



The user agency in the instant proposal has reported that the forest land is required for Muraidih-Phularitand (Part) Colliery whereas the State Govt. in their covering letter has stated that the proposal is for Muraidih Colliery. The factually correct details in this regard shall be submitted along with documentary evidence.	The approved mining plan for Muraidih Colliery, covering an area of 717.71 hectares is enclosed (Annexure I). Earlier, the Mining Plan of Muraidih Phularitand (part) was enclosed. However, Revised Mining Plan for Muraidih Colliery is now approved in 429 th BCCL Board Meeting held on 15.11.2025. Copy of Approval of Mining Plan and Mining Plan of Muraidih Colliery (717.71 ha) is enclosed. (Annexure II) The same may be considered.

The eastern and northern boundary of Muraidih Longwall underground Project is bounded by Khodo nala which is a seasonal one but during rainy season, huge water from catchment area of northern side flows through this nala. In the western side of the property there are local nala's which are feeding this khodo nala. This might a vulnerable source of danger towards inundation by surface water as such it will be necessary to keep round the clock vigil during monsoon especially when the water flows near the danger level. The Khodo nala has a past record of 197.43m as highest flood level as shown in surface plan. As per DGMS stipulation, substantial coal to be left as safety barrier if mining to be done below. In order to maximize the coal recovery & ensure higher safety, it has been planned to divert the Khodo nala beyond the Northern boundary. The coal whatever is available within the economic range of open cast mine are to be taken out before the last few panels of Seam III are extracted.

The excavation of the respective seams may lead to inrush of water into the quarry from connected galleries. For safety point of view the quarry edge is proposed at a distance of 60 m from the edge of Khodo Nala. But along with standard procedures permission from DGMS should be obtained before the start of work in the proposed quarries along the Khodo Nala. Adequate

	<p>precaution has been taken into account while deciding the quarry boundary and the final pit floor limit so that the operational area of the quarry does not come within 60m of any operational underground workings which is likely to contain an accumulation of water or other liquid matter or any material that is likely to flow when wet. 



The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 17th August, 1972, and is hereby published for general information:—

THE COKING COAL MINES (NATIONALISATION)
 ACT, 1972
 NO. 36 OF 1972

[17th August, 1972.]

An Act to provide for the acquisition and transfer of the right, title and interest of the owners of the coking coal mines specified in the First Schedule, and the right, title and interest of the owners of such coke oven plants as are in or about the said coking coal mines with a view to reorganising and reconstructing such mines and plants for the purpose of protecting, conserving and promoting scientific development of the resources of coking coal needed to meet the growing requirements of the iron and steel industry and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by Parliament in the Twenty-third Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

CHAPTER I
 PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Act may be called the Coking Coal Mines (Nationalisation) Act, 1972. Short title and commencement.
 (2) The provisions of sections 30 and 31 shall come into force at once and the remaining provisions of this Act shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of May, 1972.

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Declaration as to the policy of the State.

2. It is hereby declared that this Act is for giving effect to the policy of the State towards securing the principles specified in clause (b) of article 39 of the Constitution.

Explanation.—in this section, "State" has the same meaning as in article 12 of the Constitution.

Definitions.

3. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "appointed day" means the 1st day of May, 1972;

(b) "coke oven plant" means the plant and equipment with which the manufacture of hard coke has been, or is being, carried on, and includes—

(i) all lands, buildings, works, machinery and equipment, vehicles, railways, tramways and sidings, belonging to, or in, the coke oven plant,

(ii) all workshops belonging to the coke oven plant, including buildings, machinery, instruments, stores, equipment of such workshops and the lands on which such workshops stand,

(iii) all coke in stock or under production, and other stores, stocks and instruments, belonging to the coke oven plant,

(iv) all power stations belonging to the coke oven plant or operated for supplying electricity for the purpose of working the coke oven plant or a number of coke oven plants,

(v) all lands, buildings and equipment belonging to the coke oven plant where the washing of coal is carried on,

(vi) all other fixed assets, movable or immovable, and current assets belonging to a coke oven plant, whether within its premises or outside.

Explanation.—"Current assets" do not include dues from sundry debtors, loans and advances to other parties and investments, not being investments in the coke oven plant;

(c) "coking coal mine" means a coal mine in which there exists two or more seams of coking coal, whether exclusively or in addition to any seam of other coal;

(d) "company" means a company as defined in section 3 of the Companies Act, 1956, and includes a foreign company within the meaning of section 591 of that Act;

(e) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Payments appointed under section 20;

(f) "Custodian" means the Custodian appointed under sub-section (2) of section 14, to take over, or carry on, the management of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant;

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(g) "date of assent" means the date on which assent is given by the President to this Act;

(h) "Government company" has the meaning assigned to it by section 617 of the Companies Act, 1956;

(i) "managing contractor" means the person, or body of persons, who, with the previous Consent in writing of the State Government, has entered into an arrangement, contract or understanding, with the owner of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant under which the operations of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant are substantially controlled by such person or body of persons;

(j) "mine" means any excavation where any operation for the purpose of searching for or obtaining minerals has been or is being carried on, and includes—

- (i) all borings and bore holes;
- (ii) all shafts adjacent to, and belonging to, or in, a mine, whether in the course of being sunk or not;
- (iii) all levels and inclined planes in the course of being driven;
- (iv) all open cast working;
- (v) all conveyors or aerial ropeways provided for bringing into or removal from a mine of minerals or other articles or for the removal of refuse therefrom;
- (vi) all lands, buildings, works, adits, levels, planes, machinery and equipment, vehicles, railways, tramways and sidings belonging to, or in, or about, a mine;
- (vii) all workshops belonging to, or in, a mine, including buildings, machinery, instruments, stores, equipment of such workshops and the lands on which such workshop stand;
- (viii) all coal in stock or in transit or under production and other stores, stocks and instruments belonging to, or in, a mine;
- (ix) all power stations belonging to, or in, a mine or operated for supplying electricity for the purpose of working the mine or a number of mines;
- (x) all lands, buildings and equipment belonging to, or in, a mine where the washing of coal or manufacture of coke is carried on;
- (xi) all other fixed assets, movable or immovable, and current assets, belonging to a mine, whether within its premises or outside.

Explanation.—"Current assets" do not include dues from sundry debtors, loans and advances to other parties and investments, not being investments in the coking coal mine;

(2) For the removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that if, after the appointed day, any other coal mine is found, after an investigation made by the Coal Board, to contain coking coal, the provisions of the Coking Coal Mines (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1971, shall, until that mine is nationalised by an appropriate legislation, apply to such mine.

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5. On the appointed day, the right, title and interest of the owners of each of the coke oven plants specified in the Second Schedule, being the coke oven plants which are situated in or about the coking coal mines specified in the First Schedule, shall stand transferred to, and shall vest absolutely in, the Central Government, free from all incumbrances.

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Acquisition of rights of owners of coke oven plants.

6. (1) Where the rights of an owner under any mining lease granted, or deemed to have been granted, in relation to a coking coal mine, by a State Government or any other person, vest in the Central Government under section 4, the Central Government shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the lessee of the State Government or such other person, as the case may be, in relation to such coking coal mine, as if a mining lease in relation to such coking coal mine had been granted to the Central Government under the Mineral Concession Rules, the period of such lease being the entire period for which such lease could have been granted by the State Government or such other person under those Rules and, thereupon, all the rights under such mining lease, including surface, underground and other rights granted to the lessee shall be deemed to have been transferred to, and vested in, the Central Government.

Central Government to be the lessee of the State Government.

(2) On the expiry of the term of any lease, referred to in sub-section (1), such lease shall, if so desired by the Central Government be renewed, on the same terms and conditions on which the lease was held on the appointed day, by the lessor for the maximum period for which such lease can be renewed under the Mineral Concession Rules.

7. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in sections 4 to 6 (both inclusive), the Central Government may, if it is satisfied that a Government company is willing to comply, or has complied, with such terms and conditions as that Government may think fit to impose, direct, by an order in writing, that the right, title and interest of an owner in relation to a coking coal mine or coke oven plant referred to, respectively, in section 4 or section 5 shall, instead of continuing to vest in the Central Government, vest in the Government company either on the date of publication of the direction or on such earlier or later date (not being a date earlier than the appointed day), as may be specified in the direction.

Power of Central Government to direct vesting rights in a Government company.

(2) Where the right, title and interest of an owner in relation to a coking coal mine or coke oven plant vest in a Government company under sub-section (1), the Government company shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become—

(a) the lessee in relation to such coking coal mine as if a mining lease in relation to such coking coal mine had been granted to the Government company under the Mineral Concession Rules, the period of such lease being the entire period for which such lease could have been granted under those Rules;

(b) the owner of the coke oven plant,

and all the rights and liabilities of the Central Government in relation to such coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the rights and liabilities, respectively, of the Government company.

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CHAPTER III

PAYMENT OF AMOUNT

10. The owner of every coking coal mine or group of coking coal mines specified in the second column of the First Schedule, shall be given by the Central Government, in cash and in the manner specified in section 21, for vesting in it, under section 4, the right, title and interest of the owner in relation to such coking coal mine or group of coking coal mines, an amount equal to the amount specified against it in the corresponding entry in the fifth column of the said Schedule. Payment of amount to owners of coking coal mines.

11. The owner of every coke oven plant specified in the second column of the Second Schedule, shall be given by the Central Government, in cash and in the manner specified in section 21, for vesting in it, under section 5, the right, title and interest of the owner in relation to such coke oven plant, an amount equal to the amount specified against it in the corresponding entry in the fifth column of the said Schedule. Payment of amount to owners of coke oven plants.

12. (1) In consideration of the retrospective operation of the provisions of section 4 and section 5, there shall be given by the Central Government, in cash, to the owner of every coking coal mine specified in the First Schedule or the owner of every coke oven plant specified in the Second Schedule, an amount equal to the amount which would have been, but for the provisions of the said section 4 or section 5, as the case may be, payable to such owner under the Coking Coal Mines (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1971, for the period commencing on the 1st day of May, 1972, and ending on the date of assent. Payment of further amount.

(2) In addition to the amount specified in sub-section (1), there shall be given by the Central Government, in cash, to the owner of every coking coal mine specified in the First Schedule and the owner of every coke oven plant specified in the Second Schedule, simple interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum on the amount specified against such owner in the corresponding entry in the fifth column of the First Schedule or the Second Schedule, as the case may be, for the period commencing on the date of assent and ending on the date of payment of such amount to the Commissioner.

(3) The amounts referred to in sub-section (1) and sub-section (2) shall be in addition to the amount specified in the First Schedule or the Second Schedule, as the case may be.

13. (1) Where, in pursuance of any decree, order or injunction made by a court, the Central Government or the Custodian appointed under the Coking Coal Mines (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1971, was prevented from taking over the management of any coking coal mine or coke oven plant, the owner of such coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall render, within sixty days from the date of assent, to the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be, accounts, in relation to the period commencing on the appointed day and ending on the date of assent, with regard to the— Income derived by the owners of coking coal mines and coke oven plants after the appointed day to be refunded to the Central Government.

(a) assets or stores of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant acquired or sold by him during the said period;

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(b) coal or coke sold or despatched during the said period;

(c) income derived by him from the coking coal mine or coke oven plant during the said period.

(2) If, on examination of the accounts referred to in sub-section (1), any income is found to have been derived by the owner from the coking coal mine or coke oven plant during the period referred to in that sub-section, such income shall be set off against the amount specified in the First Schedule or the Second Schedule, as the case may be, against the name of such owner, and the balance of such amount shall be paid to him.

(3) If no account is rendered by the owner of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant within the period referred to in sub-section (1) or if the Central Government or the Government company has any reason to believe that the account rendered by such owner is incorrect or false in material particulars, the Central Government or the Government company may refer the matter to the Commissioner and thereupon the Commissioner shall determine the income derived by the owner from the coking coal mine or coke oven plant during the period referred to in sub-section (1), and set off such income against the amount specified in the First Schedule or the Second Schedule, as the case may be, against the name of such owner and pay the balance to such owner.

CHAPTER IV

MANAGEMENT, ETC., OF COKING COAL MINES AND COKE OVEN PLANTS

Management, etc., of coking coal mines and coke oven plants.

14. (1) The general superintendence, direction, control and management of the affairs and business of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, the right, title and interest of an owner in relation to which have vested in the Central Government under section 4 or section 5, as the case may be, shall,—

(a) in the case of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, in relation to which a direction has been made by the Central Government under sub-section (1) of section 7, vest in the Government company specified in such direction, or

(b) in the case of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, in relation to which no such direction has been made by the Central Government, vest in one or more Custodians appointed by the Central Government under sub-section (2),

and thereupon the Government company so specified or the Custodian so appointed, as the case may be, shall be entitled to exercise all such powers and do all such things as the owner of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant is authorised to exercise and do.

(2) The Central Government may appoint an individual or a Government company as the Custodian of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant in relation to which no direction has been made by it under sub-section (1) of section 7.

Duty of persons in-charge of management of coking coal mines or coke oven plants to deliver all assets.

15. (1) On the vesting of the management of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant in a Government company or on the appointment of a Custodian, all persons in charge of the management of such coking coal mine or coke oven plant immediately before such vesting or appointment, shall be bound to deliver to the Government company or Custodian, as the case may be, all assets, books of account, registers or other documents in their custody relating to the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, and any contract, whether written or implied, relating thereto.

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management of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant made before the appointed day between such persons and the owners of such coking coal mine or coke oven plant, shall be deemed to have terminated on the date on which the management of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant vests in the Government company or the Custodian so appointed.

(2) The Central Government may issue such directions as it may deem desirable in the circumstances of the case to the Government company or Custodian as to its or his powers and duties and the Government company or Custodian may, also if it or he so desires, apply to the Central Government at any time for instructions as to the manner in which the management of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall be conducted by it or him or in relation to any other matter arising in the course of such management.

(3) The Custodian shall receive from the funds of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, in relation to which he or it is the Custodian, such remuneration as the Central Government may fix and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Central Government.

16. The Custodian of every coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall maintain the accounts of such mine or plant in such manner and under such conditions as may be prescribed. Accounts and audit

CHAPTER V

PROVISIONS RELATING TO EMPLOYEES OF COKING COAL MINES AND COKE OVEN PLANTS

14 of 1947. 17. (1) Every person who is a workman within the meaning of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, and has been, immediately before the appointed day, in the employment of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, shall become on and from the appointed day, an employee of the Central Government, or, as the case may be, of the Government company in which the right, title and interest of such mine or plant have vested under this Act, and shall hold office or service in the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, on the same terms and conditions and with the same rights to pension, gratuity and other matters as would have been admissible to him if the rights in relation to such coking coal mine or coke oven plant had not been transferred to, and vested in, the Central Government or Government company, as the case may be, and continue to do so unless and until his employment in such coking coal mine or coke oven plant is duly terminated or until his remuneration, terms and conditions of employment are duly altered, by the Central Government or the Government company. Employment of certain employees to continue.

14 of 1947. (2) The Central Government or the Government company in which the right, title and interest in relation to a coking coal mine or coke oven plant have vested, may employ, on mutually acceptable terms and conditions, any person who is not a workman within the meaning of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, and who has been, immediately before the appointed day, in the employment of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, and on such employment the said person shall become an employee of the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be.

(3) Save as otherwise provided in sub-sections (1) and (2), the services of every person employed by the owner or occupier of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant before the appointed day shall stand terminated on and from the specified date.

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(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, or in any other law for the time being in force, the transfer of the services of any officer or other employee from a coking coal mine or coke oven plant to any other coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall not entitle such officer or other employee to any compensation under this Act or any other law for the time being in force and no such claim shall be entertained by any court, tribunal or other authority.

(5) Where, under the terms of any contract of service or otherwise, any person whose service becomes terminated, or whose service becomes transferred to the Central Government or a Government company by reason of the provisions of this Act, is entitled to any payment by way of gratuity or retirement benefit or for any leave not availed of, or any other benefits, such person may enforce his claim against the owner of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, but not against the Central Government or the Government company. 4/

Provident fund.

18. (1) Where a coking coal mine or coke oven plant has established a provident fund for the benefit of its employees, the monies relatable to the employees, whose services have become transferred, by or under this Act, to the Central Government or a Government company, shall, out of the monies standing, on the appointed day, to the credit of such provident fund, stand transferred to, and vest in, the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be.

(2) The monies which stand transferred, under sub-section (1), to the Central Government or a Government company shall be dealt with by that Government or company, as the case may be, in such manner as may be prescribed.

Superannuation, welfare and other funds.

19. Where a superannuation, welfare or other fund has been established for the benefit of the employees whose services stand transferred to the Central Government or a Government company, the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, by which such employees were employed, shall distribute the amount due to each such employee as if the employee had superannuated, or his services with the coking coal mine or coke oven plant had terminated, on the day immediately preceding the specified date.

CHAPTER VI

COMMISSIONER OF PAYMENTS

Commissioner of Payments to be appointed.

20. (1) For the purpose of disbursing the amounts payable to the owner of each coking coal mine or coke oven plant, the Central Government shall appoint such person as it may think fit to be the Commissioner of Payments.

(2) The Central Government may appoint such other persons as it may think fit to assist the Commissioner.

(3) The salaries and allowances of the Commissioner and other persons appointed under this section shall be defrayed out of the Consolidated Fund of India.

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14 of 1947

21. (1) The Central Government shall, within thirty days from the specified date, pay, in cash, to the Commissioner, for payment to the owner of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, a sum equal to the sum specified against the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, in the First Schedule or the Second Schedule together with the amount and interest, if any, referred to in section 12.

(2) In addition to the sum referred to in sub-section (1), the Central Government shall pay, in cash, to the Commissioner, such amount as may become due to the owner of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant in relation to the period during which the management of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant remained vested in the Central Government.

(3) The Commissioner shall open and operate an account in a scheduled bank in respect of each coking coal mine or coke oven plant.

(4) Every amount paid to the Commissioner shall be deposited to the credit of the account, referred to in sub-section (3), of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant to which the payment relates.

(5) Interest accruing on the amount standing to the credit of the account referred to in sub-section (3) shall accrue to the benefit of the owner of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be.

(6) References in this section to the owner of a coking coal mine shall, in relation to a group of coking coal mines specified in the First Schedule, be construed as references to the owner of that group of coking coal mines.

22. (1) The Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be, shall cause the books in relation to each coking coal mine or coke oven plant, the management of which has vested in it under the Coking Coal Mines (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1971, to be closed and balanced as on the 30th day of April, 1972, and shall cause a statement of accounts, as on that day, to be prepared, within such time, in such form and in such manner as may be prescribed, in relation to each such mine or plant in respect of the transactions effected by it during the period for which the management of such coking coal mine or coke oven plant remained vested in it:

Provided that where two or more coking coal mines or coke oven plants were owned, before the commencement of this Act, by the same owner, a consolidated statement of accounts may be prepared for all the coking coal mines or coke oven plants owned by such owner.

(2) All amounts received by the Central Government or the Government company after the closure of such accounts shall, where such amounts relate to transactions effected before the appointed day, be included in the said statement of accounts in respect of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant to which the said receipt relates.

(3) The Central Government or the Government company in which the right, title and interest of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant stands vested shall be entitled to receive, up to the specified date, to the exclusion of all other persons, any money, due to the coking coal mine or

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coke oven plant, as the case may be, realised after appointed day notwithstanding that the realisations pertain to a period prior to the appointed day:

Provided that where such realisations have not been included in the statement of accounts as on the 30th day of April, 1972, a supplementary statement of accounts shall be prepared and furnished, at such intervals as may be prescribed, by the Central Government or the Government company to the owner of the coking coal mine or the coke oven plant, as the case may be.

(4) The liabilities of the coking coal mine or the coke oven plant (not being liabilities arising out of advances made by the Central Government or Government company), which could not be discharged by the appointed day, may be discharged by the Central Government or the Government company up to the specified date, and every payment made for the settlement with the owner shall be included in the statement of accounts as on the 30th day of April, 1972, indicating therein the period in relation to which the payments were made:

Provided that the liabilities in relation to the period prior to the appointed day, which have not been discharged on or before the specified date, shall be the liabilities of the owner of the coking coal mine or the coke oven plant, as the case may be.

(5) A copy of each statement of accounts prepared under this section shall be delivered by the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be, to the Commissioner and also to the owner:

Provided that where the number of owners is more than one, only one copy of the statement of accounts shall be given to the owners for the benefit of all of them.

(6) The statement of accounts prepared under this section shall be audited by a person who is qualified to be appointed as an auditor of a company under section 226 of the Companies Act, 1956, and the auditor so appointed shall receive, from the funds of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, such remuneration as the Central Government may fix.

(7) The audit of the statement of accounts shall be conducted in such manner as the Central Government may direct.

Claims
to be
made to

23. (1) Every person having a claim against the owner of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall prefer such claim before the Commissioner within thirty days from the specified date:

Provided that if the Commissioner is satisfied that the claimant was prevented by sufficient cause from preferring the claim within the said period of thirty days, he may, on the expiry of the said period of thirty days, entertain the claim within a further period of thirty days, but not thereafter.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, there shall be paid in priority to all other unsecured debts, not being the amounts advanced by the Central Government or

Minister: The Commission appointed under the Coking Coal Mines (Emergency Powers) Act, 1971, for the investigation of the coking coal mines or coke oven plants, as the case may be:-

(a) all wages or salary (including wages payable for time or piece work and salary earned wholly or in part by way of commission) of any employee, in the case of losses rendered to the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, by compensation payable to any workman under any provisions of Chapter IV of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947;

(b) all amounts due in respect of contributions made by the twelve months preceding the appointed day, to the C. M. P. Fund, Family Allowance Bonus Scheme Act, 1961, or any other law or scheme in force;

(c) all amounts due in respect of any wages, allowances or compensation payable by the owner of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, to any employee in respect of the decrease, if any, in the capacity of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, unless such wages, allowances or compensation are constituted in a sum not less than the sum due, rights capable of being transferred by and vested in the owner;

(d) all sums due to any employee from a provident fund, gratuity fund or any other fund established for the welfare of the employees of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant;

(e) all sums due to the State Government or any other Government, as the case may be;


(f) the debts specified in column 3) shall rank as first priorities and be paid in full, before the 30th June, 1971, in respect of the amount which can be claimed by the claimant in respect of his claim, in respect of his claim;

(g) The Commission, on or before a certain date in or before 1971, shall publish a list of the names of the claimants in respect of the benefit of the rights specified by the claimants;

(h) Not less than 14 days before the date specified by the Commission, the claimants shall be given a copy of the notice of the Commission, and the date and time of the hearing of the claim, and the place where the hearing will be held;

(i) Every claimant shall be given, on the ground of his claim, a copy of the notice of the Commission, and the date and time of the hearing of the claim, and the place where the hearing will be held;

(j) The Commission, after the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, has given its opinion, be necessary and after giving the owner of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, an opportunity of refuting the statement and after giving the claimant a reasonable opportunity of being heard, in written form or reject the claim in whole or in part;


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(8) The Commissioner shall have the power to regulate his own procedure in all matters arising out of the discharge of his functions including the place or places at which he will hold his sittings and shall, for the purpose of making any investigation under this Act, have the same powers as are vested in a civil court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, while trying a suit, in respect of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) the summoning and enforcing the attendance of any witness and examining him on oath;
- (b) the discovery and production of any document or other material object producible as evidence;
- (c) the reception of evidence on affidavits;
- (d) the issuing of any commission for the examination of witnesses.

(9) Any investigation before the Commissioner shall be deemed to be a judicial proceeding within the meaning of sections 193 and 228 of the Indian Penal Code and the Commissioner shall be deemed to be a civil court for the purposes of section 193 and Chapter XXXV of the CODE of Criminal Procedure, 1898.

5 of 1898.

(10) A claimant who is dissatisfied with the decision of the Commissioner may prefer an appeal against the decision, to the principal civil court of original jurisdiction within the local limits of whose jurisdiction the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, as the case may be, is situated.

Disbursement of money by the Commissioner.

24. Where the total amount of the claim admitted by the Commissioner does not exceed the total amount of the money credited to the account of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, every such admitted claim shall rank equally among themselves and be paid in full, and the balance, if any, shall be paid to the owner, but where such amount is insufficient to meet in full the total amount of the admitted claims, every such claim shall abate in equal proportions and be paid accordingly.

Amounts advanced by the Central Government how to be recovered.

25. Every amount advanced by the Central Government or the Custodian, as the case may be, for the management of a coking coal mine or coke oven plant shall be recovered from the income derived by such coking coal mine or coke oven plant in respect of the period during which the management of such mine or plant remained vested in the Central Government:

Provided that where such income is insufficient to meet in full the total amount of the advances made by the Central Government or the Custodian for the management of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant, the Central Government may make a claim to the Commissioner for the deficiency of the amount so advanced and the claim in respect of such deficiency shall have priority over the claims of all other unsecured creditors of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant.

Explanation.—In this section, "Custodian" means the Custodian appointed under the Coking Coal Mines (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1971.

Disputes how to be dealt with.

26. (i) In the event of there being a doubt or dispute as to the right of a person to receive the whole or any part of the amount referred to in sections 10, 11 and 12, the Commissioner shall refer the matter to the court for a decision, and shall make the disbursements in accordance with the decision of the court.

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(2) In relation to a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, the operations of which were, immediately before the 17th day of October, 1971 under the control of a managing contractor, the amount specified in the First Schedule against such coking coal mine or in the Second Schedule against such coke oven plant shall be apportioned between the owner of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant and such managing contractor in such proportions as may be agreed upon by or between the owner and such managing contractor, and in the event of there being no such agreement, in such proportions as may be determined by the court.

Explanation.—In this section, "court", in relation to a coking coal mine or coke oven plant, means the principal civil court of original jurisdiction within the local limits of whose jurisdiction the coking coal mine or coke oven plant is situated.

27. Any money paid to the Commissioner which remains undisbursed or unclaimed after such payment for a period of three years shall be transferred by the Commissioner to the general revenue account of the Central Government; but a claim to any money so transferred may be preferred to the Central Government by the person entitled to such payment and shall be dealt with as if such transfer had not been made, the order, if any, for payment of the claim being treated as an order for the refund of revenue.

CHAPTER VII

MISCELLANEOUS

28. The provisions of this Act shall have effect notwithstanding anything inconsistent therewith contained in any other law for the time being in force or in any instrument having effect by virtue of any law other than this Act, or in any decree or order of any court, tribunal or other authority.

29. (1) Every contract entered into by the owner or occupier of any coking coal mine or coke oven plant for any service, sale or supply before the appointed day shall, on and from the expiry of one hundred and twenty days from the date of assent, cease to have effect unless such contract is, before the expiry of that period, ratified, in writing, by the Central Government and in ratifying such contract the Central Government may make such alterations or modifications therein as it may think fit:

Provided that the Central Government shall not omit to ratify a contract unless it is satisfied that such contract is unduly onerous or has been entered into in bad faith or is detrimental to the interests of the coking coal mine or coke oven plant.

(2) The Central Government shall not omit to ratify a contract or make any alteration or modification therein except after giving to the parties to the contract a reasonable opportunity of being heard and except after recording in writing its reasons for refusal to ratify the contract.

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Penalties. 30. Any person who,—

(a) having in his possession, custody or control of any property forming part of the undertaking of any coking coal mine or coke oven plant referred to in the First Schedule or the Second Schedule, as the case may be, wrongfully withholds such property from the Central Government, or Government company, or

(b) wrongfully obtains possession of, or retains, any property forming part of the undertaking of any coking coal mine or coke oven plant referred to in the First Schedule or the Second Schedule, as the case may be, or wilfully withholds or fails to furnish to the Central Government or any person specified by that Government, any document relating to such coking coal mine or coke oven plant, which may be in his possession, custody or control, or fails to deliver to the Custodian any assets, books of account, registers or other documents in his custody relating to the coking coal mine or coke oven plant in respect of which a Custodian has been appointed, or

(c) wrongfully removes or destroys any property of any coking coal mine or coke oven plant or prefers any claim under this Act in relation to such mine or plant, which he knows or has reasonable cause to believe to be false or grossly inaccurate,

shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, or with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees, or with both.

Offences by companies.

31. (1) Where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company, every person who at the time the offence was committed was in charge of, and was responsible to, the company for the conduct of the business of the company as well as the company, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly:

Provided that nothing contained in this sub-section shall render any such person liable to any punishment, if he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he had exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (1), where any offence under this Act has been committed with the consent or connivance of, or is attributable to, any neglect on the part of, any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

Explanation.—For the purposes of this section,—

(a) "company" means any body corporate and includes a firm or other association of individuals; and

(b) "director", in relation to a firm, means a partner in the firm.

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32. No proceeding for the winding up of a mining company, the right, title and interest in relation to the coking coal mine or coke oven plant owned by which have vested in the Central Government or in a Government company under this Act or for the appointment of a receiver in respect of such business, shall lie in any court except with the consent of the Central Government.

33. (1) The Central Government may, by notification, direct that all or any of the powers exercisable by it under this Act may also be exercised by any person or persons as may be specified in the notification.

(2) Whenever any delegation of power is made under sub-section (1), the person to whom such power has been delegated shall act under the direction, control and supervision of the Central Government.

34. (1) The Central Government may, by notification, make rules to carry out the provisions of this Act.

(2) In particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

(a) the manner in which the coking coal mines or coke oven plants shall be managed by a Government company or a Custodian;

(b) the manner in which provident fund monies referred to in section 18 shall be dealt with;

(c) the form and manner in which the statement of accounts referred to in section 22 shall be prepared;

(d) any other matter in relation to which such rule is required to be, or may be, made.

(3) Every rule made by the Central Government under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of Parliament, while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in making any modification in the rule or both Houses agree that the rule should not be made, the rule shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be; so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

35. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Central Government may, by order, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, remove the difficulty.

Provided that no such order shall be made after the expiry of a period of two years from the date of assent.

36. Nothing in this Act shall apply to any coking coal mine—

(a) owned or managed by a Government company or corporation owned or controlled by Government;

(b) owned or managed by a company engaged in the production of iron or steel;

Provided that this section shall not extend to such mine or part thereof, of which, in the opinion of the Central Government, is in excess of the requirements for the production of iron and steel by that company.

THE COAL MINES (NATIONALISATION) ACT, 1973

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THE SCHEDULE

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THE COAL MINES (NATIONALISATION) ACT, 1973
(NO. 26 OF 1973)

(30th May, 1973)

An Act to provide for the acquisition and transfer of the right, title and interest of the owners in respect of the coal mines specified in the schedule with a view to re-organising and reconstructing such coal mines so as to ensure the rational, co-ordinated and scientific development and utilisation of coal resources consistent with the growing requirements of the country, in order that the ownership and control of such resources are vested in the State and thereby so distributed as best to subserve the common good, and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by Parliament in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Act may be called the Coal Mines (Nationalisation) Act, 1973.

SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

(2) The provisions of sections 30 and 31 shall come into force at once and the remaining provisions of this Act shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of May, 1973.

(1-A) DECLARATION AS TO EXPEDIENCY OF UNION CONTROL:

(1) It is hereby declared that it is expedient in the public interest that the Union should take under its control the regulation and development of coal mines to the extent hereinafter provided and development of coal mines to the extent hereinafter provided in sub-sections (3) and (4) of Sec. 3 and sub-section (2) of Sec. 30.

(2) The declaration contained in sub-section (1) is in addition to, and not in derogation of, the declaration contained in Sec. 2 of the Mines and Minerals (Regulation and Development) Act, 1957 (67 of 1957).

DEFINITIONS:

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:-

- (a) "appointed day" means the 1st day of May, 1973;
- (b) "coal mine" means a mine in which there exists one or more seams of coal;
- (c) "company" means a company as defined in section 3 of the Companies Act, 1956, (1 of 1956) and includes a foreign company within the meaning of section 591 of that Act;

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(d) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Payments appointed under section 17;

(e) "Custodian" means the Custodian appointed under sub-section (2) of section 11, to take over, or carry on, the management of a coal mine;

(f) "Government company" has the meaning assigned to it by section 617 of the Companies Act, 1956 (1 of 1956);

(g) "managing contractor" means the person, or body or persons, who, with the previous consent, in writing, of the State Government, has entered into an arrangement, contract or understanding, with the owner of a coal mine under which the operations of the coal mine are substantially controlled by such person or body of persons;

(h) "mine" means any excavation where any operation for the purpose of searching for or obtaining minerals has been or is being carried on, and includes -

- (i) all borings and bore holes;
- (ii) all shafts, whether in the course of being sunk or not;
- (iii) all levels and inclined planes in the course of being driven;
- (iv) all open cast workings;
- (v) all conveyors or aerial ropeways provided for bringing into or removal from a mine of minerals or other articles or for the removal of refuse therefrom;
- (vi) all lands, buildings, works, adits, levels, planes, machinery and equipments, instruments, stores, vehicles, railways, tramways and sidings in, or adjacent to, a mine and used for the purposes of the mine;
- (vii) all workshops (including buildings, machinery, instruments, stores, equipment of such workshops and the lands on which such workshops stand) in, or adjacent to, a mine and used substantially for the purposes of the mine or a number of mines under the same management;
- (viii) all coal belonging to the owner of the mine, whether in stock or in transit, and all coal under production in a mine;
- (ix) all power stations in a mine or operated primarily for supplying electricity for the purpose of working the mine or a number of mines under the same management;
- (x) all lands, buildings, and equipments belonging to the owner of the mine, and in, adjacent to or situated on the surface of, the mine where the washing of coal obtained from the mine or manufacture, therefrom, of coke is carried on;
- (xi) all lands and buildings [other than those referred to in sub-clause (x)], wherever situated, if solely used for the location of the management, sale or liaison offices, or for the residence of officers and staff of the mine;
- (xii) all other fixed assets, movable and immovable, belonging to the owner of a mine, wherever situated, and current assets, belonging to a mine, whether within its premises or outside.

(i) "Mineral Concession Rules" means the rules, for the time being in force, made under the Mines and Minerals (Regulation and Development) Act, 1957 (67 of 1957);

- (j) "mining company" means a company owning a coal mine, and in relation to a foreign company within the meaning of Sec. 591 of the Companies Act, 1956 (1 of 1956), the undertaking of that company in India;
- (k) "notification" means a notification published in the Official Gazette;
- (l) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act;
- (m) "specified date" means such date as the Central Government may, for the purpose of any provision of this Act, by notification, specify; and different dates may be specified for different provisions of this Act;
- (n) words and expressions used herein and not defined but defined in the Coal Mines (Conservation, Safety and Development) Act, 1952 (12 of 1952) have the meanings, respectively, assigned to them in that Act;
- (o) words and expressions used herein and not defined in this Act or in the Coal Mines (Conservation, Safety and Development) Act, 1952 (12 of 1952, but defined in the Mines Act, 1952 (35 of 1952), have the meanings, respectively, assigned to them in the Mines Act, 1952 (35 of 1952).

CHAPTER II

ACQUISITION OF THE RIGHTS OF OWNERS OF COAL MINES

3. ACQUISITION OF RIGHTS OF OWNERS IN RESPECT OF COAL MINES:

- (1) On the appointed day, the right, title and interest of the owners in relation to the coal mines specified in the Schedule shall stand transferred to, and shall vest absolutely in, the Central Government free from all incumbrances.

(2)¹ (x x x x x) •

- (3) On and from the commencement of Section 3 of the Coal Mines (Nationalisation) Amendment Act, 1976:-

(a) no person, other than -

(i) the Central Government or a Government company or a corporation owned, managed or controlled by the Central Government, or

(ii) a person to whom a sub-lease, referred to in the proviso to Cl. (c), has been granted by any such Government, company or corporation, or

(iii) a company engaged in -

1. Sub-section (2) omitted by Act 57 of 1986, Sec.11 (w.e.f. 1st June, 1973)

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- (1) the production of iron and steel,
- (2) generation of power,
- (3) washing of coal obtained from a mine, or
- (4) such other end use as the Central Government may, by notification, specify.

shall carry on coal mining operation, in India, in any form;

- (b) excepting the mining leases granted before such commencement in favour of the Government company or corporation, referred to in Cl.(a), and any sub-lease granted by any such Government company or corporation, all other mining leases and sub-leases in force immediately before such commencement, shall, in so far as they relate to the winning or mining of coal, stand terminated;
- (c) no lease for winning or mining coal shall be granted in favour of any such person other than the Government company or corporation, referred to in Cl.(a):

Provided that the Government, company or corporation to whom a lease for winning or mining coal has been granted may grant a sub-lease to any person in any area on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in the instrument granting the sub-lease, if the Government company or corporation is satisfied that -

- (i) the reserves of coal in the area are in isolated small pockets or are not sufficient for scientific and economical development in a co-ordinated and integrated manner, and
- (ii) the coal produced by the sub-lease will not be required to be transported by rail.

(4) Where a mining lease stands terminated under sub-section (3), it shall be lawful for the Central Government or a Government company or corporation owned or controlled by the Central Government to obtain, a prospecting licence or a mining lease in respect of the whole or part of the land covered by the mining lease which stands so terminated.

(5) If, after the appointed day, the Central Government, is satisfied, whether from any information received by it or otherwise, that there has been any error, omission or misdescription in relation to the particulars of a coal mine included in the Schedule or particulars of a coal mine included in any such coal mine, it may, by notification, correct such error, omission or misdescription and on the issue of such notification, the relevant entries in the Schedule shall be, and shall be deemed always to have been, corrected accordingly.

Provided that no such correction in relation to the ownership of a coal mine shall be made where such ownership is in dispute.

4. CENTRAL GOVERNMENT MAY BE LESSEE OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT

- (1) Where the rights of an owner under any mining lease granted, or deemed to have been granted, in relation to a coal mine, by a State Government or any other person, vest in the Central Government under Sec.3, the Central Government shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the lessee of the State Government or such other person, as the

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case may be, in relation to such coal mine as if a fresh mining lease in relation to such coal mine had been granted to the Central Government and the period of such lease could have been the maximum period for which such lease could have been granted by the State Government or such other person under the Mineral Concession Rules, and thereupon all the rights under such mining lease, including surface, underground and other rights granted to the lessee shall be deemed to have been transferred to, and vested in, the Central Government.

(2) On the expiry of the term of any lease, referred to in sub-section (1), such lease shall, if so desired by the Central Government, be renewed, by the lessor, for the maximum period for which such lease can be renewed under the Mineral Concession Rules.

5. POWER OF CENTRAL GOVERNMENT TO DIRECT VESTING OR RIGHTS IN A GOVERNMENT COMPANY.

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in Secs. 3 and 4, the Central Government may, if it is satisfied, that a Government company is willing to comply, or has complied, with such terms and conditions as that Government may think fit to impose, direct, by an order in writing, that the right, title and interest of an owner in relation to a coal mine referred to in Sec. 3, shall, instead of continuing to vest in the Central Government, vest in the Government Company either on the date of publication of the direction or on such earlier or later date (not being a date earlier than the appointed day), as may be specified in the direction.

(2) Where the right, title and interest of an owner in relation to a coal mine vest in a Government Company under sub-section (1), the Government company shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the lessee in relation to such coal mine as if a mining lease in relation to the coal mine had been granted to the Government company and the period of such lease shall be the entire period for which such lease could have been granted under the Mineral Concession Rules; and all the rights and liabilities of the Central Government in relation to such coal mine shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the rights and liabilities, respectively, of the Government company.

(3) The provisions of sub-section (2) of Sec. 4 shall apply to a lease which vests in a Government company as they apply to a lease vested in the Central Government and references therein to the "Central Government" shall be construed as references to the Government company.

6. PROPERTIES VESTED IN THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT TO BE FREED FROM MORTGAGES, ETC.

(1) All property which vests in the Central Government or in a government company under this Chapter shall, by force of such vesting, be freed and discharged from any trust, obligation, mortgage, charge, lien and all other encumbrances affecting and any attachment, injunction or decree or order of any court restricting the use of such property in any manner shall be deemed to have been withdrawn.

(2) Every mortgage of any property which has vested under this Act in the Central Government or a Government company, and every person holding any charge, lien or other interest in or in relation to any such property shall give, within such time and in such manner as may be prescribed, an intimation to the Commissioner of such mortgage, charge, lien or other interest

(3) For the removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that the mortgagee of any property referred to in sub-section (1) or any other person holding any charge, lien or other interest in, or in relation to any, such property shall be entitled to claim, in accordance with his rights and interests, payment of the mortgage money or other dues, in whole or in part, out of the amount specified in relation to such property in the Schedule, but no such mortgage, charge, lien or other interest shall be enforceable against any property which has vested in the Central Government or the Government Company. ●

7 CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OR GOVERNMENT COMPANY NOT TO BE LIABLE FOR PRIOR LIABILITIES

(1) Every liability of the owner, agent, manager or managing contractor of a coal mine, in respect of any period prior to the appointed day, shall be the liability of such owner, agent, manager or managing contractor, as the case may be, and shall be enforceable against him and not against the Central Government or the Government company.

(2) For the removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that-

(a) save as otherwise provided elsewhere in this Act, no claim for wages, bonus, royalty, rate, rent, taxes, provident fund, pension, gratuity, or any other dues in relation to a coal mine in respect of any period prior to the appointed day, shall be enforceable against the Central Government or the Government company;

(b) no award, decree or order of any court, tribunal or other authority in relation to any coal mine passed after the appointed day, but in relation to any matter, claim or dispute which arose before that day, shall be enforceable against the Central Government or the Government company;

(c) no liability for the contravention, before the appointed day, or any provision of law for the time being in force, shall be enforceable against the Central Government or the Government company.

CHAPTER III

PAYMENT OF AMOUNT

8 PAYMENT OF AMOUNT TO OWNERS OF COAL MINES.

(1) The owner of every coal mine or group of coal mines specified in the second column of the Schedule, shall be given by the Central Government, in cash and in the manner specified in Chapter VI, for the vesting in it, under section 3, of the right, title and interest of the owner in relation to such coal mine or group of coal mines, an amount equal to the amount specified against it in the corresponding entry in the fifth column of the Schedule.

(2) For the removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that amount specified in the fifth column of the Schedule against any coal mine or group of coal mines specified in the second column of the said Schedule and required to be given by the Central Government to its owner under sub-section (1) shall be deemed to include, and deemed always to have included, the amount

require and to be paid for such owner in respect of all coal in stock or other asset referred to in C 1(h) of Sec.2 on the date immediately before the appointed day no further amount shall be payable to the owner in respect of such coal or other assets.

9 PAYMENT OF FURTHER AMOUNT.

(1) In consideration of the retrospective operation of the provisions of Secs 3, 4 and 5, there shall be given by the Central Government, in cash, to the owner of every coal mine or group of coal mines specified in the Schedule, an amount equal to the amount which would have been, but for the provisions of the said Secs 3, 4 and 5, payable to such owner under the Coal Mines (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1973 (15 of 1973), for the period commencing on the 1st day of May, 1973, and ending on the date on which this Act receives the assent of the President.

(2) In addition to the amount referred to in sub-section (1), there shall be given by the Central Government, in cash, to the owner of every coal mine or group of coal mines specified in the Schedule, simple interest at the rate of four per cent per annum on the amount specified against such owner in the corresponding entry in the fifth column of the Schedule for the period commencing on the date on which this Act receives the assent of the President and ending on the date on which payment of such amount is made by the Central Government to the Commissioner.

(3) The amounts referred to in sub-section (1) and sub-section (2) shall be in addition to the amount specified in the Schedule.

10. INCOME DERIVED BY THE OWNERS OF COAL MINES AFTER THE APPOINTED DAY TO BE REFUNDED TO THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT.

(1) Where, in pursuance of any decree, order or injunction of a court or otherwise, the Central Government or the Custodian appointed under the Coal Mines (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1973 (15 of 1973), was prevented from taking over the management of any coal mine, the owner of such coal mine shall render, within sixty days from the date on which management of the coal mine is delivered to the Central Government or Government company, as the case may be, accounts in relation to the period commencing on the date of commencement of the said Act and ending on the date of delivery of such management to the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be with regard to the -

- (a) assets and stores of the coal mine acquired or sold by him during the said period;
- (b) coal sold or despatched during the said period;
- (c) income derived by him from the coal mine during the said period.

(2) If, on examination of the accounts referred to in sub-section (1), any income is found to have been derived by the owner from the coal mine during the period referred to in the sub-section, such income shall be recoverable by the Central Government from the amount payable under section 8 to the owner of such coal mine, and, the debt due to the Central Government on this account shall rank as an unsecured debt.

(3) If no account is rendered by the owner of a coal mine within the period referred to in sub-section (1) or if the Central Government or the Government company has any reason to believe that the account rendered by such owner is incorrect or false in material particulars, the Central Government or the Government company may refer the matter to the Commissioner and thereupon the Commissioner shall determine the income derived by the owner from the coal mine during the period referred to in sub-section (1), and take steps to recover the said income from the amount payable to the owner of the coal mine under section 8, as if the debt due to the Central Government on this account were an unsecured debt.

(4) No mortgage, charge, lien or other encumbrance in relation to a coal mine or any asset thereof shall be binding on the Central Government or the Government company if such mortgage, charge, lien or other encumbrance was created, at any time during the period in which the Central Government or the Custodian was prevented, by any decree, order or injunction of a court or otherwise, from taking over the management of the said coal mine.

CHAPTER IV

MANAGEMENT, ETC., OF COAL MINES

11. MANAGEMENT, ETC., OF COAL MINES.

(1) The general superintendence, direction, control and management of the affairs and business of a coal mine, the right, title and interest of an owner in relation to which have vested in the Central Government under section 3, shall, -

(a) in the case of a coal mine in relation to which a direction has been made by the Central Government under sub-section (1) of section 5, vest in the Government company specified in such direction, or

(b) in the case of a coal mine in relation to which no such direction has been made by the Central Government, vest in one or more Custodians appointed by the Central Government under sub-section (2),

and thereupon the Government company so specified or the Custodian so appointed, as the case may be, shall be entitled to exercise all such powers and do all such things as the owner of the coal mine is authorised to exercise and do.

(2) The Central Government may appoint an individual or a Government company as the Custodian of a coal mine in relation to which no direction has been made by it under sub-section (1) of section 5.

12. DUTY OF PERSONS IN CHARGE OF MANAGEMENT OF COAL MINES TO DELIVER ALL ASSETS, ETC.

(1) On the vesting of the management of a coal mine in a Government Company or on the appointment of a Custodian, all persons in charge of the management of such coal mine immediately before such vesting or appointment, shall be bound to deliver to the Government

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company or the Custodian, as the case may be, all assets, books of account, register or other documents in their custody relating to the coal mine.

(2) The Central Government may issue such directions as it may deem desirable in the circumstances of the case to the Government company or Custodian as to its or his powers and duties and the Government company or Custodian may also, if he so desires, apply to the Central Government at any time for instructions as to the manner in which the management of the coal mine shall be conducted by it or him or in relation to any other matter arising in the course of such management.

(3) The Custodian shall receive from the funds of the coal mine, in relation to which he or it is the Custodian, such remunerations as the Central Government may fix and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Central Government.

13. ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT.

The Custodian of every coal mine shall maintain the accounts of such mine in such manner and under such conditions as may be prescribed.

CHAPTER V

14. LIABILITY OF OFFICER OR OTHER EMPLOYEE OF A COAL MINE FOR TRANSFER TO ANY OTHER COAL MINE.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (14 of 1947), or in any other law for the time being in force, the services of any officer or other employee employed in a coal mine shall be liable to be transferred to any other coal mine and such transfers shall not entitle such officer or other employee to any compensation under this Act or any other law for the time being in force and no such claim shall be entertained by any court, tribunal or other authority.

15. PROVIDENT AND OTHER FUNDS.

(1) Where a coal mine has established a provident fund, superannuation, welfare or other fund for the benefit of its employees, the monies relatable to the employees, whose services have become transferred by or under this Act to the Central Government or a Government company shall, out of the monies standing, on the appointed day, to the credit of such provident fund, superannuation, welfare or other fund, stand transferred to, and vest in, the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be.

(2) The monies which stand transferred, under sub-section (1), to the Central Government or a Government company shall be dealt with by that Government or company, as the case may be, in such manner as may be prescribed.

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16 SUPERANNUATION FUND, ETC., TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO EMPLOYEES WHOSE EMPLOYMENT BECOMES TERMINATED UNDER THIS ACT.

Where the employment of an employee stands terminated by reason of sub-section (3) of section 14 and such employee is not employed by the owner of the coal mine in any of his other establishments, such owner shall pay to such employee the amount standing at his credit in the provident fund and also pay him the amounts due to him as superannuation, welfare and other benefits admissible to him as if the employee had superannuated or his service with the coal mine had terminated on the day immediately preceding the specified date.

CHAPTER VI
COMMISSIONER OF PAYMENTS

17. COMMISSIONERS OF PAYMENTS TO BE APPOINTED.

(1) For the purpose of disbursing the amounts payable to the owner of each coal mine or group of coal mines, the Central Government shall appoint such person as it may think fit to be the Commissioner of Payment.

(2) The Central Government may appoint such other persons as it may think fit to assist the Commissioner and thereupon the Commissioner may authorise one or more of such persons to also exercise all or any of the powers exercisable by him under this Act, and different persons may be authorised to exercise different powers.

(3) Any person authorised by the Commissioner to exercise any powers may exercise those powers in the same manner and with the same effect as if they have been conferred on that person directly by this Act and not by way of authorisation.

(4) The salaries and allowances of the Commissioner and other persons appointed under this section shall be defrayed out of Consolidated Fund of India.

18. PAYMENT BY THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT TO THE COMMISSIONER.

(1) The Central Government shall, within thirty days from the specified date, pay, in cash, to the Commissioner for payment to the owner of a coal mine, an amount equal to the amount specified against the coal mine in the Schedule and shall also pay to the Commissioner such sums as may be due to the owner of a coal mine under section 9.

(2) In addition to the sum referred to in sub-section (1), the Central Government shall pay, in cash, to the Commissioner, such amount as may become due to the owner of a coal mine in relation to any period, during which the management of the coal mine remains vested in the Central Government and simple interest at the rate of four percent per annum on such amount for the period commencing on the first day of July, 1975 and ending on the date of payment of such amount to the Commissioner.

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(3) A deposit account shall be opened by the Central Government, in favour of the Commissioner, in the Public Account of India, and every amount paid under this Act to the Commissioner shall be deposited by him to the credit of the said deposit account in the Public Account of India, and thereafter the said deposit account shall be operated by the Commissioner.

(4) Separate records shall be maintained by the Commissioner in respect of each coal mine in relation to which payments have been made to him under this Act.

(5) Interest accruing on the amounts standing to the credit of the deposit account referred to in sub-section (3) shall accrue to the benefit of the owners of coal mines and shall also be payable to the Commissioner in addition to the sum referred to in sub-section 1.

(6) References in this section to the owner of a coal mine shall, in relation to a group of coal mines specified in the Schedule, be construed as references to the owner of that group of coal mines.

19. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS IN RESPECT OF THE PERIOD OF MANAGEMENT BY THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT, ETC.

(1) The Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be, shall cause the books in relation to each coal mine, the management of which has vested in it under the Coal Mines (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1973 (15 of 1973), to be closed and balance as on the date immediately before the appointed day, and shall cause a statement of account, as on that day, to be prepared, within such time, in such form and in such manner as may be prescribed, in relation to each such mine in respect of the transactions effected by it during the period for which the management of such coal mine remained vested in it:

Provided that where two or more coal mines were owned, before the commencement of this Act, by the same owner, a consolidated statement of accounts may be prepared for all the coal mines owned by such owner.

(2) All amounts received by the Central Government or the Government company after the closure of such accounts shall, where such accounts relate to transactions effected before the appointed day, be included in the said statement of accounts in respect of the coal mine to which the said receipt relates.

(3) The Central Government or the Government company in which the right, title and interest of coal mine stands vested shall be entitled to receive, up to the specified date, to the exclusion of all other persons, any money, due to the coal mine, realised after the appointed day notwithstanding that the realisations pertain to a period prior to the appointed day.

Provided that where such realisations have not been included in the statement of accounts as on the day immediately before the appointed day, a supplementary statement of accounts shall be prepared and furnished, at such intervals as may be prescribed, by the Central Government or the Government company to the owner of the coal mine.

(4) The liabilities of the coal mine (not being liabilities arising out of advance made by the Central Government or the Government company), which could not be discharged by the appointed day, may be discharged by the Central Government or the Government company up to

the specified date, and every payment so made shall be included in the statement of accounts as on the day immediately before the appointed day, indicating therein the period in relation to which the payments were made and the payments so made shall not be called in question in any court.

Provided that the liabilities in relation to the period prior to the appointed day, which have not been discharged on or before the specified date, shall be the liabilities of the owner of the coal mine.

(5) A copy of each statement of accounts prepared under this section shall be delivered by the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be, to the Commissioner and also to the owner:

Provided that where the number of owners is more than one, only one copy of the statement of accounts shall be given to the owners for the benefit of all of them.

(6) The statement of accounts prepared under this section shall be audited by a person who is qualified to be appointed as an auditor of a company under section 226 of the Companies Act, 1956 (1 of 1956) and the auditor so appointed shall receive from the funds of the coal mine, such remuneration as the Central Government may fix.

(7) The audit of statement of the accounts shall be conducted in such manner as the Central Government may direct.

(8) The statement of account audited under sub-section (6) shall, unless the contrary is proved, by conclusive proof in respect of every matter entered therein.

19-A. VALIDATION OF CERTAIN COLLECTIONS.-

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in Sec. 2, as amended by Sec. 10 of the Coal Mines Nationalisation Laws (Amendment) Act, 1978, any money collected by the Central Government or the Government company during the period commencing on the appointed day and ending with the date specified under sub-section (3) of Sec. 19 shall be deemed to have been validly collected by the Central Government or the Government company, as the case may be, and any such money shall be applied in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 19.

(2) Any money collected as aforesaid shall not be called in question in any Court of Law.

20. CLAIMS TO BE MADE TO THE COMMISSIONER.

(1) Every person having a claim against the owner of a coal mine shall prefer such claim before the Commissioner within thirty days from the specified date:-

Provided that if the Commissioner is satisfied that the claimant was prevented by sufficient cause from preferring the claim within the said period of thirty days, he may entertain the claim within a further period of thirty days but not thereafter.

(2) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub-section (1), claims in relation to a provident fund, pension fund, gratuity fund or any other fund established for the welfare of the persons employed by the owner of a coal mine or a group of coal mines may be filed on behalf of

the person so employed by the Coal Mines Provident Fund Commissioner appointed by the Central Government under Sec.3-C of the Coal Mines Provident Fund, Family Pension and Bonus Schemes Act, 1948 (46 of 1948); 5[and claims in relation to any other matter may be filed on behalf of all or any of the persons so employed or any group of such persons, by any Trade Union, registered under the Trade Unions Act, 1926 (16 of 1926) or, where no such claim has been filed by any Trade Union, by the Chief Labour Commissioner (Central) appointed by the Central Government or any officer subordinate to him"); and the claims so made shall be deemed to have been made by the persons having a claim against the owner of a coal mine or group of coal mines;

Provided that no such claims shall be made by the Coal Mines Provident Fund Commissioner 5[or the Trade Union or the Chief Labour Commissioner (Central) or any officer subordinate to him] in relation to a person who has already made a claim under sub-section (1).

(3) Where any claim, not being a claim which was time-barred on the 31st day of January, 1973 was preferred under sub-section (1) within the period specified therefor and was rejected merely on the ground that such claim was time-barred, such claim shall be deemed not to have been rejected and the Commissioner shall restore on his file such claim and shall deal with it in the manner specified in Sec.23.

21. PRIORITY OF CLAIMS IN RELATION TO ARREARS OF PROVIDENT FUND, ETC.

(1) Every person employed by the owner of a coal mine or a group of coal mines may make a claim to the Commissioner to the effect that sums deducted under sub-section (4) of section 7 of the Coal Mines (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1973 (15 of 1973) are not sufficient to meet fully the amount of arrears due to him, on the appointed day within the meaning of that Act, from the owner of such coal mine or group of coal mines.-

(a) in relation to a provident fund, pension fund, gratuity fund or any other fund established for the welfare of the person employed by the owner of a coal mine or group of coal mines, or

(b) as wages,

and that a sum equal to the deficiency may be recovered from the amount specified in the Schedule against the owner of such coal mine or group of coal mines.

(2) Where a claim is made under sub-section (1), the Commissioner shall determine the extent of the deficiency and shall, after such determination, deduct in the first instance, out of the amount paid to him under section 8, a sum equal to the extent of deficiency determined by him under this sub-section.

(3) All sums deducted by the Commissioner under sub-section (2) shall, in accordance with such rules as may be made under this Act, be credited by the Commissioner to the relevant fund or be paid to the persons to whom such sums are due, and on such credit or payment, the liability of the owner in respect of all amounts of arrears due as aforesaid shall stand discharged.

(4) The deductions made by the Commissioner under sub-section (2) shall have priority over all other debts, whether secured or unsecured.

22. PRIORITY IN RELATION TO OTHER CLAIMS.

(1) Save as otherwise provided in section 21, every secured debt due from the owner of a coal mine or a group of coal mines shall have priority over all other debts and shall be paid in accordance with the rights and interests of the secured creditors.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, there shall be paid in priority to all other unsecured debts, not being the amounts advanced by the Central Government or the Custodian appointed under the Coal Mines (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1973 (15 of 1973) for the management of the coal mine,-

(a) all sums due to the State Government including royalty and dead rent;

(b) all amounts due in respect of any compensation or liability for compensation under Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923 (8 of 1923) in respect of the death or disablement of any employee of the coal mine unless such mine has, under such contract with insurers as mentioned in section 15 of the said Act, rights capable of being transferred to and vested in, the workmen; and

(c) all sums deducted by the employer from the salary or wages of any workman or other employee for credit to any provident fund, or any other fund established for the welfare of the employees of the coal mine but not deposited to the credit of the said fund.

(3) The debts specified in sub-section (2) shall rank equally among themselves and be paid in full, unless the assets are insufficient to meet them, in which case they shall abate in equal proportions and be paid accordingly.

23. ADMISSION OR REJECTION OF CLAIMS.

(1) The Commissioner shall fix a certain date on or before which every claimant shall file the proof of his claim or be excluded from the benefit of the disbursement made by the Commissioner.

(2) Not less than fourteen days' notice of the date so fixed shall be given by advertisement in one issue of the daily newspaper in the English language and one issue of a daily newspaper in a regional language as the Commissioner may consider suitable, and every such notice shall call upon the claimant to file the proof of his claim with the Commissioner within the time specified in the advertisement.

(3) Every claimant who fails to file the proof of his claim within the time specified by the Commissioner shall be excluded from the disbursements made by the Commissioner.

(4) The Commissioner shall, after such investigation as may, in his opinion, be necessary and after giving the owner of the coal mines an opportunity of refuting the claim and after giving the claimant a reasonable opportunity of being heard, in writing, admit or reject the claim in whole or in part.

(5) The Commissioner shall have the power to regulate his own procedure in all matters arising out of the discharge of his functions including the place or places at which he will hold his sittings and shall, for the purpose of making any investigation under this Act, have the same

powers as are vested in a civil court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (5 of 1908), while trying a suit, in respect of the following matters, namely:-

(a) the summoning and enforcing the attendance of any witness and examining him on oath;

(b) the discovery and production of any document or other material object producible as evidence;

(c) the reception of evidence on affidavits;

(d) the issuing of any commission for the examination of witness

(6) Any investigation before the Commissioner shall be deemed to be a judicial proceeding within the meaning of sections 193 and 228 of the Indian Penal Code (45 of 1860) and the Commissioner shall be deemed to be a civil court for the purposes of section 195 and Chapter XXXV of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (5 of 1898).

(6-A) The Commissioner may, on receipt of a claim, -

(a) elect to settle the claim himself, or

(b) transfer the claim for settlement to a person authorised in this behalf under sub-section (2) of Sec.17; or

(c) withdraw the claim from the person referred to in clause (b) and either settle the claim himself or transfer it for disposal to any other person who has been authorised in this behalf under sub-section (2) of Sec.17.

(7) A claimant who is dissatisfied with the decision of the Commissioner may prefer an appeal, within a period of sixty days from the date of the decision to the principal civil court of original jurisdiction within the local limits of whose jurisdiction the coal mine is situated.

Provided that 'where' a person who is a Judge of a High Court is appointed to be the Commissioner, such appeal shall lie to a High Court for the State in which the coal mine is situated, and such appeal shall be heard and disposed of by not less than two Judges of that High Court.

Provided further that any appeal which has not been preferred before the date on which the Coal Mines Nationalisation Laws (Amendment) Act, 1978, receives the assent of the President, shall be preferred within a period of sixty days from such date.

23A APPLICATION OF SECS. 5 & 12 OF THE LIMITATION ACT

The provisions of Secs. 5 & 12 of the Limitation Act 1963 (36 of 1963) shall, so far as may be, apply to appeals under Sec. 23.

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24. DISBURSEMENT OF MONEY BY THE COMMISSIONER TO CLAIMANTS.

Where, after meeting the claims admitted by him or secured creditors and unsecured creditors having priority under sub-section (2) of section 22, the total amount of claims of other unsecured creditors admitted by the Commissioner, does not exceed the total amount of the money credited to the account of a coal mine, every such admitted claim shall be paid in full and the balance, if any, shall be paid to the owner, but where such amount is insufficient to meet in full the total amount of the admitted claims, all such claims shall abate in equal proportions and be paid accordingly.

24-A INTEREST ON ADMITTED CLAIMS.-

Notwithstanding any award, decree or order of any Court, tribunal or other authority, passed before the appointed day, in relation to any coal mine, where any amount is payable in respect of a claim admitted under this Act, the interest payable on such amount for any period after the appointed day shall be at such rate not exceeding the rate of interest accruing on any amount deposited by the Commissioner under Sec. 18]

25 RECOVERY OF EXCESS PAYMENTS MADE BY CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OR CUSTODIAN.

Any amount in excess of payments over receipts in the statement of accounts prepared under Sec.19 shall be deemed to be an amount advanced by the Central Government to the Custodian, as the case may be, for the management of a coal mine during the period in which the management of such coal mine remained vested in the Central Government and the Central Government may make a claim to the Commissioner for such excess payment and such claim shall have priority over the claims of all other unsecured creditors of the coal mine including those referred to in sub-section (2) of Sec. 22.

25-A A NOTICE TO OWNERS OF COAL MINES AND MANAGING CONTRACTORS, ETC.

(1) After meeting the liabilities of persons whose claims have been admitted under this Act, the Commissioner shall notify, in such manner as he may think fit, the amount of money available with him and specify in such notification a date within which the owners of the coal mines, the managing contractors and the owners of any machinery, equipment or other property which has vested in the Central Government or a Government company under this Act and which does not belong to the owners of the coal mines may apply to him for payment.

(2) Where any application is made under sub-section (1), the Commissioner shall, after satisfying himself as to the right of the applicant to receive the whole or any part of the amount, pay the amount to the person concerned and in the event of there being a doubt or dispute as to the right of the person to receive the whole or any part of the amount, the Commissioner shall deal with the application in the manner specified in sub-section (2) of Sec.26.

26. DISBURSEMENT OF AMOUNTS TO THE OWNERS OF COAL MINES.

(I) If out of the monies paid to him in relation to a coal mine or group of coal mines specified in the second column of the Schedule, there is a balance left after meeting the liabilities of

all the secured and unsecured creditors, the Commissioner shall disburse such balance to the owners of such coal mine or group of coal mines.

(2) Before making any payment to the owner of any coal mine or group of coal mines under sub-section (1), the Commissioner shall satisfy himself as to the right of such person to receive the whole or any part of such amount, and in the event of there being a doubt or dispute as to the right of the person to receive the whole or any part of the amount, referred to in sections 8 and 9, the Commissioner shall refer the matter to the court and make the disbursement in accordance with the decision of the Court.

(3) For the removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that the entries in the fourth column of the Schedule shall not be deemed to be conclusive as to the right, title and interest of any person in relation to any coal mine specified in the corresponding entries in the second column of the Schedule and evidence shall be admissible to establish the right, title and interest of any person in relation to such coal mine.

(4) In relation to a coal mine the operations of which were, immediately before the taking over of the management of such coal mine under the Coal Mines (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1973 (15 of 1973) under the control of a managing contractor, the amount specified in the fifth column of the Schedule against such coal mine shall be apportioned between the owner of the coal mine and such managing contractor in such proportions as may be agreed upon by or between the owner and such managing contractor, and in the event of there being no such agreement, in such proportions as may be determined by the court on a reference made to it by the Commissioner.

(5) Where any machinery, equipment or other property in a coal mine has vested in the Central Government or a Government company under this Act, but such machinery, equipment or other property does not belong to the owner of such coal mine, the amount specified in the fifth column of the Schedule of such coal mine shall, on a reference made to it by the Commissioner, be apportioned by the court between the owner of such coal mine and regard to the value of such machinery, equipment or other property on the appointed day.

(6) Where the amount specified in the fifth Column of the Schedule is referable to a group of coal mines, the Commissioner shall have power to apportion such amount among the owners of such group and in making such apportionment, the Commissioner shall have regard to the highest annual production in the coal mine during the three years immediately preceding the appointed day.

27. UNDISBURSED OR UNCLAIMED AMOUNT TO BE DEPOSITED TO THE GENERAL REVENUE ACCOUNT:

Any money paid to the Commissioner which remains undisbursed or unclaimed for a period of three years from the day on which the last order for disbursement was made, shall be transferred by the Commissioner to the general revenue account of the Central Government; but a claim to any money so transferred may be preferred to the Central Government by the person entitled to such payment and shall be dealt with as if such transfer had not been made, the order, if any, for payment of the claim being treated as an order for the refund of revenue.

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CHAPTER VII

MISCELLANEOUS

28. EFFECT OF THIS ACT ON OTHER LAWS.

The provisions of the Act shall have effect notwithstanding anything inconsistent therewith contained in any other law for the time being in force or in any instrument having effect by virtue of any law other than this Act, or in any decree or order of any court, tribunal or other authority.

29. CONTRACTS TO CEASE TO HAVE EFFECT UNLESS RATIFIED BY GOVERNMENT.

(1) Every contract entered into by the owner or occupier of any coal mine, for any service, sale or supply and in force immediately before the appointed day shall, on and from the expiry of one hundred and twenty days from the appointed day, cease to have effect unless such contract is, before the expiry of that period, ratified, in writing, by the Central Government and in ratifying such contract the Central Government may make such alterations or modifications therein as it may think fit:

Provided that the Central Government shall not omit to ratify a contract unless it is satisfied that such contract is unduly onerous or has been entered into in bad faith or is detrimental to the interests of the coal mine.

(2) The Central Government shall not omit to ratify a contract or make any alteration or modification therein except after giving to the parties to the contract a reasonable opportunity of being heard and except after recording in writing its reasons for refusal to ratify the contract.

30. PENALTIES

(1) Any person who,-

(a) having in his possession, custody or control any property forming part of the undertaking of any coal mine referred to in Schedule wrongfully withholds such property from the Central Government or the Government company, or

(b) wrongfully obtains possession of, or retains, any property forming part of the undertaking of any coal mine specified in the Schedule or wilfully withholds or fails to furnish to the Central Government or any other person specified by that Government, any document relating to such coal mine which may be in his possession, custody or control or fails to deliver to the Custodian any assets, books of account, registers or other documents in his custody relating to the coal mine in respect of which a Custodian has been appointed, or

(c) wrongfully removes or destroys any property of any coal mine or prefers any claim under this Act which he knows or has reasonable cause to believe to be false or grossly inaccurate shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, or with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees, or with both.

(2) Any person who engages or causes any other person to be engaged, in winning or mining coal from the whole or part of any land in respect of which no valid prospecting licence or

mining lease or sub lease is in force, shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years and also with fine which may extend to twenty thousand rupees.

31. OFFENCES BY COMPANIES.

(1) Where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company, every person who at the time the offence was committed was in charge of, and was responsible to, the company for conduct of the business of the company as well as the company, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

Provided that nothing contained in this sub-section shall render any such person liable to any punishment, if he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he had exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (1), where any offence under this Act has been committed by a company and it is proved that the offence has been committed with the consent or connivance of, or is attributable to, any neglect on the part of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

32. MINING COMPANIES NOT TO BE WOUND UP BY THE COURT.

No proceeding for the winding up of a mining company, the right, title and interest in relation to the coal mine owned by which have vested in the Central Government or a Government company under this Act or for the appointment of a receiver in respect of the business of the company, shall lie in any court except with the consent of the Central Government.

33. DELEGATION OF POWERS.

(1) The Central Government may, by notification, direct that all or any of the powers exercisable by it under this Act may also be exercised by any person or persons as may be specified in the notification.

(2) Whenever any delegation of power is made under sub-section (1), the person to whom such power has been delegated shall act under the direction, control and supervision of the Central Government.

34. POWER TO MAKE RULES.

(1) The Central Government may, by notification, make rules to carry out the provisions of this Act.

(2) In particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-

(a) the manner in which the coal mine shall be managed by a Government company or a Custodian.

Coal Mines (Nationalisation) Act, 1973

(b) the manner in which monies in any provident fund or other fund referred to in section 15 shall be dealt with;

(c) the form and manner in which the statement of account referred to in section 19 shall be prepared;

(d) any other matter which is required to be, or may be, prescribed.

(3) Every rule made by the Central Government under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of Parliament while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or succession sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in making any modification in the rule or both Houses agree that the rule should not be made, the rule shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be; so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

35. POWER TO REMOVE DIFFICULTIES.

If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Central Government may, by order, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, remove the difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made after the expiry of a period of two years from the appointed day.

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Power to remove difficulties.



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THE COAL INDIA (REGULATION OF TRANSFERS AND VALIDATION) ACT, 2000

ACT NO. 45 OF 2000

[8th December, 2000.]

An Act to empower the Central Government to direct the transfer of the land, or of the rights in or over land or of the right, title and interest in relation to a coal mine, coking coal mine or coke oven plant, vested in the Coal India Limited or in a subsidiary company to any subsidiary company of Coal India Limited or any other subsidiary company and to validate certain transfers of such land or rights.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Fifty-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. Short title.—This Act may be called the Coal India (Regulation of Transfers and Validation) Act, 2000.

2. Definitions.—In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "Coal India" means the Coal India Limited, a Government company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 (1 of 1956) having its registered office at Calcutta and includes its predecessor Government company, namely, the Coal Mines Authority Limited;

(b) "subsidiary company" means the following subsidiary companies of Coal India, namely:—

(i) the Central Coal Fields Limited, Ranchi and includes its predecessor Government company, namely, the National Coal Development Corporation Limited, Ranchi;

(ii) the Bharat Coking Coal Limited, Dhanbad;

(iii) the Western Coal Fields Limited, Nagpur;

(iv) the Eastern Coal Fields Limited, Santorua;

(v) the Central Mine Planning and Design Institute Limited, Ranchi;

(vi) the South-Eastern Coal Fields Limited, Bilaspur;

(vii) the Northern Coal Fields Limited, Singrauli;

(viii) the Mahanadi Coal Fields Limited, Sambalpur;

and includes such other subsidiary company of Coal India as may be incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 (1 of 1956) from time to time;

(c) words and expressions used herein and not defined but defined in the Coking Coal Mines (Nationalisation) Act, 1972 (36 of 1972) or the Coal Mines (Nationalisation) Act, 1973 (26 of 1973), shall have the meanings, respectively, assigned to them in those Acts.

3. Power of Central Government to direct transfer of land, rights, title or interest.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, the Central Government may, if it is satisfied that a subsidiary company is willing to comply, or has complied, with such terms and conditions as that Government think fit to impose, direct, by notification in the Official Gazette, that the land or rights in or over such land or the right, title and interest in relation to a coal mine, coking coal mine or a coke oven plant vested in the Coal India shall, instead of continuing to vest in the Coal India, vest in that subsidiary company or, where such land or right, title or interest vests in subsidiary company, in another subsidiary company.

(2) Where the land or right in or over such land or the right, title and interest in relation to a coal mine, coking coal mine or a coke oven plant vest in a subsidiary company under sub-section(1), such subsidiary company shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the lessee in relation to such coal mine or coking coal mine as if a fresh mining lease in relation to such coal mine or coking coal mine had been granted to it under the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960 made under section 13

of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (67 of 1957) for the maximum period for which such lease could have been granted under those rules, and all the rights and liabilities of Coal India or, as the case may be, the subsidiary company in relation to such coal mine or coking coal mine shall, on and from the date of such vesting, be deemed to have become the rights and liabilities, respectively, of subsidiary company first-mentioned.

4. Validation of certain transfers.—A subsidiary company which was operating, or was in control of, any coal mine, coking coal mine, or coke oven plant which was vested in the Coal India or any other subsidiary company immediately before the commencement of this Act, shall be deemed to have been vested with the land or rights in or over such land or the right, title and interest in relation to such coal mine, coking coal mine or coke oven plant and such vesting shall be deemed to have been valid and effective at all material times as if a direction had been made by the Central Government under sub-section (1) of section 3 and accordingly no suit or other proceeding shall be instituted, maintained or continued in any court on the ground that such subsidiary company was not competent to operate or control such coal mine, coking coal mine or coke oven plant.

सा.का.नि. 717(अ).—केन्द्रीय सरकार, खान और खनिज (विकास और विनियमन) अधिनियम, 1957 (1957 का 67) की धारा 13 द्वारा प्रदत्त शक्तियों का प्रयोग करते हुए खनिज रियायत नियम, 1960 का और संशोधन करने के लिए निम्नलिखित नियम बनाती है, अर्थात्:-

- संक्षिप्त नाम और प्रारंभ.—(1) इन नियमों का संक्षिप्त नाम खनिज रियायत (संशोधन) नियम, 2021 है।
(2) इन नियमों में अन्यथा उपर्युक्त के सिवाय, ये उनके राजपत्र में प्रकाशन की तारीख को प्रवृत्त होंगे।
- खनिज रियायत नियम, 1960 (जिसे इसमें इसके पश्चात् मूल नियम कहा गया है) के नियम 2 के उपनियम (1) के खंड (vii) के पश्चात् निम्नलिखित खंड अंतःस्थापित किया जाएगा, अर्थात्:-

'(viii) "चान का परिचालन" से पट्टा क्षेत्र के सनियोजित जीन से विस्कोटन, उत्खनन, कर्तन या सुरक्षन के पश्चात् प्राप्त अपनी प्राकृतिक अवस्था में कल्पी, अप्रसंस्कृत या असम्प्रिलिप्त सामग्री अभियेत है।'

- मूल नियमों में नियम 24वें के पश्चात् निम्नलिखित नियम अंतःस्थापित किया जाएगा, अर्थात्:-

"24म्. सरकारी कंपनियों या नियमों को प्रदान किए गए खनन पट्टे की अवधि,—

- खनिज रियायत (संशोधन) नियम, 2021 के प्रारंभ पर या उसके पश्चात् कोयले या लिम्नाइट के लिए सरकारी कंपनी या नियम को प्रदान किए गए सभी खनन पट्टे 50 वर्ष की अवधि के लिए होंगे।

(2) बनिज रियायत (संशोधन) नियम, 2021 के ग्रांटम से पूर्व कोयले या लिम्नाइट के लिए किसी सरकारी कंपनी या नियम में विहित या उसे प्रदत्त गर्भी विश्वास खनन पटे 50 वर्ष के लिए या 31 मार्च, 2030 तक, दोनों से वा उस परन्तु तात्परी हो, प्रदत्त किए गए समझे जाएंगे।

(3) राज्य सरकार, इस संबंध में खनन पटे के अवसान में कम से कम तीन मास पूर्व किसी सरकारी कंपनी या नियम द्वारा किए गए आवेदन पर बनिज पटे को एक समय में बीस वर्ष की और अवधि के लिए बढ़ाएगी।

परंतु राज्य सरकार विहित समय नीमा के पश्चात् विस्तार के लिए आवेदन में देनी को माफ कर सकती है।

परंतु यह और कि किसी सरकारी कंपनी या नियम को खनन पटे के अवधि का विस्तार नहीं प्रदान किया जाएगा जो निविदा के माध्यम से चयनित की गई है।

(4) यदि राज्य सरकार द्वारा उपनियम (3) में उल्लिखित समय के भीतर खनन पटे के विस्तार के लिए किया गया कोई आवेदन पटे के अवसान की तारीख से पूर्व निपटाया नहीं जाता है, तो उस पटे की अवधि उस पर राज्य सरकार द्वारा आदेश पारित किए जाने तक विस्तृत हुई समझी जाएगी।

(5) सरकारी कंपनी या नियम द्वारा खनन पटे के नवीकरण के लिए किए गए सभी आवेदन जो स्थान और बनिज (विकास और विनियमन) संशोधन अधिनियम, 2021(2021 का 16) के ग्रांटम की तारीख पर लंबित थे, खनन पटे की अवधि के विस्तार के लिए आवेदन समझे जाएंगे और उन्नियम (3) के उपर्योग के अनुसार निपटाएं जाएंगे।

4. मूल नियमों के नियम 27 के पश्चात् निम्नलिखित नियम अंतःस्थापित किया जाएगा, अर्थात्:-

“27क. आबद्ध स्थान के पट्टाधारी द्वारा कोयले या लिम्नाइट के विकास की दीति.—(1) कोई पट्टाधारी जहाँ आबद्ध प्रयोजन के लिए कोयले या लिम्नाइट का उपयोग किया जाता है, स्थान से संबद्ध एंड-पूज संबंध की अपेक्षाओं को पूरा करने के पश्चात् किसी वित्तीय वर्ष में उत्पादित कोयले या लिम्नाइट की धारा 8 की उपधारा (5) के अधीन यथा अनुज्ञान कुल मात्रा के एम से प्रतिशत तक कोयला या लिम्नाइट विक्रय कर सकता।

स्पष्टीकरण 1.—इस नियम के प्रयोजन के लिए यह स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि किसी वित्तीय वर्ष के लिए स्थान के संबद्ध एंड-पूज संबंध की अपेक्षा उस वित्तीय वर्ष या उसके किसी भाग में उक्त संबंध द्वारा उपयोग किए गए कोयले या लिम्नाइट की कास्तिक भाग होती।

स्पष्टीकरण 2.—इस नियम के प्रयोजन के लिए उत्पादित, वितरित, एंड-पूज संबंध से संबद्ध उपयोग किए गए कोयले या लिम्नाइट की मात्रा और वितरित मात्रा पर अंतिरिक्त रकम के संदाय का निर्धारण स्थान के परिचालन आधार पर किया जाएगा।

स्पष्टीकरण 3.—अपशिष्ट, अग्राह्य या मिडिलिंग का विकल इस नियम द्वारा निर्धारित नहीं होगा।

(2) धारा 8 की उपधारा (5) के अनुसार विकीर्त कोयले या लिम्नाइट की मात्रा के लिए पट्टाधारी, राज्य सरकार की स्वामित्व का संदाय करते समय अधिनियम की खटी अनुसूची में पथा चिनिरिंदिट अंतिरिक्त रकम का संदाय करेगा, जो बिला बनिज फाउंडेशन और राष्ट्रीय खनिज खोज न्याय को स्वामित्व वा संदाय अन्व करनुमी संदाय या निविदा दस्तावेज अथवा नीलामी प्रीमियम में चिनिरिंदिट संदाय, जहाँ कहीं मात्र हो, के अंतिरिक्त होगा।

(3) पट्टाधारी पूर्व वित्तीय वर्ष में किए गए विकल के लिए विकी वित्तीय वर्ष की समाप्ति के एक माह के भीतर नामनिर्दिष्ट प्राधिकारी, कोयला मंत्रालय, कोयला नियंत्रण संगठन और राज्य सरकार को प्रकृत वर्ष में स्वचोपणा प्रस्तुत करेगा।

(4) किसी कंपनी या नियम को आवंटित कोयले की स्थानों से कोयले का विकल अनुज्ञान नहीं होगा, जिन्हें ईरिफ के लिए ग्रतियोगिता बोली के आधार पर शक्ति परियोजना (जिसके अंतर्गत जल्दा मेवा पावर प्रोजेक्ट भी है) व्यापार किए गए हैं।

स्पष्टीकरण.—इस नियम के प्रयोजन के लिए यह स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि इस नियम में यथा चिनिरिंदिट कोयले या लिम्नाइट के विकल के लिए उपर्योग वैन्डीय तरकार के साथ पट्टाधारी द्वारा किए गए संबंधित करार में विहित पात्रता शर्तों और कार्य कुशलता प्राचलों को प्रभावित नहीं करेंगे।

"28. पट्टों का व्यपगमन.—(1) जहां खनन पट्टे के निष्पादन की तारीख से दो वर्ष के भीतर उत्पादन और प्रेषण प्रारंभ नहीं हुआ हो या उत्पादन या प्रेषण प्रारंभ होने के पश्चात् दो वर्ष की सतत अवधि के लिए समाप्त हो गया हो, खनन पट्टा पर्याप्ति पट्टे के निष्पादन की तारीख से या उत्पादन और प्रेषण की समाप्ति से दो वर्ष की अवधि के अवसान पर व्यपगमत हो जाएगा।

(2) खनन पट्टे का व्यपगमन राज्य सरकार द्वारा जारी किए गए आदेश के माध्यम से अभिलिखित किया जाएगा और पट्टाधारी को भी संसूचित किया जाएगा।

(3) जहां पट्टाधारी खनन अनुबंधित के निष्पादन की तारीख से दो वर्ष की अवधि के भीतर उत्पादन और प्रेषण प्रारंभ करने में असमर्थ है या उसके नियंत्रण से बाहर के कारणों से उत्पादन और प्रेषण समाप्त हो जाता है, वह राज्य सरकार को उक्त दो वर्ष की अवधि के अवसान से कम से कम तीन मास पहले उसका कारण दर्शित करते हुए ऐसी दो वर्ष की अवधि को एक वर्ष से अनधिक की असिरिक्त अवधि तक बढ़ाने का अनुरोध करते हुए एक आवेदन प्रस्तुत कर सकता:

परंतु जहां पट्टाधारी उपरोक्त नियत समय के भीतर आवेदन करने में असफल रहता है वहां दो वर्ष की समाप्ति पर पट्टा व्यपगमत हो जाएगा।

(4) उपनियम (3) के अधीन किए गए आवेदन में निम्नलिखित विनिर्दिष्ट किया जाएगा—

(क) वह कारण, जिनसे पट्टाधारी के लिए खनन संक्रियाएं करने या उत्पादन और प्रेषण को जारी रखना असंभव हो गया;

(ख) वह रीति जिसमें ऐसे कारण पट्टाधारी के नियंत्रण के बाहर है;



G.S.R. 717(E).—In exercise of powers conferred by Section 13 of the Mines and Minerals Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (67 of 1957), the Central Government hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960, namely:-

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) These rules may be called the Mineral Concession (Amendment) Rules, 2021.
(2) Save as otherwise provided in these rules they shall come into force on the date of their publication in Gazette of India.
2. In the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960, (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules), in rule 2, in sub-rule (1), after clause (vii), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-
(viiia) "run-of-mine" means the raw, unprocessed or uncrushed material in its natural state obtained after blasting, digging, cutting or scraping from the mineralised zone of a lease area;.

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3. In the principal rules, after rule 24B the following rule shall be inserted, namely:-

“24C. Period of mining lease granted to Government companies or corporations.—

- (1) All mining leases granted on or after the commencement of the Mineral Concession (Amendment) Rules, 2021 to a Government company or corporation for coal or lignite shall be for a period of fifty years.
- (2) All subsisting mining leases vested or granted to a Government company or corporation before commencement of the Mineral Concession (Amendment) Rules, 2021 for coal or lignite shall be deemed to have been granted for fifty years or till 31st March 2030, whichever is later.
- (3) The State Government, upon an application made to it in this behalf by the Government company or corporation at least three months prior to the expiry of the mining lease, shall extend the period of the mining lease for a further period of twenty years at a time:
Provided that the State Government may condone the delay in application for extension made after the prescribed time limit:
Provided further that no extension of period of mining lease shall be granted to a Government company or corporation that has been selected through auction.
- (4) If an application for extension of mining lease made within the time mentioned in sub-rule (3) is not disposed of by the State Government before the date of expiry of the lease, the period of that lease shall be deemed to have been extended till the State Government passes an order on the same.
- (5) All applications made by a Government company or corporation for renewal of mining lease which were pending as on the date of commencement of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2021 (16 of 2021) shall be deemed to be applications for extension of the period of the mining lease and shall be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of sub-rule (3).”.

4. In the principal rules, after rule 27, the following rule shall be inserted, namely:-

“27A. Manner of sale of coal or lignite by the lessee of a captive mine.— (1) Any lessee may, where coal or lignite is used for captive purpose, sell coal or lignite up to such per cent. of the total coal or lignite produced in a financial year, as allowed under sub-section (5) of section 8, after meeting the requirement of the end use plant linked with the mine.

Explanation 1.— For the purpose of this rule it is clarified that the requirement of the end use plant linked with the mine for a financial year shall be the actual quantity of coal or lignite consumed in the said plant in that financial year or a part thereof.

Explanation 2.— For the purpose of this rule, quantity of coal or lignite produced, sold, utilised in linked end-use plant and the payment of additional amount on the quantity sold shall be assessed on run-of-mine basis.

Explanation 3.—Sale of any tailings, rejects or middlings shall not be restricted by this rule.

(2) For the quantity of coal or lignite sold in accordance with sub-section (5) of section 8, the lessee shall pay to the State Government, at the time of payment of royalty, an additional amount as specified in the Sixth Schedule of the Act, which shall be in addition to royalty or payment to the District Mineral Foundation and National Mineral Exploration Trust or any other statutory payment or payment specified in the tender document or the auction premium, wherever applicable.

(3) Within one month of the end of a financial year, for sale made in the previous financial year, the lessee shall submit to the Nominated Authority, Ministry of Coal, Coal Controller's Organisation and to the State Government, a self-declaration in Form R.

(4) Sale of coal shall not be allowed from the coal mines allotted to a company or corporation that has been awarded a power project on the basis of competitive bid for tariff (including Ultra Mega Power Projects).”

Explanation.—For the purpose of this rule, it is clarified that the provision for sale of coal or lignite as prescribed in this rule shall not affect the eligibility conditions and efficiency parameters prescribed in the respective agreements entered into by the lessee with the Central Government.

5. In the principal rules, for rule 28, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:-

"28. Lapsing of Leases.— (1) Where production and dispatch has not commenced within a period of two years from the date of execution of the mining lease or is discontinued for a continuous period of two years after commencement of production or dispatch, the mining lease shall lapse on the expiry of the period of two years from the date of execution of the lease or as the case may be, discontinuance of the production and dispatch.

(2) The lapsing of the mining lease shall be recorded through an order issued by the State Government and shall also be communicated to the lessee.

(3) Where a lessee is unable to commence the production and dispatch within a period of two years from the date of execution of the mining lease or discontinuation of production and dispatch for reasons beyond his control, he may submit an application to the State Government, requesting for an extension of such period of two years by a further period not exceeding one year, explaining the reasons for the same, at least three months before the expiry of such period of two years:

Provided where the lessee has failed to make the application within the time stipulated above, the lease shall lapse on expiry of the period of two years.

(4) Application made under sub-rule (3) shall specify—

- (a) the reasons on account of which it will not be possible for the lessee to undertake mining operations or continue production and dispatch;
- (b) the manner in which such reasons are beyond the control of the lessee;
- (c) the steps that have been taken by the lessee to mitigate the impact of such reasons; and
- (d) the period of extension sought.

(5) Every application under sub-rule (3) shall be accompanied by a fee of two hundred rupees.

(6) The State Government shall, after examining the application, pass an order, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of the application made under sub-rule (3) or the date on which the mining lease would have otherwise lapsed, whichever is earlier, either granting or rejecting such request:

Provided that such mining lease shall lapse on failure to undertake production and dispatch or inability to continue production and dispatch within the extended period of one year:

Provided further that such extension shall not be granted for more than once during the entire period of lease.

(7) The State Government shall communicate to the Coal Controller's Organisation, Nominated Authority and Ministry of Coal the order recorded under sub-rule (2) or issued under sub-rule (6) within fifteen days of recording or issuing of such order."

6. In the principal rules, rule 28A shall be omitted.

7. In the principal rules, for rule 64B, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:-

"64B. Charging and instance of payment of royalty in case of minerals subjected to processing.— The royalty shall be charged on run-of-mine coal or lignite irrespective of its processing within or outside the leased area."

Provided that the royalty shall be payable at the time of dispatch from or consumption within the leased area."

8. In the principal rules, rule 64C shall be omitted.

9. In the principal rules, in Schedule I, after Form Q, the following Form shall be inserted, namely:-



Explanatory Memorandum

Sub-section (4) of Section 8 of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 inserted through the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2021 (16 of 2021) empowers the Central Government to prescribe the period of existing mining leases and to extend the period of mining leases in case of Government companies or corporations. Accordingly, the period of existing mining leases has been prescribed in sub-rule (2) of rule 24C and the pending applications for renewal of mining leases shall be deemed to be applications for extension of period of mining lease in sub-rule (5) of rule 24C. It is certified that no person is being adversely affected by granting retrospective effect through these rules.
