

FIELD INSPECTION NOTES OF K. RAVINDER, FOREST DIVISIONAL OFFICER, JANNARAM ON DIVERSION OF 0.0859 Ha FOREST LAND IN INDANPALLY RANGE OF JANNARAM DIVISION FOR LAYING OF OPTICAL FIBER CABLE BY RELIANCE JIO INFOCOMM LTD ON 06.12.2018.

I along with the Forest Range Officer concerned and Range staff of Indanpally Range have inspected the proposed area for diversion of Forest Land for laying of Optical Fiber Cable in favour of Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd. (RJIL), in Jannaram Division on 06.12.2018. The proposed area is falling in Kawal Reserve Forest block and Narlapur (South) and Indanpally (S) beats of Indanpally Range along the R&B road. The length of road passing in forest is 2.147 KM (2147.58 Mts) and width is 0.40 Mts. The proposed area falling in Core area of Kawal Tiger Reserve. The area required by the user agency is as follows.

During the field inspection, it is noticed that, the proposed area alignment for diversion is passing within the right of way of existing Roads and no tree growth is existing, hence no cutting of trees is required.





The said proposed area for diversion is falling in Kawal Tiger Reserve. There are no rare/ endangered/unique species of flora and fauna found in the forest area proposed for diversion. There are no protected Archaeological/ Heritage site/Defence establishment or any other important monument in the forest area proposed for diversion.

Thus this laying of Optical Fiber Cable by Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd. (RJIL), is **recommended** considering all the aspects mentioned in the proposal and field conditions.
