

**NOTIFICATION OF BHEENGAL RESERVED FOREST DIVISION NIZAMABAD  
UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE FOREST ACT**

...

In pursuance of section 18 of the Forest Act, of 1326 F (Act No. 1 of 1326 F) it is hereby declared, that the following areas comprising the villages of Konapur, Karepally, Devenpally, Gangaria, Manayal, Dev-ka-pate, Tadipally, Tatpally, taluk Amoor, District Nizamabad, Rudrangi, Bheengal, Timalpally, Vathi Madla, Mars Madla, Taluq. Sircilla, District Kareem Nagar, Chintala Kunta, Appapally, Potharam, Kalikot, Taluq. Jagthial, District Kareemnagar, as reserved forest, which shall be called Bheengal reserved forest, Taluk Amoor, district Nizamabad the area of which is 51, 714 acres, 10 guntas, it was notified under section 7 after obtaining the Government sanction and it was published in the Gazette No. 33 dated 13th Apr 1333 and under section 10, Gazette No. 46 dated 12th Apr 1343 F. it was also published in local language of the concerned villages.

There are five enclosures in this reservation, the particulars of the boundaries are as follows :-

**BOUNDARIES**

**NORTH :-** The preliminary boundary line of this reserved forest commences from the north western corner of the bi-junction villages of Fallikonda Jagir and Devenpally Khalsa and runs through the boundary of Devenpally cart-track-palli Konda Jagir to Devenpally and runs for a distance of 56 chains in the north and east, from there it leaves the said passage and runs zig-zag in the north-eastern direction crossing the cart-track of Devenpally to Karepally reaches up to the boundary of Mundhava, thence runs towards south-eastern direction between the boundary of Devenpally, and Mundhava, passing through reaches the quadri-junction village of Mundhava, Marsapur Jagir, Devenpally and Karepally Khalsa, from there it runs zig-zag between the villages of Marsapur Jagir and Karepally Khalsa, from there it goes up to the quadri-junction village of Karepally, Devenpally, Manayal, Konapur and Marsapur Jagir, from there it goes up to the cart-track of Marsapur to Manayal joins, from there it runs towards north-west between the boundary of Marsapur Jagir and Konapur Khalsa, thence reaches the rivulet known as ... from there it enters the boundary of Konapur and Marsapur, runs towards north-east, thence runs for a distance of 72 chains side by side of the said rivulet, thence towards east and south, thence runs over the ...

- boundary of S.No. 362, thence crossing Rivallet Gadevarry, thence towards north-eastern direction and runs towards S.No. 361, thence reaches up to Gundam Vagu, from there it runs for a distance over the said Vagu thence runs for a little distance, thence including Ranga Naik Swamy temple, situated at Konapur, in the reservation thence runs towards south of pedestrian-track, thence runs towards west and southern side of S.Nos. 365, 368 and 369, thence towards south and runs over the western boundary of S.No. 336, the western boundary of S.No. 323, 337, thence runs side by side of Inwaria Gutta, thence reaches peddavagu, from there it goes towards south west side by side of Peddavagu, and runs for 125 chains from there leaving the said river, turns towards south-east and runs parallel over the southern boundary of S.No. 451 reaches up to Mallaneela Vagu, from there it goes towards north, thence side by side of Mallaneela Vagu, reaches the pedes train track Konapur to Manegal, crossing it reaches up to Pedda Vagu Sengas, from there it runs side by side of said Vagu for some distance thence runs over the southern side of S.Nos. 317, 323, reaches the pedes train track Konapur, thence it goes towards south-western Out.No. 307 and west of S.Nos. 198, 205, in a zig-zag manner thence reaches the boundary of 'Chintakunta' from there entering the boundary of Chintakunta goes towards south-eastern direction, thence runs over the southern boundary of S.No. 312, thence crossing the pedes train. Track, Chintakunta to Manegal, thence touching the southern corner of S.No. 308, runs over the southern boundary of S.No. 3290, 299 and 302 thence including S.No. 2 in the reserved forest thence reaches the boundary of appavalli where mark 'B' is shown in the plan.

from there it runs over the southern boundary of S.No. 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, and 85, thence including the S.No. 1 and 2 in the reserved forest, thence reaches the boundary of Kulikot, from there runs a zig-zag towards the south-western direction, thence runs west of S.No. 249, and northern boundary of S.No. 262-263 thence including S.No. 2, 3, 4, 5 in the reserved forest, thence west of S.No. 261 and west south of S.No. 259 and thence runs over the boundary of S.No. 258, 253, 255, 250, 249, 268, 277 and 286 excluding these Nos. from its southern boundary, thence reaches the south-eastern corner of the last mentioned No. thence it goes towards south-east and south of S.No. 298, thence runs over the west of S.No. 236, 237, 239, 247, 248, thence reaches the boundary of Rudrangi, thence enters the boundary of Rudrangi, thence runs over the west of S.No. 749, thence touching the western corner of S.No. 747 thence western boundary of S.No. 679, 747 thence crossing the cart-track and pedestrian track of Rudrangi to Maneyal, thence runs zig-zag, thence runs over the western boundary of S.No. 665, 670, 671 runs for a distance thence touching the eastern corner of S.No. 664, thence runs west of S.No. 665, to the boundary of Sangal, from there it runs towards east in a zig-zag manner, thence runs south of the boundary, thence up to the cart-track, Rudrangi to Maneyal, where the boundary, line of Kudmiyal meets. From there it goes towards south-east, between the boundary of Kudmiyal and Beemgal, runs along the above said cart track and runs for a distance of 156 chains, from there leaving the track goes towards west and south-west, with many zig-zags, thence north west direction of S.No. 492 thence crossing the cart track Maneyal to Sangal, runs towards south, south-west and southern direction, thence runs over the boundary of Timmapally, thence runs side by side of the cart-track, thence reaches the boundary of Timmapally, from there it goes towards west enters the boundary of Timmapally, thence runs side by side of the cart track Timmapally to Sangal thence runs over the S.No. 167/4 thence runs for a distance of 160 chains, up to the mark as shown in the plan.

From the above mentioned place, the line runs towards north-east and north, between the boundary of Tatpally and Ravitala Jagir thence runs crossing pudga vada, reaches the tri-junction village of Ravitala Jagir, Tatpally Khalsa and deserted village and Tatpally Khalsa from there it runs towards north-east direction between the boundary of Ravitala Jagir and Pand Madgo, thence reaches the tri-junction boundary of Ravitala, Tatpally Jagir and Pand Madgo Khalsa, from there it runs towards north-east manner, between the boundaries of Tatpally and Pand Madgo, thence reaches the tri-junction boundary of Tatpally, Pand Madgo, and Tatpally Khalsa, from there it runs towards north between the boundary of Pand Madgo and Tatpally, thence reaches the tri-junction village boundary of Pand Madgo, Tatpally, and Tatpally Khalsa.

#### ENCLOSURE NO. 1 KAREPALLY

NORTH :- The boundary line commences from the point, where the line of this enclosure and the enclosure line of the Pedestrian track of Devanpally to Karepally meets, from there it runs towards north east, thence runs through the pedestrian track of Karepally to Marsapur, thence it runs towards south, thence runs over the boundary of Rudrangi, thence runs through the cart-track from there it runs for 16 chains towards west, thence turns and runs for 22 chains, from there it runs towards south west for 22 chains thence reaches the north eastern corner of S.No. 87 where mark 'C' is shown in the plan.

SOUTH :- From the above said place, the line runs towards south west and south in a zig-zag manner, thence runs through the east of S.Nos. 87, 88, thence south of S.No. 90, 91, 92, thence reaches the southern corner of S.No. 94, from there it runs through the south of S.Nos. 94, 95, 96, 97, 98, 100, 101, and 104, thence west of S.Nos. 104, 105, 106, thence through the south of S.Nos. 107, 108, 109, 110, thence reaches the south-west corner of the said mentioned S.No. where mark 'C' is shown in the plan.

WEST :- From the above said place, the line runs towards north and north east, and north, thence runs through the west of S.No. 113 and thence runs crossing the cart track of Maneyla, thence runs through the west of Gairan enclosure S.No. 225, thence runs crossing the pedestrian track of Maneyla, thence crossing the rivulet known as S. Thivary, thence turns towards north east, thence reaches the starting point 'A'.

#### ENCLOSURE NO. 4

NORTH :- The line of this enclosure starts from the letter 'A', thence runs towards east for 16 chains, thence runs towards south-east for 20 chains, thence reaches 'B'.

SOUTH :- From the above said place the line runs towards east, crossing the cart-track, runs through the cart-track of Jokevala, thence joins the enclosure line, from there it runs towards south for 21 chains, thence it reaches 'C'.

SOUTH :- From the above said place the line runs towards south for 14 chains, thence turns and runs towards north-west for 24 chains thence reaches point 'D'.

WEST :- From above said place, the line runs towards north-west for 28 chains thence turns in the middle from there it runs towards north for 16 chains, thence reaches point 'A' In this enclosure S.No. 1 to 9 measuring 41 acres 22 guntas are included.

ENCLOSURE NO. 5 VATTICALLA

NORTH :- The line of this enclosure starts from the north-western corner of S.No. 4 (where the rivulet flows) thence goes towards east in a zig-zag manner, thence runs through the south-west corner of the tank, thence reaches letter 'B' as shown in the plan.

EAST :- From the above mentioned place, it goes towards east and south-west in a zig-zag manner, thence runs through the east of S.No. 3 to northern corner of S.No. 2, from there it runs over the north and eastern boundary of S.No. 2 thence reaches the south-eastern corner of the said No. where letter 'C' is shown in the plan.

SOUTH :- From the above mentioned place, it runs towards west for 30 chains thence runs over the southern boundary of S.No. 2 where letter 'D' is shown in the plan.

WEST :- From the above mentioned place, it runs towards north-east, thence runs through the west and northern direction of S.No. 2 thence goes towards north, thence runs through the west of S.No. 3 and 4 thence runs parallel to the rivulet thence reaches the starting point 'A'.

In all 33 chains were put fourth in respect of this reservation. The particulars of which are as follows:-

Kankatla Narsimloo has put forth his claim in respect of S.No.s 13 to 15 measuring 4 acres 25 guntas bearing a land revenue of Rs.60/- situated at Tatpally, After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof an area of 4 acres, 25 guntas out of S.No.33, as may be pointed out by the plaintiff, may be given. The District office has been addressed accordingly.

5. Narsimloo has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 34 measuring 5 acres 16 guntas, bearing a land revenue of Rs.60/- situated out Jatpally, After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof an area of 5 Acres 16 Guntas may be given out of S.No.33 situated outside the reserved forest. The District office has been addressed accordingly.

6. Bomma Rajaga has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 202 and 203 measuring 17 Acres 20 guntas bearing land Revenue of Rs.24.120 situated at Mahal. After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof and the area of 17 acres 20 guntas which is situated in paramboke outside the R.F. as pointed out by the plaintiff may be given. Accordingly the district office has been addressed.

7. Maked Rajalah, has put forth his claim in respect of S.No.s 52 and 53 measuring 13 Acres 36 Guntas bearing a land revenue of Rs. 8-8-0 situated at Devampally. After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof an area of 13 Acres 36 Guntas (Kharaj-Math) bearing a land revenue of Rs.13/- situated at Babanur may be given. The district office has been addressed accordingly.

After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof Rs. 34/- may be paid as compensation the district office has been addressed to comply with.

12. Vasu S/o Matiya has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 40, measuring 1 acre 20 guntas, bearing a land revenue of Rs. 20 situated at Tadlapally. After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof an amount of Rs. 35.14.0 may be paid in cash as compensation. Accordingly the district office has been addressed to comply with.

13. Dadi Raja S/o ... has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 71(Old) S.No. 2(New) measuring 8 Acres 3 guntas, bearing a land revenue of Rs. 2-4-0 situated at Vattipalli, after enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No. may be included in the R.F. along with S.No. 43, and cultivation may be continued, accordingly it has been complied with on the spot.

14. Nematani Ponani has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 12-14, old S.No. 10-12 now is measuring 6 Acres 34 Guntas,

Channan Saathi Yennat Narasimha Rao, has put forth his claim in respect of S.Nos. 14, 12, 10, 84, 3, 1, 2 and 16, measuring 63 acres 29 guntas, bearing a land revenue of 82-12-0, situated at Rudrangi Taluk, Sircilla, after enquiry it has been endorsed that the said Nos. should be excluded from agriculture and be included in the R.F. and in lieu thereof an area of 79 aca. 26 guntas out of the Area left in R.F. situated at Maneyal may be given as compensation after making rule division. For this purpose, it has is not necessary that these areas included in the 'Givai Jamabandi' be distrubed against the opinion of the revenue Department, the district office has been addressed accordingly. Aggrieved by the decision, the plaintiff, submitted an appeal in the Divisional Commissioner's office; which was admitted with modifications. Aggrieved by this decision, the plaintiff, submitted a revision petition, to the Government. It was decided by the Government that there is no need to entertain the application and it may be sent to the division commissionerate and the Collectorate, so that the compensation of the land may be given according to conence to the applicant, on the account of that the S.No.1, 2, 3, 4, 8 shall be included in the Maneyal enclosure and the compensation for S.Nos. 10, 12, 14, 16 may be given out of the enclosure land the district office has been addressed accordingly.

After enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the reserved forest, and in lieu thereof an area of 1 acre 3 guntas out of S.No.98 Khadi Katha may be given the district office has been addressed accordingly.

Lambada Rajaga has put forth his claim in respect of 20 Acres out of S.No.491 Paramboke situated at Barri adia, during enquiry it was found that the patta of this land is in the name of the plaintiff but it is being cultivated by Sivai Jamabandi without permission, therefore it has been decided that the application is rejected and the cultivation continues.

Bhagvanth Rao, has put forth his claim in respect of S.Nos. 9, 11, 16, measuring 4 Acres 25 guntas, bearing a land revenue of 3-8-0, situated at Ganguraj, during enquiry the plaintiff did not prove the patta of the said nos. in his name, therefore it was decided that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture and he included in the reserved forest without any compensation the district office has been addressed accordingly.

Maleyal Chirolu has put forth his claim in respect of S.Nos. 1 measuring 4 acres 33 Guntas, bearing a land revenue of Rs.3/- situated at Appa Pally, taluk Jagthial, after enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the reserved forest, and in lieu thereof an area of 6 Acres out of S.No.206 pambake outside the reserved forest, situated at Maneyal, may be given after making sub-division the district office has been addressed accordingly.

20. Appa Gangaram, has put forth his claim in respect of S.Nos.2 and 4 measuring 13 Acres 4 guntas bearing land revenue of 6-12-0, situated at appapally, after enquiry it has been endorsed that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture, and the area in the A.F. and in lieu thereof an area of 16 Acres, 20 guntas out of S.No.206 situated at Maneyal, may be given, accordingly the district office has been addressed.

21. Bhagvanth Rao, has put forth his claim in respect of S.Nos. 13, and 14 measuring 18 acres situated at Ganguraj and S.No.31, 32, 39, 42, 46 and 48 measuring 32 Acres 12 guntas, bearing a land revenue of 20-12-0 situated at Tadlapally, after enquiry it has been endorsed that no compensation will be given in respect of S.Nos. 13 and 14 situated at Ganguraj, because proof with regard to patta has not been established, therefore these Nos. will be included in the reserved forest without any compensation and the remaining Nos. i.e. S.No.13 measuring 5 Acres 32 guntas, bearing a land revenue of 3-8-0 situated at Ganguraj, and S.Nos. 31-32 etc. situated at Tadlapally, may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the reserved forest and in lieu thereof an area of 25 Acs. out of S.No.17 situated at Jagthial, enclosure, may be given as may be pointed out by the plaintiff the district office has been addressed accordingly.

Bassatti Venkiah, has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 2 measuring 1 Acre 13 guntas, bearing a land revenue of 1-0-0 situated at Neerla Hamlet of Sangal village, it was found during enquiry that his No. was not included in the R.F. but it was included in the enclosure therefore it has been endorsed that this No. should remain in the enclosure as it is. The district office has been addressed accordingly.

Pandel Razaiah, has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 1 measuring 11 Acs. 16 guntas bearing a land revenue of 0-12-0 situated in the hamlet neerla under Sangal village, after enquiry it has been endorsed that the said No. shall continue to remain in the enclosure, which was established by the Forest Department. This No. is not in the reserved forest but included in the enclosure.

Gopal Kallisham has put forth his claim in respect of S.Nos. 5-6-, 8-11, measuring 24 Acs. 13 guntas bearing a land revenue of Rs. 32/- situated at Potharam, after enquiry it has been endorsed that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the reserved forest, and in lieu thereof an area of 24 Acres 34 guntas out of S.No. 241, situated at Subbaripate, may be given the district office has been addressed accordingly.

26. Nandiah has put forth his claim in respect of S.No. 41.44, measuring 2 Acres 30 guntas, bearing a land revenue of 2-0-0 situated at Tadlepally., after enquiry it has been endorsed, that the said Nos. may be excluded from agriculture and be included in the reserved forest and in lieu thereof an area of 2 Acres, 30 guntas out of S.No. 49 inside the enclosure, may be given. The district office has been addressed accordingly.

Plaintiff submitted an appeal to the Divisional Commissionerate, which was admitted with modifications, aggrieved by the decision a revision petition was submitted to the Government behalf of the plaintiff, on which it was endorsed that there is no need to enter into the revision petition it may be sent to the commissionerate and collectorate, so that compensation of the selected land may be given to the plaintiff considering the convenience. Therefore it has been decided that compensation for S.Nos. 5, 6, 189 included in the enclosure-Maneyal, and S.No.17, should be given from the enclosure, the district office has been addressed accordingly.

5. A pedestrain track Tadlapally to S.No.49 and joins road S.No.1.
6. A pedestrain track from Maneyal to S.No.33 situated at Tadlapally and passes through the Devakapally and Tadlapally boundary thence runs through Karapally paramboke No.44 thence runs through the reserved forest.
7. A pedestrain track runs through Maneyal paramboke No.1 thence through the boundary of Kanapur, thence runs further and enters S.No.325 of Kanapur village, thence runs through the reserved forest.
8. A pedestrain track runs through S.No.206 of Kanapur village and enters S.No.3 situated at Chintakunta and runs through S.No.312.

9. Pedestrian track-Maneyal village to potharam
10. A cart-track from Manyal to Paramboke No.206, situated at Maneyal, and runs through S.No.491, Sangal village and S.No.1 Vattimella village thence runs through the R.F.
11. A cart-track starts from road No.11 and runs through S.No.206 Maneyal, S.No.211 Rudrangi and S.No.491 Sangal then reaches Sangal village.
12. A cart track from Jangal Hamlet to Ravtia village boundary thence runs through the reserved forest.
13. A pedestrian track-starts from Road No.13 to Chamanpally.

These tracks shall be kept opened day and night for cattle and human beings.
