I am directed to refer to your letter No.10F(Cons)8/91/1540/ F&E dated 19th January, 1991 on the above mentioned subject seeking prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and to say that the proposal has been examined by the Advisory Committee constituted by the Central Government under Section-3 of the aforesaid Act.

After careful consideration of the proposal of the State Govt. and on the basis of the recommendation of the above mentioned Advisory Committee, the Central Government hereby conveys its approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 249.625 ha. of forest land for construction of Talcher-Sampalpur Railway line subject to the following conditions:-

Legal status of the forest land will remain unchanged.

No forest land will be utilized for construction of factory, township etc.

Compensatory plantation to be raised over equivalent nonforest land which will be notified as protected forest under Indian Forest Act.

The green belt plantation should be raised on either side of the Railway track along the entire length of Talcher-Sambalpur railway line.

Planting of 10 times, the number of trees felled along V) the railway line should also be done.
