vehicles may result in almost separating the area on both sides of these lines from the perspective of animal movement in and around the area and more so for megafauna like Elephants. Therefore, measures to mitigate these adverse impacts through comprehensive Integrated Wildlife Management Plan and creation/management of pathways specially overpass and underpass suitable for animal crossings across these lines are very important. A small rivulet named Thakurjarwa passing through this area feeds Mahdonia tributary of Damodar river which flows through the proposed Chakla Coal mine area. Therefore, to minimize the impact of this Rail & Road project on the water regime of this area, a comprehensive Soil & Moisture Conservation Plan for the surrounding area is necessary. Representatives of the User Agency informed that a good portion of this pathway will be elevated Road and Rail line. This if done properly can help in minimizing the fragmentation of habitat for wildlife. Considering the above mentioned mitigative measures for mitigating the adverse impacts of this project the diversion of 6.80 Ha. Notified Forest land 6.18 Ha, Deemed
