Proposal for Diversion of 26.994 Ha. Forest Land for construction of Four Lane dedicated Coal Corridor from Bankibahal(Coal Mine)0/00km toBhedabahal(SH-10) 30/811 in the District of Sundargarh by Executive Engineer Sundargarh (R&B) Division, Sundargarh.

In inviting a reference to the subject cited above, the Executive Engineer Sundargarh (R&B) Division, Sundargarh, User Agency has submitted the proposal for diversion of 26.994 ha of Forest land for construction of four lane dedicated coal corridor from Bankibahal (Coal Mine)0/00km toBhedabahal (SH-10) 30/811 in the District of Sundargarh, the details of forest diversion proposal is furnished below:-

Brief Description:

Prior to emerging of the Basundhara Coal Field Area, these Sundaragrh -Lephripara Road (M.D.R. -27), Suruguda- Balichuan- Balinga - Hemgiri - Kanika Road (M.D.R.-29), and Duduka - Taparia Road (M.D.R.) were extensively being used by the peoples residing in Tangarpali, Lepharapara, HemgiriTahasil area of Sundargarh District. Now-a-days, the same road is used for coal transportation as well as daily movement of local public. The mixed traffic of the local public with cycle, motorcycle, four wheelers, etc in addition to 2000 coal loaded trucks and multi axle heavy vehicles regularly causing fatal accidents. And environment pollution The villages Bandhpalli, Mahulpalli, Surguda, Barpalli etc. have already been reported in high accident prone area/black spot of the District for 2017 and 2018. The Basundhara Coal Field area of MCL is the largest opencast mine in India which is connected to this Road. The heavy vehicles carrying coals from Basundhara Coal Field Area either use the existing 2 lane Bankibahal-Kanika Railway Siding, Belpahad etc. via Hemgir(M.D.R. -29) or the Bankibahal – Duduka - Surguda – Ujalpur – Sundargarh byepass Road (M.D.R. -29, M.D.R.-27 & M.D.R.) and ultimately take-up to their destination route either Rourkela or Jharsuguda Side through S.H.-10. This existing 2 lane road is unable to accommodate the heavy traffic being used for Coal transportation and vehicles of the local

public there byleading to fatal accidents causing human causalities and there by creating law and order situation in the area. Keeping in view of all these facts the Rehabilitation and Periphery Development Advisory Committee(RPDAC) during 2011 has approved the improvement of this road by converting it 2lane to 4lane. The MoU was signed between the Works Department, Govt of Odisha and MCL on date 7.5.2013 for (1.) Construction and improvement of existing road to 4lane dedicated Coal Corridor from Bankibahal to Bhedabahal at SH-10(30.811km), (2.) Construction and improvement of Ujalpur bypass, (3.) Construction and improvement of existing 2 lane to 4 lane road from Bankibahal to Kanika Railway Siding(0/00km to 25/750km). The Project was delayed and the local public filed a PIL case in Hon'able High Court of Odisha, Cuttack vide WP(C) No.11744 of 2012 on dated 06.07.2012. Again though the MoU was signed between the Works Department, Govt of Odisha and MCL on date 7.5.2013due to delay in construction, a contempt of court was filed by Villagers vide Case No.785/2013. The Hon'able High Court of Odisha, Cuttack also directed to the RDC and MCL Authority to expedite the construction of the project Road. Accordingly in the 1st phase the widening ofexisting road 2 lane to 4 lane road from Bankibahal(BarpalliChowk) to Kanika Railway Siding was taken up and now at the stage of completion.

In 2nd phase, the construction of the proposed 4 lane dedicated coal corridor road from BankibahalChowk situated in the heart of theBasundhara Coal Mines area toBhedabahal via Kalobahal, Aonlabahal etc.at 74/200 Km. on Sambalpur — Sundargarh — Rourkela Road (S.H.-10) which ultimately connects to the industrial towns namely Jharsuguda and Rourkela. The total length of the proposed four lane dedicated coal corridor is 30.811KM for which 30 to 45 meter width of Right of Way is proposed. However, in the instant programme four lane will be constructed from 00/00km to 8/00km and rest of the part will be of two lane carriage way.

The Government of Odisha, Works Department vide its Letter No.886 dated 22.01.2016 has declared the Executive Engineers of the Department as Competent Authority to file Forest Diversion Proposal as and when required for the public purposes on behalf of the Works Department (Copy Enclosed as Annexure-XVIIIA&XVIIIB).

As per decision of the Rehabilitation and Periphery Development Advisory Committee (RPDAC) during 2011, the MoU was signed between the Works Department, Govt of Odisha and MCL on date 7.5.2013 for (1.) Construction and improvement of existing road to 4lane dedicated Coal Corridor from Bankibahal to Bhedabahal at SH-10(30.811km), (2.) Construction and improvement of Ujalpur bypass, (3.) Construction and improvement of existing 2lane to 4lane road from Bankibahal to Kanika Railway Siding (0/00km to 25/750km). Thus there wasno scope of study of alternative alignments in this project.

3. Total land requirement for the Project:-

The total area of the project is **146.514 Ha** out of which **26.994ha** is of forest land &**119.520 ha** Non forest land. Out of the 26.99 ha of forest land proposed for diversion, 19.877 ha is revenue forest, 1.533ha is DLC forest and 5.584ha is Reserve forests. The details of Forest and Non forest land with certificate of concerned Tahasildars on land kisam as on 25.10.1980,DLC forest and reserve forest land is enclosed as **Annexure -VI**.Out of the 119.52 ha of Non Forest Land,38.71 ha is Govt. Land, 76.51 ha is Private Land and 4.30 is Coal Bearing Land.

The TahasildarHemgir,Lephripada,Tangarpalli and SundergarhSadar have issued certificate to the effect that they have verified the recordson the status of the land schedule of their Tahasil as on 25.10.1980.

4. Flora and Fauna

As per Champion and Seth classification theforest type in the applied area comes under Group-5 Tropical Dry deciduous Forest and Sub group is 5B, Northern Tropical Dry Deciduous Forest.Type-5B-C2 Northern Dry Mixed Deciduous Forests.The tree species commonly noticed in the proposed area are –Shorea robusta (Sal),Terminalia tomentosa (Asan)Syzgium cumin(Jamun), Buchnania lanzan (Char), Madhuca indica (Mahul),Terminalia belerica (Bahada) Adina cordifolia (Kurum), Diospyros melanoxylon (Kendu), Emblica officinalis (Amla), Soymida febrifuga (Rohini), Bombax ceiba (Simul), Cassia fistula (Sunari), Lagerstoemia parviflora (Sidha), Anogeissus latifolia (Dharua), Azadirachta indica (Neem),Pterocarpus marsupium (Bija), Tectona grandis(Teak) etc. The density of the vegetation is found to be 0.4 in the proposed diversion area.The Project passes through three no.s of RFsie.Sidarmunda-1.150km(4.141ha),Punjipahar-0.363km(0.867ha)andPanikholia-0.350km(0.576ha) and Revenue forests&DLC-8.937kmall total over 10.8kms.

The wild animals/ fauna noticed in the area are Hyena(Hyena hyena), Barking deer (Muntiacus muntjack), Wild boar (Sus scrofa) Sloth bear (Melursusursinus), Monkey (Presbytis entellus), Mongoose (Herpestes ediwardsii), Rabits (Lepus nigricollisuficaudatus) etc. but population is very thin. Thouugh the area is not the habitat of Elephants or any part of Elephant Corridor but Elephant moves occasionally in paddy harvesting season. Among birds, Indian myna (Acridotheres tristis), Jungle fowl(Gallus gallus), Indian Rollers, Black drongo (Dicrurusmacrocerus), Common crow (Corvus splendens), Indian cuckoo (Eudynamis scolopaceous), Dove (Streptopelia decaocto), Parakeets (Psittacule upatria) etc. are seen. Among reptiles and lizards, Indian cobra (Najanaja), Common Krait (Bungarus careruleus), Rat snake (Ptyas mucosus) common garden lizards(Varanus bengalensis) etc. are seen.

5. Tree enumeration:

Plot wise tree enumeration has been carried out in both Forest and Non-forest area of the project. The total number of trees to be affected by the project is 6522noswith following breakup-

The details of enumeration list for Forest and Non forest Govt. Land area has been enclosed separately with the proposal as Vol-3. The abstract of tree list is furnished as Annexure XIII.

In all total 6522 nos of trees to be felled from the ROW for the project which will be compensated through raising Compensatory Afforestation over 26.994ha at the project cost. BesidesCompensatory Afforestation, the User Agency shall raise two times the trees to be felled by User Agency from the Government non forest land and private land.

6. Compensatory Afforestation

An area of 30.02 Ha.of degraded revenue forest land (net effective area 2.994ha) has been identified at Nialipali, Dhauraadha, Bilagarh&Kepase village of TangarpaliTahasil of Sundargarh district. The details of map of the sites along with area is mark as Annexure -B. The said degraded revenue forest land has been inspected by the undersigned as well as Asst. Conservator of Forests, Sundergarh. The site is free from encroachment and encramberance. It also suitable for raising plantation @1000 per hectare. The afforestation work will be carried out over the effective area of 26.994 Ha. Scheme for Compensatory Afforestation over an area of 26.994 has been prepared by the undersigned& the total financial outlay for Rs.1,52,19,828.00@ 286.30 per men day with 10 year maintenance cost. The scheme has provision of special soil and moisture conservation measures, barbed wire fencing over the entire area. The species to be planted are Sishu (Dalbergia Sisoo), Asan (Tectonagrandis), (Terminalia tomentosa), Teak Bamboo (Dendrocalamusstrictus), Siris (Albizia procera), Neem (Azadirachta indica), Aonla (Emblica officinalis), Chakunda (Casia siamia) etc. The user agency has furnished an undertaking for payment of the above CA amount as Annexure -C.

7. Resettlement and Rehabilitation Not Applicable.

8. Employment likely to be generated

It has been assessed by the Executive Engineer, Sundargarh (R&B) Division that about 300 people will be engaged regularly and 4000 people on temporary basis.

9. Cost Benefit analysis

Cost benefit Analysis has been done. The cost in terms forest is Rs. 1.86 Crore where as benefit comes to Rs. 391.09 Crore. Thus the C:B is 1:210. The detail calculation sheet is enclosed at **Annexure-XIV**.

10. Environmental Clearance.

The environmental clearance is not applicable for this project, as the project length is less than 100KM as per Ministry of Environmentand Forests, GOI notification dt.22.08.2013.

11. Certificate under Forest Right Act.2006

The Executive Engineer Sundargarh (R&B) Division, Sundargarh, User Agency hassubmitted an undertaking in this regard that hewill submit the certificate under Schedule Tribe and other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act. 2006 pertaining to the forest area over 26.994ha in Sundergarh District for this road project in the format prescribed by MoEF before Stage-II clearance at Annexure-XII.

12. Wildlife Management Plan

The project is not falling within any Eco-Sensitive Zone, National Park, Biosphere Reserve or Sanctuary. It does not come under any Wildlife Corridor. However, the forest area of this project forms the part of impact area(within 10.00km) of Site Specific Wild Life Conservation Plan for Rs.194.785lakh prepared during diversion of 41.725Ha(Forest-39.9Ha +Non forest looks like forest-1.745Ha) of forest land for the Project "widening and strengthening of existing two lane to four lane from Bankibahal to Kanika RailwaySiding"approvedby PCCF(Wild Life) & Chief Wild Life Warden, Odisha, Bhubaneswar vide its letter No.8804 dated 10.11. 2016which is under implementation. The Executive Engineer, Sundergarh (R&B) Division has furnished an undertaking to pay the cost of Site Specific Wild Life Conservation Plan if at all required at Annexure-XV

13. Deposit of NPV

The User Agency has given an undertaking to pay the NPV of the forest land proposed for diversion is enclosed at Annexure-X.

14. Violation

No violation is noticed in the Project area.
