5ub. Diversion of forest land for non-forest purposes under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 - ensuring compliance of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006.

I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letters of even number dated 5th July 2013 on the above-mentioned subject where-under this Ministry sent a copy of formats for submission of evidence for having initiated and completed the process of settlement of rights under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 1006, and to clarify further as below in respect of certificates required for linear projects (Form-II).

- Point- If for projects other than linear projects stipulates certificate from the district of the top on six counts, including consent of gram sabha for the project, as provided in allows (b) (c) and (d) of the format. Whereas Form-I for linear projects stipulates tentificates from the concerned district collector on only three counts which do not include consent from the gram sabha concerned for the linear project per so:
- The 'consent' stipulated in phrase "....... Gram Sabhas have given their consent to it..." appearing in-clause (b) of Form-I for linear projects is for diversion of forest land for the facilities managed by Government in accordance with the provisions of section 3 (2) of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006; and
- February 2013, after consultation and concurrence of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, linear projects, except those involving recognised rights of Primitive Tribal Groups and Presengultural Communities, are exempted from requirement of obtaining consent for such projects from each concerned Gram Sabha.
