Proposal for diversion of 1.02 Ha of Forest land construction of new approach road from Tikjuk Mechanical Workshop to Ninshang Gumpa via Byadong Tikpotam in West Sikkim by Roads & Bridges Department, Govt. of Sikkim, is hereby recommended.

The forest land diverted will not be used for any other purpose other than the reason for which it is diverted.

- a. The status of the land will always remain as forest land
- b. Labour camp, storing of materials shall not be allowed in the forest land other than the diverted land.
- c. The trees falling within the diverted shall not fell without prior approval of the forest Department.
- d. No firewood shall be used by the labourers. The user agency shall provide kerosene/LPG or other eco-friendly alternatives.
- e. During the execution of the project, every care should be taken to ensure proper disposal of excavated soil /stone/boulders. No rolling down of soil/stone/boulders in the forest land is permitted. Cut and fill method to be strictly adopted.
- f. No quarry shall be allowed inside the forest land. The User agency shall make payments for all building materials like sand, loose stone, stone chips etc.
- g. Any damage of forest crops/ wildlife in the non-diverted land shall be compensated by the user agency.
- h. Strict measures should be taken to protect the saplings planted under State Green Mission Programme of the government.
- i. No debris will be thrown in the forest area and river.
- j. If within the five years of the proposal the user agency is unable to obtain approval, the project will be deemed De-novo.
