उपर्युक्त विषयक प्रसंगाधीन पत्र के संबंध में सूचित करना है कि मेसर्स बी0सी0सी0एल0 अन्तर्गत बरोरा क्षेत्र के मुराईडीह कोलियरी हेतु प्रस्तावित 133.69 हेठु (46.17 हेठु वनभूमि एवं 87.52 हेठु जंगल—झाड़ी) वनभूमि अपयोजन प्रस्ताव में भारत सरकार, पर्यावरण, वन एवं जलवायु परिवर्तन मंत्रालय, नई दिल्ली के पत्रांक— 8-08/2025-FC दिनांक— 08.10.2025 द्वारा कुल 12 बिन्दुओं पर पृच्छा की गई है। इस संबंध में इस कार्यालय के प्रासंगिक पत्र द्वारा प्रयोक्त अभिकरण परियोजना पदाधिकारी, मुराईडीह कोलियरी परियोजना, बी0सी0सी0एल0 से प्रतिवेदन की मांग किया गया था, उनके द्वारा पत्रांक— 2678 दिनांक— 30.12.2025 से पृच्छा का निराकरण प्रतिवेदन समर्पित किया गया है। बिन्दुवार निराकरण प्रतिवेदन निम्नवत है :—


