2.0 Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) has decided to develop and strengthen the linkages and connectivity. The proposed road intends to develop alternative bypass road to Ghodbunder Road. The project road starts at Ghodbunder Road (SH 42) and Ends at NH-3 near Ulhas creek on Mumbai Nashik Highway (NH-3). The link will connect Thane with regional corridors and also provide easy access for vehicles travelling between JNPT, Navi Mumbai, Mumbai, Thane and Bhiwandi that will not have to make a detour via Ghodbunder. It will divert the traffic between Navi Mumbai & Thane from Ghodbunder Road with Thane city to outside the city and will help reduce traffic congestion within the city. The proposed connectivity will be serving as connectivity between the major roads of the MMR Region i.e. Ghodbunder Road and National Highway 3 (Mumbai Nashik Highway).

 - 4) The copy of the technical/ administrative approval accorded by the Secretary, Executive Committee, Mumbai Mahanagar Pradesh Vikas Pradhikaran vide letter No. Mumpravipra/Meeting/151, dated 26/11/2021.
 - 5) Total non forest involved in the project is 41.1242 ha.
 - 6) The cross section map is enclosed herewith on page no.36.
 - 7) The site inspection report of the Divisional Forest Officer, Mumbai Mangrove Conservation Unit is enclosed on page no.77 to 80.
 - 8) No alternate alignment is possible and the forest land required is barest minimum.
 - 9) The area belongs to Eco-value class-II having density is 0.1 to 0.4.
 - 10) There are 1546 Mangrove and non-mangrove trees of various species and trees involved in implementation of the project. The Girth wise break up is as under:-

- 11) Proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.
- 12) The area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.
- 13) There is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 14) Proposed project is 0.49 Km from Sanjay Gandhi National park and it is also not included in the Eco-sensitive Zone of Sanjay Gandhi National Park. Thane Creek Flamingo Sanctuary is 6.0 km from proposed area for diversion. The Sanjay Gandhi National Park Sanctuary is notified vide Government of Maharashtra gazette dated 16/01/1996 and Thane Flamingo Sanctuary is notified vide Government of Maharashtra letter dated 06/08/2015. The copy of the same is enclosed herewith.
- 15) The non-forest area covered under the project is not under the provision of Maharashtra Private Forest (Acquisition) Act 1975 by virtue of application of Section 35 of Indian Forest Act 1927 and are not recognized as deemed reserved forest as well as not included in the area identified as "forest" as per dictionary meaning of forest as intimated to the expert committee appointed under interim judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 12/12/1996.
- 16) Proposed Compensatory Afforestation over 15.00 ha. Non forest land in Survey No.34, at village Kukudheti, Tal. Sindewahim Dist. Chandrapur the said area is contiguous to the reserve/protected forest of Tadoba Buffer. The canopy density of the said land is more than 0.4 ha. Hence the area not be suitable for planation/compensatory afforestation. But the said area falls within the Tadoba Buffer Zone and is very much suitable for management from the Wildlife point of view. The details of alternate forest land for plantation is shown as under:-

The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa Forest Division, Wadsa has given suitability certificate over 15.00 ha. degraded forest land in Compt. No.45, at Village Mendhebodi, Tal. Wadsa Dist. Gadchiroli and it is contiguous, suitable for afforestation and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances. Though Satellite imageryshows greenery, it is due to widespread local weed called Kututranzi (Calycopteris floribunda). It has not economical value and it has badly affected growth of other valuable tree species. So this area should be converted into forest species. So to protect and convert this area into valuable forest afforestation is needed.

17) The proposed alignment is best suitable from forestry and feasibility point of view.

- 18) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Net Present Value.
- 19) The User Agency has submitted undertaking and mentioned that Environmental Clearance is not required to the project.
- 20) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Compensatory Afforestation.
- 21) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking the CRZ clearance shall be obtained before prior to commencement of the Work.
- 22) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking regarding the compliance under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been applied and is under process and shall be submitted before final approval as per Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt. 3/12/2018.
- 23) The Divisional Forest Officer, Mumbai Mangrove Conservation Unit and the Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Mangrove), Cell Mumbai have recommended the proposal for diversion of 12.2607 ha. forest land (Mangrove).
- 2.00 In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions: –
- 2.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 2.2 Forest land will be handed over only after required non-forest land for the project is handed over to the User Agency.

2.3 Compensatory Afforestaton:-

- a) Compensatory afforstation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 15.00 ha. forest land in Compt. No.45, at Village Mendhebodi, Tal. Wadsa Dist. Gadchiroli at the cost of the user agency. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided.
- 2.4 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.

2.5 NPV:-

a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 12.2607 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No.5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II),

- dated 18/09/2003 as well as letter No.5-2/2006-FC, dated 03/10/2006 and 5-3/2007-FC, dated 05/02/2009 in this regard.
- b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- 2.6 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 2.7 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (http://parivesh.nic.in/).
- 2.8 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 2.9 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 2.10 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 2.11 It Shall be mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals:-
 - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
 - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
 - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
 - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 2.12 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 2.13 User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if applicable.
- 2.14 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government
- 2.15 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land
- 2.16 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 2.17 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 2.18 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 2.19 The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less.

- 2.20 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal
- 2.21 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstance be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 2.22 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 2.23 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
- 2.24 The compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (https://parivesh.nic.in/)

It will divert the traffic between Navi Mumbai & Thane from Ghodbunder Road with Thane city to outside the city and will help reduce traffic congestion within the city. The proposed connectivity will be serving as connectivity between the major roads of the MMR Region i.e. Ghodbunder Road and National Highway 3 (Mumbai Nashik Highway).

- 5) Total non forest involved in the project is 41.1242 ha.
- 6) The cross section map is enclosed herewith on page no.36.
- 7) The site inspection report of the Divisional Forest Officer, Mumbai Mangrove Conservation Unit is enclosed on page no.77 to 80.
- 8) No alternate alignment is possible and the forest land required is barest minimum.
- 9) The area belongs to Eco-value class-II having density is 0.1 to 0.4.
- 10) There are 1546 Mangrove and non-mangrove trees of various species and trees involved in implementation of the project. The Girth wise break up is as under:-

- 11) Proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.
- 12) The area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.
- 13) There is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 14) Proposed project is 0.49 Km from Sanjay Gandhi National park and it is also not included in the Eco-sensitive Zone of Sanjay Gandhi National Park. Thane Creek Flamingo Sanctuary is 6.0 km from proposed area for diversion. The Sanjay Gandhi National Park Sanctuary is notified vide Government of Maharashtra gazette dated 16/01/1996 and Thane Flamingo Sanctuary is notified vide Government of Maharashtra letter dated 06/08/2015. The copy of the same is enclosed herewith.

- 15) The non-forest area covered under the project is not under the provision of Maharashtra Private Forest (Acquisition) Act 1975 by virtue of application of Section 35 of Indian Forest Act 1927 and are not recognized as deemed reserved forest as well as not included in the area identified as "forest" as per dictionary meaning of forest as intimated to the expert committee appointed under interim judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 12/12/1996.
- 16) Proposed Compensatory Afforestation over 15.00 ha. Non forest land in Survey No.34, at village Kukudheti, Tal. Sindewahim Dist. Chandrapur the said area is contiguous to the reserve/protected forest of Tadoba Buffer. The canopy density of the said land is more than 0.4 ha. Hence the area not be suitable for planation/compensatory afforestation. But the said area falls within the Tadoba Buffer Zone and is very much suitable for management from the Wildlife point of view. The details of alternate forest land for plantation is shown as under:-

The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wadsa Forest Division, Wadsa has given suitability certificate over 15.00 ha. degraded forest land in Compt. No.45, at Village Mendhebodi, Tal. Wadsa Dist. Gadchiroli and it is contiguous, suitable for afforestation and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances. Though Satellite imageryshows greenery, it is due to widespread local weed called Kututranzi (Calycopteris floribunda). It has not economical value and it has badly affected growth of other valuable tree species. So this area should be converted into forest species. So to protect and convert this area into valuable forest afforestation is needed.

- 17) The proposed alignment is best suitable from forestry and feasibility point of view.
- 18) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Net Present Value.
- 19) The User Agency has submitted undertaking and mentioned that Environmental Clearance is not required to the project.
- 20) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking to defray the cost of Compensatory Afforestation.
- 21) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking the CRZ clearance shall be obtained before prior to commencement of the Work.
- 22) The User Agency has submitted an undertaking regarding the compliance under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been applied and is under process and shall be submitted before

- final approval as per Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt. 3/12/2018.
- 23) The Divisional Forest Officer, Mumbai Mangrove Conservation Unit and the Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Mangrove), Cell Mumbai have recommended the proposal for diversion of 12.2607 ha. forest land (Mangrove).

2.00 In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions: –

- 2.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 2.2 Forest land will be handed over only after required non-forest land for the project is handed over to the User Agency.

2.3 Compensatory Afforestaton:-

- a) Compensatory afforstation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 15.00 ha. forest land in Compt. No.45, at Village Mendhebodi, Tal. Wadsa Dist. Gadchiroli at the cost of the user agency. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided.
- 2.4 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.

2.5 NPV:-

- a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 12.2607 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No.5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II), dated 18/09/2003 as well as letter No.5-2/2006-FC, dated 03/10/2006 and 5-3/2007-FC, dated 05/02/2009 in this regard.
- b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- 2.6 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest

- Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 2.7 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (http://parivesh.nic.in/).
- 2.8 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 2.9 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 2.10 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 2.11 It Shall be mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals:-
 - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
 - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
 - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
 - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 2.12 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 2.13 User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if applicable.
- 2.14 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government
- 2.15 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land
- 2.16 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 2.17 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 2.18 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.

- 2.19 The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less.
- 2.20 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal
- 2.21 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstance be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 2.22 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 2.23 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
