goes towards south-east along common boundary of villages Pakhriawas and Sona Chaudsia for about 32 chains upto pillar No. 6.

**South.**—From pillar No. 6, the demarcation line goes towards south-west through village Sona Chaudsia for about 24 chains upto pillar No. 9, situated on the common boundary of villages Sona Chaudsia and Lulwa.

**West.**—From pillar No. 9, the line goes towards north-east direction along common boundary of villages Lulwa and Sona Chaudsia for a distance of about 35 chains to meet pillar No. 1, the original starting point.

### 4. Ramgarh Tract—

This tract is comprised of parts of following villages with their areas as under :—

It is demarcated by 77 *kacha* pillars, total chainage being 9 miles 2 chains.

**East.**—The demarcation line starts from pillar No. 1 situated in village Ramgarh and runs towards south-west through village Ramgarh for about 31 chains upto pillar No. 4, situated on the common boundary of villages Ramgarh and Topas, from where it goes along common boundary of villages Ramgarh and Topas in the same direction for about 15 chains upto pillar No. 5. From pillar No. 5 the line then goes through village Ramgarh in south-western direction for about 22 chains upto pillar No. 9 then to north-west for about 30 chains upto pillar No. 11. From pillar No. 11, the line goes towards south-west through village Ramgarh for about 27 chains upto pillar No. 14, then to south for about 22 chains upto pillar No. 15 and then it turns towards east and goes for about 14 chains upto pillar No. 16. From pillar No. 16, the line turns towards south and goes for about 36 chains upto pillar No. 20.

**South.**—From pillar No. 20, the demarcation line goes towards south-west through village Ramgarh for about 148 chains upto pillar No. 32, situated on the common boundary of villages Ramgarh and Akrol. From pillar No. 32, the line moves towards north-west along common boundary of villages Ramgarh and Akrol for a distance of about 24 chains upto pillar No. 34, situated at the trijunction point of villages Ramgarh, Akrol and Ladpura.

**West.**—From pillar No. 34, the demarcation line goes towards north through village Ladpura for about 22 chains upto pillar No. 38 and then to north-east for about 22 chains upto pillar No. 41, situated on the common boundary of villages Ladpura and Ramgarh. From pillar No. 41, the line then proceeds towards east through village Ramgarh for about 19 chains upto pillar No. 44 and then goes to south-east for about 14 chains upto pillar No. 46. From pillar No. 46 the line goes towards north-east through village Ramgarh for about 25 chains upto pillar No. 50, then to north-west for about 13 chains upto pillar No. 51. From pillar No. 51 the line goes to north for about 19 chains upto pillar No. 53 and then to north-east for about 89 chains upto pillar No. 62. From pillar No. 62, the line moves towards north for about 2 chains upto pillar No. 64 and then to north-east for about 8 chains upto pillar No. 65 and then to east for about 1 chains upto pillar No. 66. From pillar No. 66, the line goes towards south for about 6 chains upto pillar No. 6 and then to south-east for about 12 chains upto pillar No. 68 from where it turns to north-east for about 1 chains upto pillar No. 70 and then to north-west for about 5 chains upto pillar No. 71. From pillar No. 71, the line takes its course towards north-east through village Ramgarh for about 45 chains to meet pillar No. 1, the original starting point.

### 5. Ramgarh-Dhanikhera Tract—

This tract is comprised of parts of following villages with their areas as under :—
