It is notified for general information that, under Section 1 (b) of the Record of Rights Act No. X of 1927, Government are pleased to direct that the provisions of the said Act shall be applied to the said Village of Mubbur in Shivmoga Taluk.

The Record is intended to be used for the purpose of settling disputes and to protect them against fraud and fabrication of false claims. It will also be of assistance to Government as well as the ratepayers in the distribution of Government lands and the grant of various advances, the grant of Takuvi and Land Improvement Loans and the grant of suspension or revocation of land revenue.

Record will first be prepared by the Shambhug to the best of their information in the prescribed form and every case will be duly investigated by a Special Revenue Inspector. There will be a check of the preliminary Record by the Assistant Survey and Settlement Officer, authorized by the Superintendent of Land Records, Survey and Settlement or by the Deputy Commissioner in this behalf. Occupants and persons interested in the land are required to furnish correct information that may be within their knowledge to the Investigating Officer in order to secure accuracy in the preparation of this Record which will form the basis of the future Record of Rights.

4. All persons interested in the land are required to render every reasonable assistance to Officers of the Department of Land Records when they come to the village to measure the lines and to conduct enquiries in cases of disputed boundary lines between houses in the village after giving the prescribed notice.

5. The attention of the public is invited to the provisions of Section 7 of the Record of Rights Act regarding them on requisition by a Revenue Officer, engaged in compiling or revising the Record of Rights to furnish or produce information and documents needed for the correct compilation or revision thereof within one month from the date of such requisition. Failure to comply with this requisition and secure registration of their rights will render occupants and holders of interests in land liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 (recovery as an arrear of land revenue) besides depriving them of the advantages enumerated above. The officer to whom any information is furnished or before whom any documents are produced in accordance with the requisition will give a written acknowledgment therefor in the form prescribed to the person furnishing or producing the same and shall endorse on the document in accordance with the requisition will give a written acknowledgment therefor.

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Starting from the junction-band of Xemmedoddi and Udaya Villages of Davikere Taluk, the line runs east along the southern boundary of Survey No. 93 of Udaya Village for a distance of 50 chains and then turns slightly north-east and runs for a distance of 90 chains all along the southern boundary of the said Survey No. 93 of Udaya Village and meets the junction-band of Survey Nos. 82 and 80 of Udaya Village and 140 of Hogarehalli Village and then turns east and runs along the southern boundary of Survey No. 140 of Hogarehalli Village for a distance of 40 chains and turns slightly north-east and runs along the said Survey No. 140 of Hogarehalli Village for a distance of 10 chains and meets the junction-band of Survey Nos. 110 and 110 of Hogarehalli Village and turns east and runs for 6 chains and again turns north and runs for 8 chains along the southern and eastern boundaries of Survey No. 110 and turns slightly south-east and runs for about 7 chains along the southern boundary of Survey Nos. 106 and 105 and turns and runs slightly north-east for a distance of 8 chains and meets the junction-band of Survey Nos. 105 and 108 of Hogarehalli Village. Then the line runs slightly north-east and runs along the southern boundary of Survey No. 108 of Hogarehalli for a distance of 24 chains and turns south-east and runs for 4 chains in the south-east direction and for 4 chains in the north-east direction along the southern boundary of the said Survey No. and for 16 chains in the same direction along the southern boundary of Survey No. 140 of the said village and runs the junction-band of Survey Nos. 140 and 95 of Hogarehalli and Xemmedoddi. Then the line turns and runs for a distance of 70 chains in easterly direction along the southern boundary of Survey No. 95 of Hogarehalli Village and meets the quadrilateral-band of Xemmedoddi and Survey Nos. 71, 94 and 95 of Hogarehalli. Then the line turns south-east and runs for a distance of 133 chains along the eastern boundary of Survey No. 71 of Hogarehalli and meets the junction-band of Hogarehalli and Baligunoor Villages. Then the line turns east and runs for a distance of 63 chains along the southern boundary of Survey No. 101 of Baligunoor and turns north-east and runs for 38 chains and turns east along the line turns east and runs for a distance of 63 chains along the southern boundary of Survey No. 101 of Baligunoor and turns north-east and runs for 38 chains and turns east along the line turns east and runs for 35 chains along the southern boundary of Survey No. 100 of Baligunoor Village and then turns and runs in a northerly and slightly north-westerly direction for a distance of 40 chains and 50 chains, respectively along the eastern boundary of Survey No. 100 of Baligunoor Village. Then the line turns south-east and runs for 19 chains and 21 chains east and runs for a distance of 52 chains along the southern boundaries of Survey Nos. 4 and 434 of Hiriyangala Village.

East.—Then the line turns and runs for a distance of 13 chains along the western boundary of Survey No. 339 of Hiriyangala Village in a slightly south-westerly direction and then turns south and runs for a distance of 38 chains along the western boundaries of Survey Nos. 286, 285, 283, 282, 266, 265 and 264 of Hiriyangala Village and meets the junction-band of Survey Nos. 254 and 250 of Hiriyangala Village and Xemmedoddi. Then the line turns slightly south-west and runs for 26 chains along the northern boundary of Survey No. 250 of Hiriyangala Village and turns south and runs for 29 chains along the western boundary of the said survey number. Then the line turns east and runs for 29 chains along the southern boundaries of Survey Nos. 250 and 249 and meets the line. Then the line turns slightly south-east and runs for about 10 chains along the western edge of the Talla and 16 chains along the western boundary of Survey No. 173 of Hiriyangala Village and meets the junction-band of Hiriyangala, Outbahalli and Xemmedoddi. Then the line turns slightly south-east and runs for a distance of 15 chains along the western corner of Survey No. 15 of Outbahalli Village. Then the line crosses the said Talla at its bend and runs all along the eastern bank of the said Talla in a zigzag manner for a distance of 150 chains along the western boundaries of the Survey Nos. 15, 16, 17, 20, 22, 23, 26 and 27 of Outbahalli Village and meets the south-western corner-band of the said named survey number. Then the line turns east and runs for a distance of 15 chains along the southern boundary of Survey No. 27 and the southern edge of the channel and meets the junction-band of Xemmedoddi, Hiriyangala and Outbahalli Villages. Whereas the Government of His Highness the Maharaja of Mysore are satisfied that there is a danger of the outbreak of plague at Beechagannahalli village in the Sub-Taluk, Kolar District, if persons from plague-infected areas in the Mysore District are permitted to assemble in the place on the occasion of weekly shandies; and whereas the Government are pleased to prohibit the holding of the weekly shandies at Beechagannahalli village for a period of one month.
All persons proceeding to the shandy in contravention of this notification will be liable to prosecution.

In exercise of the powers conferred on them by sub-rule (2) of Rule 16 of the Mysore Rules as applied to Mysore and in continuation of the Notification No. A. R. 10-41-3, dated the 4th October 1941, the Government of His Highness the Maharaja of Mysore are pleased to make the following order namely:—
1. The working of wireless transmitting apparatus on board any aircraft is prohibited during any time when that aircraft is left unattended, for the purpose of being such working an aircraft which is fitted with wireless transmitting apparatus shall be left unattended unless there has been taken away from the wireless transmitting apparatus thereon at least one component part of such apparatus which is essential for its working to be worked and which cannot easily be replaced or made good by an attempt to work such apparatus in contravention of this order.
2. The pilot or person for the time being in charge of any aircraft fitted with transmitting apparatus shall secure that any such component part thereof as is essential for the working of the apparatus shall be taken away therefrom in a safe manner and shall take such steps as are necessary to ensure that the provisions of this order are respected complied with.

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
