

Inspected the Reserve Forest area proposed for diversion of forest land an extent of **0.3840 Ha**, during the inspection by me on 11.11.2019 for "Diversion of forest land it is calculated to an extent of **0.3420 ha** in Proposed areas of Peddapally Division for laying of Optical Fiber Cable line which is to be passing through edge of the road burm (Manthani to Kataram road) along the R&B road boundary. The proposed line is length 7600 Rmt, Width of 0.45 mts and depth of 1.50 Mts. The terrain is plain to undulating. The details of area proposed is as follows for diversion:

It is submitted that there is no trees felling in the proposed area.

The said proposed area for diversion is falling in Shivaram Crocodile Wildlife Sanctuary (Core and Buffer zone) and Eco Sensitive zone area. There are no protected Archaeological / Heritage site / defence establishment or any other important monuments. The requirement of forest land as proposed by the user agency in col.2 of Part-I is noticed unavoidable and barest minimum for the project, During filed inspection it is further noticed that, the area proposed for diversion in the area for diversion as per field verification is 0.3420 Ha out of which 0.285 Ha area is falling in Shivaram Crocodile Wildlife Sanctuary (Core and Buffer zone) and 0.057 Ha is falling in Eco Sensitive zone area.

The general flora adjacent forest to the road is dry deciduous forest consisting with Nallamaddi, Teak, Thirman, Kodisha, Pala, Palakodisha and Chennangi etc., and the soil type is mixed with red soil.
