9.	Condition of vegetation and type of forest in applied area	The density of vegetation is 0.5 (Zero point five) (Eco value class-I). The applied area is composed of Sal (Shorea robusta), Teak (Tectona grandis), Kusum (Schleichera oleosa), Bahada (Terminalia belerica), Char (Buchanania lanjan), Jamu (Syzygium cuminii), Asan (Terminalia tomentosa), Dhaura (Anogeissus latifolia), Kendu (Diospyros melanoxylon), Mahul (Madhuca indica), Karanja (Pongamia pinnata), Sidha (Lagerstroemia parvifloa), Kurum (Adina cordifolia), Mango (Mangifera indica) etc.

Position of Wildlife in general	Fauna such as Hanuman Langur (Presbytis entellus), Rhesus Macaque (Macaca mulata), Squirrel (Funambulus pennanti), Jungle Cat (Felis chaus), Mongoose(Herpestes edwardsi), Indian Hare(Oryctolagus cuniculus), Fox (Canis aurieus), Indian Mole Rat (Bandicota bengalensis) etc. and different types of Snakes and Birds have been recorded from the applied area. As discussed with field forest staff, elephant movement is also noticed in the applied area occasionally.

12	Number of trees to be felled and its impact on the eco-system	The DFO, Bonai has reported that as per sample tree enumeration, in total, 31083 nos. of trees(above 30 cm girth) have been enumerated in the forest land applied for diversion, out of which 499 nos. of trees above 30 cm girth are in Safety Zone area of 1.808 ha & 3777 nos of trees have been enumerated in the Non-Forest land over 26.602 ha. Felling of trees will have some definite impact on the eco-system.

An area of 110.813 ha of Govt. Non-Forest land has been identified in village Jhurmur and Jaidega of Biramitrapur Tahasil of Sundargarh District under Rourkela Forest Division for the purpose of Compensatory Afforestation.
