Proposal for diversion of 2.15 ha. Forest Land under section 2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Improvement to Kerli-Kototi-Nandgaon-Nandari Road SH-191 (Km 00/00 to Km 29/500) Part of Kerli Phata to Nandari Forest Area in Kolhapur District in the State of Maharashtra. The proposal has been initiated by the Executive Engineer, Special Project (P.W.) Division, Kolhapur for seeking approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The Proposed project does not involve non-forest land.

**3.0** The User Agency in their Project Note has certified that the proposed project shall be useful for the development of infrastructure in the vicinity and the same information is mentioned from 3.1 to 3.9.

**3.1** The Government of Maharashtra has taken up a massive programme of up-gradation and development of existing two-lane State Highways. The Government of Maharashtra also taking financial aid from Asian Development Bank (ADB) for the execution of the same. This stretch

passes through Kolhapur district. The Kolhapur district is foremost players in tourism and aided industry along with agricultural. It is a need of an hour for better transportation facilities to cope up with the future demands.

3.2 The state highway connects to other National Highways, State highways. Considering all the major factors, the Government has taken a policy decision of developing this state highway for better and safe transportation. This entire stretch starting from Kerli and ends at Katlewadi provides connectivity to various important religious places, cities, Sugarcane factories, important places of trades, other national and state highways.

3.3 **DESIGN STANDARDS:-** Road markings perform the important function of guiding and controlling traffic on a highway. The markings serve as psychological barriers and signify the delineation of traffic paths and their lateral clearance from traffic hazards for safe movement of traffic. Road markings are therefore essential to ensure smooth and orderly flow of traffic and to promote road safety. The Code of Practice for Road Markings, IRC: 35-2015 will be used in the study as the design basis. The location and type of marking lines, material and colour is followed using IRC: 35-2015 “Code of Practice for Road Markings”. The road markings are carefully planned on carriageways, intersections, parking and bridge locations.

3.4 Roads:- Improvement to Kerli - Kotoli - Nandgaon - Nandari Road SH-191 (Km 00/00 to Km 29/500) Part of KerliPhata to Nandari Dist Kolhapur are provided in Table 2.1

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3.6 **Road Alignment:-** The development of the road under consideration starts at T junction on NH-166 (Kolhapur-Ratnagiri Highway) at Km 128/200 of NH-166 (Km 0/000 of SH-191) near Kerli village and ends at junction with SH-193 (Kolhapur-Anuskura Road) at (Km 29/500 of SH-191) Dist Kolhapur measuring of 29/500 Km in Maharashtra state.

3.7 **Proposed ROW:-** In general, right of way (ROW) of 15 mtr area are required for the 2 lanes road.

3.8 **Lane Configuration:-** Based on the traffic survey, analysis and forest the 2-lane configuration is sufficient to cater to the traffic up to year 2041.

3.9 **Financial Details:-** The capital cost of the project-140.40 Crores, Construction period- 24 Months .

**5.0 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Kolhapur Forests Division, Kolhapur has certified that:-**

5.7 Inspected the area 2.15 ha. from Govt. revenue area Gut no.47, Village-Manjare, Tal-Shahuwadi, Dist-Kolhapur to be transferred to the forest department as alternate land for compensatory afforestation in lieu of forest land required for the proposal of Improvement to Kerli-Kotoli-Nandgaon-Nandari Road SH-191 (Km 00/00 to Km 29/500) in Kolhapur district it is contiguous suitable for afforestation and management purpose also and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances.

- 5.9 No suitable alternate land is available and the forest land required is lowest minimum. (PPN-28)
- 5.10 Proposed work is yet to start, hence no violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 or its guidelines is seen. (PPN-29)
- 5.11 Proposed Project alignment is at a distance of 37.82 Km from Sahyadri Tiger Reserve & 27.65 distance from Radhanagari Wildlife Sanctuary. (PPN-40)

**6.0 The User Agency has submitted an undertaking that:-**

- 6.1 No suitable alternate land is available and the forest land required is minimum. (PPN-41)
- 6.2 Agreed to defray the cost of tree felling. (PPN-100)
- 6.3 Agreed to defray the cost of Compensatory afforestation. (PPN-101)
- 6.4 There is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980. (PPN-102)
- 6.5 Administrative Approval & Technical clearance order issued by the Public Works Department & S B Regional Division (Kokan) has been enclosed from page no.116 to 133.
- 6.6 Agreed to plant trees on both sides of the road. (PPN-168)
- 6.7 Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt.3/12/2018 has issued guidelines regarding compliance of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Right) Act, 2006. As per these guidelines:-

*‘Accordingly, it is clarified that within the time period stipulated for compliance of Stage I condition, Deputy Commissioner shall complete the process of compliance of FRA (including forwarding its findings to be concerned CF), hence for the purpose of the MoEF & CC, as per the provisions under the Forest (Conservation) amendment rules, 2016 the compliance under FRA is not required for consideration of in-principle approval. This has to be furnished by the State Government for consideration of the proposal by the Ministry for final approval’.*

Project authority agrees that the certificate of FRA-2006 from the collector will be submitted after stage-I compliance. (PPN-162)

- 6.8 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Satara Forest Division, Satara and the Conservator of Forest (T), Kolhapur have recommended the proposal for diversion of 2.15 ha. of Forest land. (PPN-17 to 20)
- 6.9 The KML file of the proposed diverted area and C.A area is placed in the file at the top.

**7.0 In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions:-**

- 7.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 7.2 Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department at the cost of the User Agency over the area 2.15 ha. from Govt. revenue area Gut no.47, Village-Manjare, Tal-Shahuwadi, Dist-Kolhapur to be transferred to the forest department as alternate land for compensatory afforestation in lieu of forest land required for the proposal of Improvement to Kerli-Kotoli-Nandgaon-Nandari Road SH-191 (Km 00/00 to Km 29/500) in Kolhapur district it is contiguous suitable for afforestation and management purpose also

and it is free from encroachment and encumbrances which is inspected by the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Satara Forest Division, Satara.

- 7.3 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.
- 7.4 The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 2.15 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the Government of India Guideline dated 06/01/2022, 19/01/2022 & 22/03/2022.
- 7.5 Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- 7.6 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 7.7 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<http://parivesh.nic.in/>)
- 7.8 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 7.9 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 7.10 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 7.11 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 7.12 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 7.13 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- 7.14 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 7.15 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 7.16 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 7.17 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.

7.18 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.

7.19 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.

7.20 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.

- 6.2 Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department at the cost of the User Agency over the area 2.15 ha. from Govt. revenue area Gut no.47, Village-Manjare, Tal-Shahuwadi, Dist-Kolhapur to be transferred to the forest department as alternate land for compensatory afforestation in lieu of forest land required for the proposal of Improvement to Kerli-Kotoli-Nandgaon-Nandari Road SH-191 (Km 00/00 to Km 29/500) in Kolhapur district it is contiguous suitable for afforestation and management purpose also and it is free from encroachment and encumbrances which is inspected by the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Satara Forest Division, Satara.
- 6.3 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.

- 6.4 The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 2.15 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the Government of India Guideline dated 06/01/2022, 19/01/2022 & 22/03/2022.
- 6.5 Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.
- 6.6 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 6.7 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<http://parivesh.nic.in/>)
- 6.8 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 6.9 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 6.10 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 6.11 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 6.12 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 6.13 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- 6.14 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 6.15 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 6.16 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 6.17 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
- 6.18 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 6.19 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.Nc.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.

6.20 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
