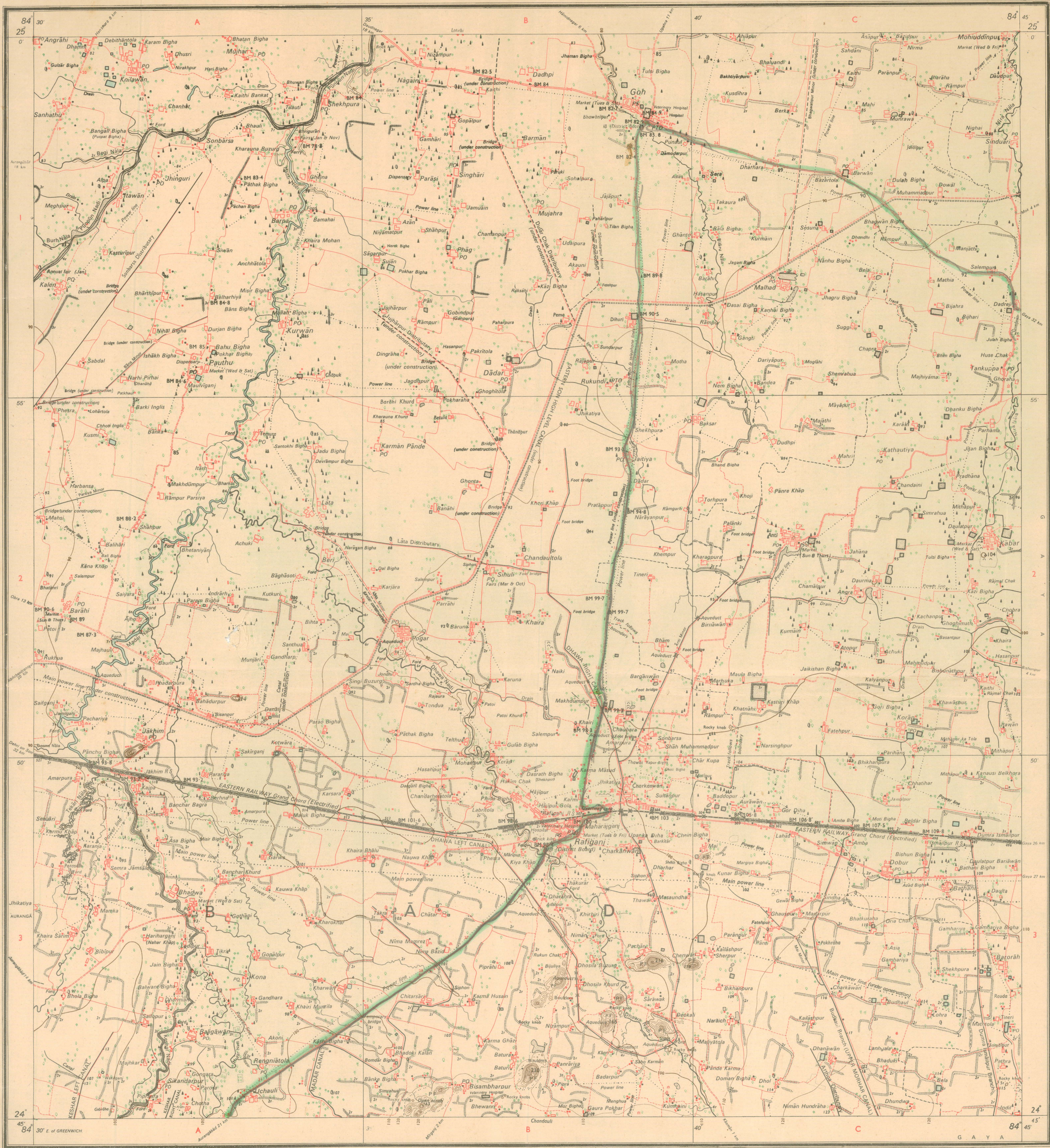

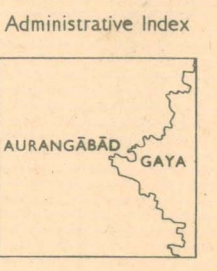

Wooded areas are coloured green. Scattered trees and other vegetation are in green, but prominent surveyed trees are in black.

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INDIA

The triangulated heights and contours in this sheet have not been adjusted to the heights of the spirit-levelled bench-marks and may not be strictly in accordance with them.

The kilometre stone numbers along roads, canals and the railway are shown in slant type, e.g. '3' whereas milestone numbers are in upright type, e.g. '3'.

Cart-tracks and unmetalled roads are generally motorable in dry season. Permission to use these along canals is required from the irrigating authorities.

A relative height, e.g., 6, marked along a canal indicates the height of the top of the canal embankment above the adjacent country.

Names of Protected Forests falling in this sheet have not been shown for want of reliable information.

Wells are numerous throughout the sheet; only the important ones have been shown.

Tanks shown dry in this area usually contain water from July to March.

Perennial streams in this sheet are generally fordable from October to June at the places indicated as such.

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
