NOTIFICATION. CL 6-5-1887 His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to declare, unier the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), that from 1st July 1887 the area, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule appended to this notification, will be constituted a reserved forest.

SCHEDULE.

Area 9554 Acres.

Date of Name of Civil District, Entry Forest. Sub-Bivision and Taluk.

Boundaries.

1st July Anchetti Salem. Anchetti forests. On the east of the road from Anchetti to Natrapalayem.

North .- The cultivation of Sirithoddi from the Natra-

palaiyam road near Narshagudai, to the Manchi path near the Fordanakal halla, and then the path from Anchetti to Manchi as far as the Maity Maduvu halla and thence the southern boundary of Manchi new reserve along the spur of Jainkal barai.

Mast .-- The top of the slopes along the Manchi cultivation and the spur running down, and thenes the path from Manchi to Geratti.

South .-- The path from Geratti to Nooromdiankerai.

West .-- The road from Natrapalaiyam to Anchetti.

REMARKS .-- Right of way is allowed for men, cattle and packanimals over the undermentioned paths in the block, none of which are to exceed six yards in width:--

- 1. Path from Tamasanhalli to Geratti .-- Entering the block a mile and a half south-east of Tamasanhalli, this path runs for some four and a half miles south-east-south through the block towards the latter place.
- 2. Path from Tamasanhalli to Natrapalaiyam .-- This runs for some five and a half miles along the western side of the block.
- 3. Path from Geratti to Chikkamanchi .-- A portionof this path passes in a north-easterly direction from the former place for one mile through the south-east corner of the block.

Right of way is also allowed for men only to the following temples within the block. No path thereto is to exceed three yards in width. The temples themselves and a space of five yards around temples Nos. (1) and (2) and of ten yards around temple No. (3) for preparation of votive offerings by fire, are excluded from the block.

(i) Gollammana Devudu Koil, a god under a tree situated five miles south-east of Tamasanhalli and a mile south of the Ebbahalla river. There is no regular festival, but some 20 or 30 persons assemble at once and water is brought from the Ebbahalla river. The Geratti Tamasanhalli path passes near the temple.

- (ii) Matheswaran koil, also a god under a tree, about three miles south of Tamasanhalli and one mile east of the west boundary of the block. There is no festival and only some two or three persons assemble together, getting water from Nadabavi well close at hand.
- (iii) Hanumantharayaswami Koil, a Stone-built temple about a mile north of Natrapalaiyam village site. Water is obtained from a well close by.
