


DETAILED NOTE ON THE PROJECT


Shamsher to Panai area under Anni Tehsil is a remote area which is unconnected by road. The villagers have to take uphill journey to reach their villages. It is also very problematic for the villagers to transport essential commodities to the village in the absence of a road link especially in view of the rugged terrain and steep slopes. It is also the policy of the Government to connect all Panchayats by road. The total length of the road is 9.390 km out of which 6.965 km of road will pass through the forest land and 2.425 km will pass through private land. 615 numbers of trees are coming in proposed road alignment 4.18 hectare of forest land is required for road construction and 1.13 hectare of forest land is required for dumping site. Total Forest area for the construction of this road is 5.31 hectare which is required to be diverted under *Forest Conservation Act, 1980*.

This road is being constructed to provide motor link to the Dogridhar, Panai, Jamda, Bashlera, Shooch, Palani & Shaa. The road will cater to the needs of population of about 600 and will give a boost to the local economy as the road link will facilitate the transportation of agricultural and horticultural produce like Apples, Almonds, Potatoes and other cereal crops to the markets. Besides this, the motor road will be helpful for the patients in case of medical emergencies. The project will generate about 96000 mandays directly during the construction phase besides generating indirect opportunities of employment as result of increased economic activity in the area. For the construction of this road 5.31 hac. of forest land is required to be diverted for which this case under Forest Conservation Act, 1980 has been prepared.


