Sub.: Approval of Mining Plan alongwith Progressive Mine Closure Plan in respect of PARASI Gold deposit over an area of 75.273 hectares in village- Parasi, Kutachouli & Kothadih, Taluka-Tamar, District- Ranchi, State-Jharkhand submitted under Rule 16(1) of Minerals (Other than Atomic and Hydrocarbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016.

Sir,

In exercise of the powers conferred by the Clause (b) of Sub-section (2) of Section 5 of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 read with Government of India Order no.: S.O.1857(E), dated 18/05/2016, I hereby approve the above said Mining Plan in respect of **PARASI** Gold deposit over an area of 75.273 hectares located in village- Parasi, Kutachouli & Kothadih, Taluka-Tamar, District- Ranchi, Jharkhand state, submitted under rule 16(1) of Minerals (Other than Atomic and Hydrocarbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016. This approval is subject to the following conditions: -

- (i) The mining plan is approved without prejudice to any other laws applicable to the mine/area from time to time whether made by the Central Government, State Government or any other authority and without prejudice to any order or direction from any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (ii) The proposals shown on the plates and/or given in the document is based on the lease map/sketch submitted by the applicant/lessee and is applicable from the date of approval.
- (iii) It is clarified that the approval of aforesaid mining plan does not, in any way, imply the approval of the Government in terms of any other provision of the Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957 or the Minerals (Other than Atomic and Hydrocarbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016 and any other laws including Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 or the rules made thereunder, Mines Act, 1952 and Rules & Regulations made thereunder.
- (iv) Indian Bureau of Mines has not undertaken verification of the mining lease boundary on the ground and does not undertake any responsibility regarding correctness of boundaries of the leasehold shown on the ground with reference to lease map & other plans furnished by the applicant/lessee.

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- (v) The lessee should confirm the correctness of the category of the land and submit any deviation incurred after thoroughly consultation with the State Govt. and confirming this according to the undertaking given therein.
- (vi) The DGPS carried over the lease area as per the geological report and clarification given vide letter No. ख.नि.(रॉचौ/गोल्ड)-18/2016/2221/एम, दिनांक 27.08.2018 by the Director of Mines, Government of Jharkhand, hence mining Plan is approved over an area of 75.273 hectares only.
- (vii) At any stage, if it is observed that the information furnished, data incorporated in the document are incorrect or misrepresent facts, the approval of the document shall be revoked with immediate effect.
- (viii) The CCOM circular no. 2/2010 and its addendum dated 06.04.2010 should be complied within 3 (three) months from the date of approval of Mining Plan.
- (ix) The detailed exploration (G1 level) over the entire potentially mineralised area under the mining lease shall be carried out within a period of five years of lease execution as required under sub rule 4 of Rule 12 of MCDR, 2017.
- (x) An Environmental monitoring cell should be constituted to carry out regular monitoring of environmental parameters (Air, Water & Noise level) and quarterly report of Environmental monitoring should be submitted to the Regional Controller of Mines, Indian Bureau of Mines, Ranchi. Further, daily monitoring report should be displayed on display board near mine/mine office.
- (xi) The lessee should obtain NOC from Pollution Control Board and submit the same to this department. The lessee should not cause any environment pollution to the nearby surroundings and human habitats. Mining should be carried out in a sustainable manner under provisions of MCDR, 2017.
- (xii) The lessee should take relevant permission from State Government to procure the quantity of water from nearby sources and intimate the same to Indian Bureau of Mines.
- (xiii) If the approval conflicts with any other law or court order/direction under any statute, it shall be revoked immediately.
