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The proposal for Laterite Mining Activities has been initiated by M/s. Shri. Bhairavnath Earthmovers for diversion of 49.00 ha. forest land for Laterite Mining under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The proposed area contains mainly Laterite and the mining project shall produce Laterite analyzing above $30\%~{\rm Al_2O^3}$ content which is located mainly in the Reserved Forest land. It is estimated that about 8.84 million tons of ore reserves are available from this area. It is proposed to mechanize the mine and produce maximum @1,50,000 to 2,00,000 MT per annum of Laterite for cement factory or other purpose. - v) The project authority will defray the cost of removal of 713 trees in the forest area which are falling in the area under diversion. However, only the required and minimum number of trees will be felled. In situations where felling of trees is avoidable and such trees could be transplanted, all efforts to transplant such trees at a pre designated site will be taken and additional expenditure, if any, in such cases shall be at the cost of the user agency.
- vi) The agency will pay the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of the permanent pillars on the compensatory afforestation land project land made available by the Agency.
- vii) The boundary of the diverted forest land, mining lease shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each

inscribed with its serial number, forward and back bearing and distance from pillar to pillar.

- viii) Construction of temporary dwelling / hutments etc. for labours will not be allowed in the forest areas.
- The user agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas;
- x) Adequate precautions shall be taken to safeguard the adjoining areas from explosives and it shall not be stored in the forest area.
- xi) The user agency will dump the overburden on the revenue land or on adjacent private land owned by agency as per their undertaking and forest land will not be used for dumping.
- xii) All extraction works will be done as per mining plan approved by the Government of India.
- xiii) The area will be reclaimed as per approved Mining Plan and handed over back to the Forest Department.
- xiv) The period of diversion of the said forestland under this approval shall be for a period co-terminus with the period of the mining lease proposed to be granted under the Mines and Minerals (Development & Regulating) Act-1957 as amended or Rules framed there under.
- xv) The mining activities shall be restricted within an area of 49.00 ha. and the user agency shall undertake mining in a phase manner after taking due care for reclamation of the mined over area.
- xvi) The user agency shall surrender of the mined out and reclaimed forest land in accordance with land surrender schedule submitted along with the compliance report.
- xvii) The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government
- xviii) The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than specified in the proposal;
- xix) No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused;
- The user agency shall obtain the Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if required.
- xxi) Following activities shall be undertaken by the user agency for the management of safety zone:
 - a) A safety zone of 7.5 meter will be maintained around mining lease site (7.5 meter strip all along the outer boundary of the mining lease area) where feasible, shall be done at the project cost.
 - b) User agency shall ensure demarcation of boundary of safety zone and its protection by erecting adequate number of 4 feet high RCC boundary pillars inscribed with DGPS coordinates and deploying adequate number of watchers

under the supervision of the State Forest Department

- In case of the mining leases adjoining the habitation stretch of the boundary of the safety zone of the lease adjacent to the habitation/roads should be properly fenced by the user agency at the project cost to protect the vegetation/regeneration activities in the safety zone
- d) Safety zone shall be maintained as green belt around the mining lease and to ensure dense canopy cover in the area, regeneration shall be taken in this area by the State Forest Department at project cost.
- e) Afforestation on degraded forest land, to be selected elsewhere, measuring one and a half times the area under safety zone shall be done by the State Forest Department at the project cost
- Following activities, if applicable, shall be undertaken by the user agency at the project (iixx cost:-
 - (a) Preparation and implementation of a plan containing appropriate mitigative measures to minimize soil erosion and choking of streams;
 - (b) Planting of adequate drought hardy plan species and sowing of seeds in the appropriate area within the mining lease to arrest soil erosion;
 - (c) Construction of check dams, retention/toe walls along the contour to arrest sliding down of the excavated material;
 - (d) Stabilize the overburden dumps by appropriate grading/benching so as to ensure that that angles of repose at any given place is less than 28°; and
 - (e) Strict adherence to the prescribed top soil management.

All other conditions as may be mandatory under relevant Acts, Rules and guidelines xxiii) shall be complied with by the user agency.

It is therefore requested that the Government of Maharashtra may kindly be moved to approve diversion of 49.00 ha. Forest Land in favour of Shri. Bhairavnath Earthmovers & Co, Gungurl, Tal-Shahuwadi, Distt-Kolhapur for Laterite Mining and road under section 2(ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
