**Inspection Note of Conservator of Forest Territorial Circle,
Chaibasa regarding proposal of JUVNL of Ulijhari-Chaibasa to
Gua Transmission line on 11.06.2019**

The major portion of this proposed line passes through 42.133 ha forest land and jungle jhari land of Chaibasa Division & 9.118 ha forest land of Saranda Division.

The area was inspected by me with DFO Saranda, field staff and Mr. Vikash Kumar, General Manager, A to Z Infra Eng. Ltd. New Dehli, which has been assigned the work of design, engineering, erection, supply, testing & commissioning including all statutory clearance on 11.06.2019.

The area visited by me, lies in Barajamda P.F. and it includes forest and non-forest land. The right of way was not very clearly demarcated on the ground and hence before starting the actual construction work, it should be marked very clearly by erecting pillars.

Similar situation was also found in Ghatkuri 30 P.F. of Sarnada Division at pillar No. 90. The vegetation was good and the land was undulating.


The proposed transmission line passes through small hillocks, mostly undulating land and is home of elephants and other small animals as mentioned by DFO Saranda in his inspection report. Hence the user agency should take special precaution to avoid sagging of transmission line and they should use insulated conductors as and where required. They shall ensure regular inspection of transmission line to avoid sagging and take appropriate steps as and when informed by forest officials.

In some areas of Saranda and Chaibasa Division, the land is prone to erosion and hence smaller trees shall be retained and only such tall trees shall be cut/removed, which is absolutely essential and such cutting shall be done by taking permission of competent authority.

The user agency is also required to prepare suitable soil & moisture conservation scheme, under the guidance of forest department and implement it under their supervision.

Apart from mandatory compensatory afforestation scheme, considering the large number of affected trees (4630) in Chaibasa Division and 800 trees in Saranda Division, the user agency shall also undertake gabion plantation of 600 & 100 tall plants of evergreen species respectively in Chaibasa & Saranda Divisions at places identified by respective DFOs near the transmission line and maintain them for 4 (Four) years.

The Project of transmission line is recommended subject to fulfillment of above conditions.
