Protected Forest/Reserved Forest land under section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for construction and laying of 220 KV LILO M/C Transmission line on 220 K.V Padghe-Wada and Kolshet-Wada transmission line for 400 KV Kudus Sub-Station passing through Thane District in the State of Maharashtra (FP/MH/TRANS/48241/2020).

Specific Recommendation of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Maharashtra State (Head of Forest Force) Maharashtra State, Nagpur with regards to acceptance or otherwise of the proposal supported by reasons.

- 1) Proposal is for diversion of 12.0225 ha. Protected Forest/Reserved Forest land under section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for construction and laying of 220 KV LILO M/C Transmission line on 220 K.V Padghe-Wada and Kolshet-Wada transmission line for 400 KV Kudus Sub-Station passing through Thane District in the State of Maharashtra (FP/MH/TRANS/48241/2020) has been initiated by the Executive Engineer, EHV Project Division, Kalyan for seeking approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 2) The construction and laying of 220 KV M/C transmission line from Villages of Thane District. The proposal under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is being submitted for the approval of the Central Government from Diversion of 12.0225 ha. Forest land in Village Eaksal, Kusapur, Chinchawali, Kunde & Dighashi, Dist. Thane, the proposed project if for the construction and laying of 220 KV M/C LILO Padghe-Wada & Kolshet-Wada transmission line for 400 KV Kudus Sub-Station. The 400 KV Kudus Sub-station is connected with Central utility power supply with their existing 220 Kv lines. In order to meet present and future power demand of Mumbai, Mumbai-Suburban areas, Thane urban and Thane rural, areas under Palghar district etc. i.e. strengthening of power supply in Mumbai region which is commercial capital of India. Further, in present scenario there is heavy load shedding due to lack of power supply, hence for avoiding the load shedding of power, Maharashtra State Electricity Transmission Company Limited has sanction plans to construct and operate 220 KV M/C LILO on Padghe-Wada & Kolshet-Wada transmission line for 400 Kv Kudus Sub-Station. This transmission line belt is very essential in to construct and operate 220 KV M/C LILO on Padghe-Wada & Kolshet-Wada transmission line for 400 KV Kudus Sub-Station for zero load shedding to be implemented w.e.f. 2021 and for industrial growth of Mumbai, Thane & Palghar District for future upcoming Central and Maharashtra Government projects. The following benefits of the project :-

  - > Strengthening of Power Supply of commercial capital of India by providing continuous and reliable power supply.

  - > For providing of continuous power supply to all industries and farmers hence enhancing the GDP of Maharashtra.

Mukhed, Hadgaon Dist.Nanded it is contiguous, suitable for afforestaion and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances.

- 2.7 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal.
- 2.8 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector.

- 2.10 The user agency at its cost shall provide bird deflectors, which are to be fixed on upper conductor of transmission line at suitable intervals to avoid bird hits.
- 2.11 The User Agency shall comply with the guidelines for laying transmission lines through forest areas issued by Ministry vide letter no. 7-25/2012-FC dated 05/05/2014 & 19/11/2014.
- 2.12 User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if applicable.
- 2.13 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 2.14 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- 2.15 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 2.16 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 2.17 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 2.18 The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less.
