- **4.** Online submission of PART-III on 28-03-2022 by Chief Conservator of Forests, Kanara Circle [Letter No. B2/GFL/Approach Road-Kaiga/CR- /2021-22/3684 dated 22-03-2022] and online reply dated 12-05-2022to EDS query [letter No. B2/GFL/Approach Road Kaiga/CR-19/2021-22 dated 12-05-2022]
- 1. Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited, Kaiga Generating Station, Karwar Taluk, Uttar Kannada District [USER AGENCY] has (re)submitted an online proposal [FORM-A PART-I] vide Ref (1) on 08-09-2021seeking approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980for diversion of 3.4744 hectare of forest land in F. Sy. No. 91A, 93 & 97 of Virje Village, Karwar Taluk, Uttar Kannada District (Karwar Forest Division) for construction of approach road to Kaiga Township. The same was accepted by Nodal Officer (FCA) on 28-09-2021for further processing. After receiving the Acknowledgement online on 23-12-2021for having delivered the hard copies of the proposal by the User Agency to the jurisdictional Deputy Conservators of Forests & Deputy Commissioners, the online link was forwarded by this office vide Ref (2) to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Karwar Division for field verification and further processing under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 2. Location details and Component wise break up: Location details and Component wise breakup of the forest land proposed for diversion are given below.

3. DCF, Karwar Division Report: The Deputy Conservator of Forests KarwarDivisionhas inspected the spot on 03-03-2022 and has submitted the Site Inspection Report, the details of the area along with the recommendation in the form of PART-II of the proposal vide Ref (3) to Chief Conservator of

Forests, Kanara Circle. Main features of the proposal based on the DCF Karwar Report r/w the report of the CCF, Kanara Circle and that of the ICT Centre of Forest Department are as follows.

- **a.** The forest land proposed for diversion is in general landscape of Eco-Class-I (Moist Deciduous Forests) with dense forest (canopy density is up to 0.6).
- b. As per Item 4(ii) of PART-II, there are 609 trees in different girth classes in the forest land proposed for diversion. Main species include Tectona grandis, Terminalia paniculata, Lagerstroemia lanceolata, Mangifera indica, Lagerstroemia parviflora, Garcinia indica, Grewia tiliaefolia, Xyliaxylocarpa, Ficus racemosa, Dalbergia latifolia, Ficus religiosa, Emblica officianalis, Bombox ceiba, Terminalia bellerica, Syzigium cumini, Pongamia pinnata, and others. [Note: The entry made in Item 4(ii) may be read accordingly.]
- **c.** Seasonal migratory fauna is presentin the forest land proposed for diversion. [Note: The entry made in Item 8(i) may be read accordingly.]
- **d.** There are no Protected/ Archeological/ Heritage Sites/ Defence establishments located in the proposed area.
- e. The forest area proposed for diversion is the bare minimum and unavoidable.
- f. There is no violation reported under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- 4. CCF, Kanara Circle Report: The Chief Conservator of Forests, Kanara Circle has inspected the proposed area personally on 17-03-2022and hasvide Ref (4) has submitted Site Inspection Report in PART-III online. Agreeing with the recommendation made by the Deputy Conservator of Forests, KarwarDivision, the Chief Conservator of Forests, Kanara Circle has also recommended the proposal.
- 5. Net Present Value (NPV): In accordance with the Para 3.1, 3.2 and 3.4 of the FC Guidelines communicated by the Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-3/2011-FC dated 06-01-2022, The User Agency has submitted an Undertaking to pay the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land proposed for diversion.
- 6. Compensatory Afforestation (CA): In accordance with the provisions of para 2.5 (f) of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019, the User Agency being a central Government agency implementing a Central Government project is exempted from the requirement of providing the non-forest land for Compensatory Afforestation purpose and

the Compensatory Afforestation can be raised and maintained at the cost of User Agency on degraded forest land twice in extent of the forest area proposed for diversion. But the User Agency had identified the following nonforest land over an extent of 3.4744 hectare for raising compensatory afforestation.

The non-forest land details in form of KML files, Topo-maps, Geo-referenced maps along with GPS readings, CA Schemes and CA suitability Certificates have been uploaded at Item 13 of PART-II (Honnavar Division). Further, the User Agency has furnished an Undertaking to pay the applicable Compensatory Afforestation (CA) charges.

7. Status of RoFR compliance: With regard to compliance of the provisions of Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Rights) Act 2006 and Rules 2008, the User Agency has not furnished the requisite Certificate in FORM-I (for Linearprojects) issued by the jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019. The User Agency is being informed to obtain the said certificate in prescribed format and submit a copy.

Under the above circumstances and agreeing with recommendation of the field officers, it is requested to consider moving to Government of India according 'in-principle' (Stage-I) approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 3.4744 hectare of forest land in F. Sy. No. 91A, 93 & 97 of Virje Village, Karwar Taluk, Uttar Kannada District (Karwar Forest Division) for construction of approach road to Kaiga Township in favour of Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited, Kaiga Generating Station, Karwar Taluk, Uttar Kannada Districtfor a period of Thirty (30) years and subject to the production of RoFR certificate in FORM-I as per Annexure II of the FC Guidelines communicated by Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi vide F.No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 28-03-2019 and also subject to conditions appended in Annexure 'A'.

The hard copy of the proposal along with the relevant documents in 3 sets is submitted herewith for further needful.

ANNEXURE 'A'

- The legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged and it shall continue to be the forest land.
- 2. The User Agency shall pay the applicable Net Present Value (NPV), land lease rent and any other levies as per the conditions of approval.
- 3. The User Agency shall demarcate the lease area in the manner specified at the time of approval at its own cost.
- 4. The lessee shall not sub-lease, mortgage & hypothecate the forest area.
- 5. The leased out area should be used for the purpose for which it is granted. In case, the land is not used for the stipulated purpose within two years or when it is no longer needed for the stipulated purpose, the area would stand resumed to the Forest Department.
- 6. The application for renewal of the lease in the prescribed form and manner shall be submitted at least six months prior to the expiry of forest lease. In case, no renewal is sought, the Lessee shall hand over the lease.
- 7. No residential or commercial buildings shall be permitted in the forest area proposed for diversion.
- 8. No crushing / breaking of stones or labour camp shall be allowed inside forest area and all waste / debris generated shall be scientifically disposed off outside the forest area.
- 9. Any damage to forest area because of implementation of the project shall be compensated by the Lessee. The extent of damage shall be assessed by the jurisdictional Deputy Conservator of Forests/ Conservator of Forests/ Chief Conservator of Forests.
- 10. The Lessee shall ensure that no avoidable harm is caused to the fauna and flora in and around the proposed area.
- 11. No change in Land Use Plan shall be done unless prior approval of Government of India under FC Act is obtained.
- 12. In case, any violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Forest Act, 1963 & Rules, 1969 or other relevant Acts/Rules is reported during the lease period, the lease will be liable for forfeiture under Section 82 of Karnataka Forest Act, 1963. The Chief Conservator of Forests and/or Deputy Conservator of Forests concerned are authorized to take necessary action in this regard.
- 13. The approval under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is subject to any other clearances necessary under the prevailing statutes.
- 14. The User Agency shall also abide by other conditions those may be imposed by the Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) before or after the approval.
